#### PASSING INTO LEGEND

The recent pandemic and ever increasing energy and production costs are causing the closure of smaller independent breweries and pubs across the country. The shutting of Leicester's Framework Brewery, has been followed by the closure of one of the city's best known and only brewpubs, The West End Brewery on Braunstone Gate

The WEB was heaving as the last pints were pulled on New Year's Eve where loyal customers had their last chance to neck back the remaining barrels of Project Pale and West Coast Bitter. It certainly went out with a bang as fireworks exploded across the city at midnight.

For almost seven

years the WEB has been at the forefront of Leicester's real ale culture creating everything from stouts to kegs and from lager to speciality brews. It built a huge local reputation for it's crafted beers, naan pizzas and friendly atmosphere.






For owner and brewer, Josh Gray and his staff, closing the business was a particularly difficult, but "no option" decision having sunk years into creating a unique environment only to be faced with an astronomical increase in costs forecast for 2023.

Josh said: "I can't put in enough words just how honoured I am to have had such amazing support and such a wonderful community... From the bottom of my heart, I want to thank my right-hand man and woman, Russ and Tina. No single part of the WEB would have been anywhere near as special without these two."


#### BRAUNSTONE GATE SCHEME

Two improvement schemes are taking place on Narborough Road and Braunstone Gate.


Leicester City Council is carrying out work designed to make both areas more pedestrian friendly, and in the case of Braunstone Gate, remodelling it as part of a "Mini Holland" scheme to installing safe walking and cycling infrastructure and reduce car access

Maintenance work on Narborough Road has been carried out in stages over the last two years. The latest phase should be completed by the middle of March.

It includes making pavements more pedestrian-friendly by installing new bollards and cycle racks to prevent pavement parking, as well as replacing broken or loose slabs and tackling drainage prob-



Work will also continue at Braunstone Gate as part of a larger £1.5m redevelopment scheme financed by the Government's Transforming Cities Fund.



Leicester Deputy City Mayor for transport, clean air and climate emergency, Cllr Adam Clarke, said: "These works both in Braunstone Gate and Narborough Road aim to improve facilities for pedestrians and cyclists and make it easier to access these shops, bars and other local businesses safely."

Access to Braunstone Gate from Duns Lane and New Park Street is now restricted to buses, taxis and cycles only, and the left turn from Western Boulevard has been closed to traffic, except cycles.

Most on-street parking on Braunstone Gate has been removed, with the extra space used to create wider pavements. Businesses will be able to apply for street café licences and outside seating areas.

Disabled parking bays will be retained, and additional pay-and-display parking spaces will be included on neighbouring Bede Street and Western Road.

### Jan Police Update

Firstly, a happy new year to you all, I hope the festive period was good and that it was Santa and not the Grinch that visited.

A man has been imprisoned for killing a woman following a crash on Hinckley Road, near Braunstone Park, in July last year.

21-year-old Connor Wilsher will serve 6 years after pleading guilty to death by dangerous driving & failing to stop after a road accident.

Wilsher was attempting to overtake another vehicle on a bend when he collided with Darcy Reid's car. Darcy, who was only 23, died in hospital from her injuries a few weeks later.

Burglary offences are still occurring as are parcel thefts. Please ensure, when in or out, your doors and windows are locked and that if you are expecting a delivery, and won't be in, that the delivery company are aware of your nominated safe place or neighbour where they can leave the parcel. Check that your sheds, outbuildings or back gates are locked as well.

With Christmas in the rear view mirror, please consider how you dispose of packaging from new expensive items. Whilst we all love to be responsible and recycle, where possible, those big, branded box, that your new pride and joy has arrived in, is also an advert that you have it! On the 6<sup>th</sup> January we held a bike registry event on Tudor Road. This was well attended with several food delivery riders also taking time out their busy schedules to get their bikes marked and another gentleman running home to fetch his two wheeled Christmas present! We will be holding further events in the coming months and updates will be posted on Facebook @West Leicester Police and Neighbourhood Link. If you haven't signed up already then please do so by visiting www.neighbourhoodlink.co.uk as we regularly send out updates of events and crime prevention advice.

Several search warrants have been executed in the last 6 weeks, across Westcotes and The Fosse, resulting in the recovery of large quantities of cannabis. We are exploring opportunities with the fire service and power companies to raise awareness of the risk that these locations can pose to the community as the electrical work is very dangerous. This can, and has, led to fires breaking out. Local information is instrumental in disrupting these activities. Suspicious activity can be reported by telephoning 101, visiting the Leicestershire police website or reporting your concerns anonymously to CrimeStoppers via their website or freephone telephone number 0800 555 111. # CAREY'S COMPOST SECONDER

Now the festive season is over, I've been considering how we can try and counteract some of the excess waste that we produce. For instance, we love Christmas nuts, even though some of them are still in the bowl at the end of January, so instead of throwing the shells in the waste bin I've been saving them. Washed pistachio shells can be used to provide good drainage in houseplants. Unwashed salted shells can be used in the garden when placed around plant bases as a slug and snail deterrent. If you have an open fire, either type can also be used as kindling to get it going. Other shells, with the possible exception of walnuts, can be added to your compost bin as it's good to have a mix of green and brown matter, but they can take up to two years to break down unless you crush them first to speed up decomposition. Small amounts of paper and card can also be added to your compost pile, I like to add most of this to recycling though as I believe it's more environmentally useful.

There's been some controversy over whether citrus fruit should be added to your compost because of its acidity level, but if the peel is dried out first, it'll rot more easily and give off necessary nitrogen,

phosphorous and potassium, whilst the scent can act as a natural deterrent to keep pests at bay.

I separate winter plant gift bowls, transferring the perennials into the garden and any short lived plants into the compost bin along with the soil medium. I wash and save the bowls for next year so they can be re-gifted. Real Christmas trees, that are not rooted, can be chopped and stored for rotting in an unused area of the garden which is great for wild-life! Or if you have access to a decent shredder they can be shredded and added to your compost bin or used as a mulch/weed suppressant. Rooted trees can be placed in the border and dug up for use next year.

I have spent some time clearing guttering and drainage pipes leading to water buts ensuring the winter rain is collected for the coming seasons. It's also a good time to cut back any overgrown and unwanted ivy as well as other climbing plants before the birds start nesting. The birds love



high energy food to help them through the cold spell and, as ever, I've been making sure they have enough fresh water to keep them going.

Happy New Year and happy gardening!


