As if that wasn't enough, visitors could indulge in cocktails, gin and spritzers, homemade ice cream and milkshakes, Hungarian cakes, wine tasting, and a large makers market full of everything from knick-knacks to fudge. We bought the fudge.





COPING WITH THE BIG C

According to Cancer Research UK, around half of us will face cancer at some point in our lives. It's a staggering reality, and one that affects families, friends, and communities.

As well as medical needs, it brings with it a whirlwind of emotions as patients and families grapple with uncertainty, treatment side effects, and fears for the future.

Organisations like Sue Young Cancer Support (SYCS) Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland on Westleigh Road, off Fosse Road South, touch lives, reaching out when 'cancer' alters everything.

SYCS recognises that healing extends beyond physical health and treatment, and provides counselling, group support sessions, activities, practical assistance, complementary therapies, health and wellbeing courses and a drop in and befriending services.

One course hosted by SYCS is 'Bringing Balance' - a 4-part course that considers the physical and emotional impact of a diagnosis, the effect it has on roles, routines and relationships, and explores practical strategies and techniques to help participants bring more balance back to their life and ways to regain and maintain a sense of self after diagnosis.

The course facilitated by local Senior Recovery Practitioner and therapeutic yoga teacher Emma, and Occupational Therapist and Advanced EFT (Tapping) practitioner, Rachel, from RAE Training and Therapies uses a range of the latest psychological approaches to reduce stress and improve well-being, together with tailored yoga sequences, EFT tapping and relaxation techniques.

This service, along with the others at SYCS are completely free of charge and available to anyone living with cancer in Leicester, Leicestershire or Rutland.

A previous attendee said: "I am going through a lot at the moment, and this has helped me so much to get through. I really couldn't have done it on my own."

Aug Police Update

A young gang, aged between 17 and 21, who planned a 3-month crime spree over Snap-Chat have been jailed for up to 2 years each or received suspended sentences.

The 9 strong group, which included 3 men from Westcotes, Braunstone and New Parks, who called themselves the 'B-Town Twockers', planned to break into properties across Leicester and Leicestershire between 21 October 2021 and 12 January 2022. Their aim was to steal various items from their victims' homes, but their focus was cars and motorcycles that had been parked outside.

Prolific drug dealer Reece Broad was arrested at a house on Bolton Rd and has been jailed for over 5 years after officers saw him throwing a bag of cocaine from an upstairs window.

Officers were executing a warrant at the address in June this year at the time, and also seized digital scales and 2 mobile phones belonging to Broad which contained messages relating to dealing heroin and cocaine.

A man has been arrested and charged with assault of an emergency worker and a public order offence on Bosworth St on 18th August.

Earlier in August, officers from the Western Ward team conducted speed checks on Glenfield Road, following concerns raised by local residents.

The vast majority of motorists were driving safely, but two individuals were issued tickets for excess speed. Highest speed recorded was 42mph.

A prolific shoplifter who targeted the Co-op stores in Braunstone has earned a 16 week sentence. He also must pay compensation to the stores and has been banned from all Co-ops in Leicestershire. He's also been charged with 4 more shoplifting offences; drugs in his possession have been sent for testing. Braunstone officers also located and arrested another two suspects in relation to other thefts. The suspects were also wanted for a robbery and a kidnap.



CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

If you're looking to brighten your garden with flowers in August and September, there are several species you can plant now to ensure a vibrant display in these late-summer months. These selections will not only fill your garden with colour but also attract pollinators and add seasonal interest.

Sedums, especially Sedum spectabile, are ideal for late summer planting. Their star-shaped pink, red, or white flowers bloom from August into autumn. Sedums are drought-tolerant and thrive in well-drained soil, making them perfect for sunny spots.

The graceful blooms of the perennial Japanese anemone (Anemone x hybrida) flower from late summer into early autumn. They prefer partial shade and are perfect for adding height to your borders. Their white or pink flowers are delicate yet durable,

often persisting through September. **Dahlias** are a versatile and obvious choice; they can be planted from tubers in late spring or bought


as fully formed plants around this time. They provide glorious blooms for August and September which

can often survive until signs of the first frost. Their large, showy flowers come in a vast array of colours and shapes, from pompons to cactus types. They thrive in sunny spots and well-drained soil. An added adventage is that they do well both



advantage is that they do well both in your flower beds or container gardening.

For a splash of fiery colour, **Helenium** is a great choice. Plant these perennials in spring, and by late summer, you'll enjoy vibrant yellow, orange, and red blooms. They are perfect for the middle or back of



Finally, **Asters**, planted in spring or early summer will bring a burst of colour to your garden in August and September. They are available in a variety of colours, including purple, pink, and white, and are also a favourite among bees.



By choosing these plants, you can ensure a garden full of vibrant, late-summer flowers that will carry your garden's beauty into the autumn season.
