NEW HOMES PLANNED

Western Park could soon be the sight for sixteen houses and four flats if City Council planners give the go-ahead in February next year.

The derelict land was once home to the Fosse Riders Club, Groundworks and the Constance Jackson Centre and is near to the main gate and car park on Hinckley Road.

WPEH Limited wants to demolish the existing buildings which, they say, have no historical value and require major work to repair.

The plans include 2 bedroom homes, four of which are classed as affordable, alongside eight 4 beds and four 3 beds. Four 1 bed apartments would also be built alongside car parking,



landscaping and drainage. Fencing and gates to maintain the safety of residents are also planned.

WPEH say five different styles of houses will be built designed to fit in with the architectural style of the area. In the panning document they stated: "...Each house type is designed to meet the differing needs of various social/ demographic groups."

FOOTPATH UPGRADE

Neighbourhood parking spaces across Leicester and a new footpath in the Western ward are being created in a series of schemes designed to improve parking and safety.

Locally, work has taken place to create a new footpath between Hinckley Road and Ainsdale Road, on a piece of unadopted land which has become a right of way over the years. The 75-metre pathway cost about £50k to install.

Local residents are pleased. One said: "I'm glad the work's being done because it used to get really overgrown and the ground was very uneven. You had to really watch yourself walking down there. It got quite dodgy at night too."







Project Hive is run by the WWCE, a group of local residents raising funds to redevelop the former Eco House into a community space.

We have really enjoyed kicking off this year's festive season with our community around us. The Christmas Craft Fair and Family Party at St. Anne's Church Hall were great opportunities to catch up with both new and familiar faces and we all feel grateful for the continued support for the project more than five years since it started.

Going into 2023 we are looking to recruit a couple of enthusiastic and reliable new members to take on the specific roles of treasurer and secretary. At the point we have reached in the project these roles will be of rapidly growing importance as we begin bidding for the finance that will get spades in the ground. If you feel that you



TRACKS OF THE YEARS

The part-pedestrianisation work on Braunstone Gate unearthed a piece of Leicester's transport history in November, as 100-year-old tram tracks were uncovered by contractors.

Leicester's electric tram service ran for 45 years, and ended in 1949 but some tram tracks stayed hidden, under layers of tarmac, due to the difficulty and cost of removal.


There were 17 tram routes in Leicester starting with horse drawn operations in 1874 before electrification took place in 1904 on the fleet of 94 double-deckers. The West End routes began that year and were steadily rolled out until 1915.



The picture below was posted on the Twitter account of local resident Paul Hindle and shows the remains of a cobbled road and the tracks ahead of their disappearance under block paving.

Dec Police Update

As you probably saw in the news there were instances of disorder in other areas of Leicester that had a huge impact on all of us within Leicestershire Police. It is fair to say that things are returning to normal, and you will be seeing your neighbourhood officers back on the beat, hopefully smiling as well! When you see us out and about, please say hello.

I'm sure you will be aware of the serious assault on Dumitru-Nicolae Cherascu, which later resulted in his death. This happened on Tudor Road at around 9pm on Tuesday 29th November. 41-yearold Marian Botea, from Cranmer Street, has been charged with murder and appeared at Leicester Magistrates' Court on Monday 5 December. I want to reassure you that incidents such as this are rare, but when they do occur we need the help of the public to bring those responsible to justice. We are appealing for anyone with more information about the incident to come forward if they have not already done so. Any details you're able to provide could help and you can pass info onto the investigation team via https://mipp.police.uk/ operation/33EM22I20-PO1 or call 101.

We are experiencing the seasonal rise in burglary and theft offences. Make sure your doors and windows are locked. If you are expecting a delivery, please tell the delivery company of your nominated safe place or neighbour where they can deposit your parcels. We have 'things in place' and are working hard to catch those responsible, if you are one of those people and reading this you've been warned!

With Christmas around the corner, consider how you dispose of packaging from new expensive items. Whilst we all love to recycle, the big branded box, that your new pride and joy has arrived in, is also an advert that you have it!

If Santa is bringing you or the children bikes for Christmas, we will be holding further bike registry events in the new year. As the weather gets colder, please don't be tempted to leave your car running on the drive warming up or defrosting even for a minute. This is an open invite for thieves and in most cases your insurance will not cover your loss.

CAREY'S COMPOST

This month I've spent some time planting amaryllis bulbs, unfortunately they won't be flowering for Christmas as they take between 6 to 8 weeks to come into flower. I soaked the bulbs for a couple of hours, which rehydrates them, giving them a head start in forming their growing shoots. The bulbs prefer being pot bound, so I planted them in quite small pots filled with compost mixed with grit. They do like good drainage, so I popped them in a bright area avoiding direct sun and draughts.

Outside I've been pruning apple and pear trees, whilst they are dormant, (between November and March). The ideal shape is an open goblet ideally with five main branches. Initially, I remove any crossed, damaged, disand damaged eased branches. I then shorten any branches which are too long whilst removing any underside growing



spurs, as these will not receive enough light giving poor fruit production. I kept the small twigs that I removed to use as pea sticks and shredded other small waste, where possible, to add to my compost bin and give the compost better structure.

The grass is still growing so I'm continuing to mow the lawns but will make sure that I don't damage the grass by working/walking on it during heavy frost or snow. In addition, I'm still removing any fallen leaves from the lawns as the reduction of light on the grass causes dead patches. In the next few weeks, I'll sharpen or replace my cutting blades on the mower too as blunt or chipped blades can also damage grass.

It is now a great time to plant roses, whilst they are dormant. I planted bare root roses; they can be much cheaper when bought like this and I find there is a much wider variety to choose from. I started by digging holes where they needed to be placed and incorporated into the soil removed some chicken manure pellets and well-rotted compost. I put more chicken manure pellets into the hole and firmed this down. After which I placed the rose in the hole so its base would be below the final level of soil and back filled with the soil mixture. This was heeled in and covered with mulch. Finally, bird feeders were placed nearby as the birds will happily devour any pests spotted nearby.
