
From Mon 18 Dec, there'll be a festive theme to all

ENABLING TALENT

A Year 8 project at New College Leicester has sent enthusiastic music and arts students to Team Hub and Soft Touch Arts all in the name of motivation and inspiration.

Students have had the chance to engage with various local community projects which could guide them onto a future creative arts or media pathway.

Project Enable is the latest of a series of programmes in New Parks, dedicated to improving lives through creativity. The project is a partnership with New College and resident-run community centre, Team Hub, and Soft Touch Arts in Leicester. It coordinates music, art and creative sessions across the three groups to engage young people who attend New College and/or Team Hub, leading on to longer term development and progression sessions in New Parks and eventually at Soft Touch.

Designed for students who have taken part in Stage 1 of the Project Enable onsite at New College, the visit to Soft Touch Arts provided an insight into working alongside industry professionals in a music studio setting, with a view to the students eventually attending sessions at Soft Touch Arts independently. Students explored different resources that are available and took part in art and music workshops. They also had the opportunity to create their own music with some of Soft Touch's highly skilled professional musicians and producers.

During their time at Team Hub, our students were able to see what the local community provision has to offer them. There are a wide range of opportunities, for example music and art workshops, dance classes and football.



These visits raised awareness about career opportunities within music and the performing arts and provided students with the opportunity to develop and strengthen relationships within our partnerships with Soft Touch Arts and Team Hub.

Project Enable is providing creative projects that can have a positive impact and encourage ownership of the community. We hope that by participation our students will have pride in their local community, accountability for their education and leave a lasting creative legacy that they can be proud of for years to come!

Nov/Dec Police Update

A murder investigation which led officers on an international manhunt, has ended with two men being jailed for a total of 20 years.

Marian Botea and Dragos Marin-Gugu were both convicted in August of the manslaughter of 42-year -old Dumitru-Nicolae Cherascu. Both were acquitted of murder.

Mr Cherascu died in November 2022 after being found unconscious on Tudor Rd with serious head

The investigation also uncovered other criminal offending by 42-year-old Botea relating to the controlling of prostitution for financial gain.

The trial relating to the death of Mr Cherascu ended with Botea, of Cranmer Street, Westcotes, being sentenced to 11 years and Gugu, 26, of no fixed address, jailed for 9 years.

Botea had fled the country and was found in Rumania following the issuing of an International Arrest Warrant. He later pled quilty to running a prostitution ring and was jailed for a further 10 months.

Daryoush Kholghnik, 34, was convicted of the kidnap and murder of Tala Tala following an incident in Braunstone in March this year. He was also convicted of two counts of blackmail.

A second man, Talib Mombeini, 38, had previously pled guilty to the kidnaping of Mr Tala. Following the trial at Leicester Crown Court. Mombeini was found quilty to Mr Tala's manslaughter.

On 24th November, Kholghnik was sentenced to a minimum of 31 years and Mombeini for 18 years.

Kholghnik and Mombeini, both of Vaughan Way, had kidnapped Mr Tala in Braunstone, driving him away in his own car. A police investigation led to Mr Tala being found dead from stab wounds in a house in Harrow Road.

It is thought the attack followed a scheme which Mr Tala had previously used to scam money from Kholghnik and Mombeini.

During the early morning of 28 November 3 men were arrested on Suspicion of Theft after the stolen Ford Transit they were in failed to stop for officers on Blackbird Road.

A pursuit was brought to a safe conclusion in Thurmaston where one suspect was also arrested for a number of driving and drug offences.

A 25-year-old man was arrested on suspicion of robbery after he and an accomplice tried to steal a car at knife-point from a driver on Cambridge Street on 24 October.

Two men threatened the driver of a black Chevrolet Matiz before pulling him out of the car.

They failed to start the car, breaking the wing mirrors during the incident.

One of the suspects was detained at the scene by the victim with the help of a member of the public and the other made off. Investigations are continuing.

CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

As the brisk winds of November and December signal the arrival of winter, we gardeners are sometimes tempted to hang up our gloves and trowels a little too early. But these late autumn weeks can allow time for preparation which can significantly improve the health and vibrancy of our gardens in the spring. However, there are common missteps that enthusiastic gardeners might make that could hinder rather than help their plants, before the cold really moves in.

One easily forgotten chore is neglecting the soil.

This is the ideal time for soil amendment and preparation. Failure to enrich the soil with organic matter like compost can lead to poor drainage and nutrient deficiency, affecting the overall health of your plants. Gardening experts recommend incorporating well-rotted compost or manure into the soil to improve its structure and fertility.



Another mistake is careless pruning. While it may be tempting to cut back all the foliage, some plants benefit from winter cover. Over-pruning can expose plants to harsh winter conditions, causing damage to vulnerable stems and buds. Research the specific needs of each plant in your garden before taking out the pruning shears.

Don't ignore pest control. Just because temperatures drop doesn't mean pests disappear. In fact, many seek shelter in garden debris during the winter. Leaving dead plant material around can create a haven for pests and diseases. Clearing away this debris can reduce the likelihood of infestations in the coming season.

Lastly, ignoring the need for protective mulch can leave plants vulnerable to frost. Now is the ideal time to apply a layer of mulch around the base of plants to insulate them from the cold. Failure to do so can result in frost damage, especially for young and tender plants.



Avoiding these common mistakes ensures that your plants enter winter well-prepared and ready to flourish when warmer days return.
