After a muted Saturday, put down to the slightly overcast weather, Sunday was a full-on onslaught of visitors ready to enjoy the festival highlights.

The fun extended as far as De Montfort University Campus which featured mountain bike action demos, shows, stalls, outdoor cinema and student exchange music project.





BEER FESTIVAL REACHES 10TH YEAR

All good ideas in life are formed after a few drinks down the pub.

That is how the Western Park Beer Festival began back in 2015 when a few locals came up with the idea of running a neighbourhood beer festival.



Ten years on and the same team of volunteers will be celebrating their tenth event this year (with a fallow year during Covid), having raised tens of thousands of pounds for local charities in the process. This year's special tenth anniversary Western Park Beer Festival will take place at the usual location, St Anne's Church Hall in Letchworth Road, on August 29-30th.

As usual, there will be a wide range of amazing craft beers, ciders, wines, fizz and gin. Doors will open at 5pm on Friday (August 29), and

the family-orientated session will start at 1pm on Saturday with the usual evening session finishing at midnight. Food will be served on both days. Western Park Beer Festival Chairman David McAuley said: "Ten years ago, we started the festival so the community could get together over a few beers - and raise money for local charities. "Since then, the festival has grown into an event that we are all immensely proud of.

"Not only is it a great weekend for the community but over the last ten years we have raised more than £60.000 for our chosen charities.

"We would like to thank everyone who has supported us over the years, either by coming along or by sponsoring us, which allows us to pass on the profits to our worthy charities.

"Roughly-speaking, every £1 we raise in sponsorship will become £2 for our chosen charities." This year's chosen charity is The Baldwin Trust and the two main sponsors for the event are Merrick Platts Financial Services and MPH Construction and Carpentry.

PLANS FOR BRADGATE HOUSE

A building described as Westcotes biggest eyesore, could be in line for a major facelift and provide much needed living space if developers get their way.

The former Bradgate House retirement home on the corner of Westcotes Drive and Sykefied Avenue, has stood empty for at least 15 years and has fallen into disrepair.

Approval was given for flat conversion in 2016, with work due to start in 2018, but nothing happened due to the extreme dilapidation of the site.

Since then, the state of the building has become even worse and a bigger target for arsonists and vandals. A major fire in 2020 caused severe damage, which was added to by another blaze in March 2024

The developer, Westcotes Property Management Ltd, has said the damage is so bad that an outbuilding had to be demolished, and that the main building was so fire damaged, and open to the elements, it now suffers from damp and dry rot.

The company added that the original scheme was not economically viable and have asked the council's planning officers to allow changes to the approved plans, due to the largely increased cost of rebuilding work. They are now seeking to convert the main structure into 10 one-beds and three two-beds with a 14th flat in a newly constructed building in place of the demolished outbuilding.

Westcotes Property Development say that due to the number of shops, bars and social facilities within walking distance, on-site car parking is not a priority, but space for 4 cars and 18 bicycles will be provided.

A consultation on the changes will run until July 7 with the decision set for August 20th.

WOODGATE PARKING SCHEME STARTS A new permit only residents' parking scheme started in Woodgate on 1st July.

Leicester City Council says this addresses concerns raised by residents and councillors about the number of commuter and business vehicles using residential streets for free all-day parking.

The new scheme will include mainly terraced streets adjoining Woodgate and part of Fosse Road North. In total, around 700 homes will be included in the scheme which follows extensive local consultation.





CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

June and July are glorious months in the garden – everything's in full swing, from blossoming flowers to ripening fruit and buzzing bees. It's a time to reap the rewards of earlier planting, to enjoy the long lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer, and keep your green space looking its vibrant best.

Here's some suggestions on how to make the most of your garden right now:

Your garden becomes your personal supermarket in July! Strawberries, raspberries, currants, and gooseberries are all

ripening beautifully. Start picking them regularly to encourage more fruit. Vegetables like courgettes, beans, and early potatoes, carrots, cauliflowers, onions and peas are also ready for the table, just dig them up fresh for unbeatable flavour.

With longer days and warmer weather, it's crucial to stay on top of watering, especially for containers, hanging baskets, and thirsty crops like tomatoes and cucumbers. Water early in the morning or late evening to avoid evaporation. Feed flower-

ing plants and veggies weekly with simple tomato food.

To keep your garden bursting with blooms, deadhead roses, petunias, and other flowering plants regularly. This not only keeps things tidy but encourages fresh growth. After your lavender finishes flowering, give it a light prune to maintain its shape.

Your lawn might be suffering a little in the heat, so raise the mower blades to avoid cutting it too short. If it's looking dry, give it a deep soak once a week rather than a daily sprinkle, this is much better for the grass root system.

Now's a great time to plant autumn-flowering bulbs like colchicums and autumn crocus. Also,

sow biennials like foxgloves and wallflowers for a stunning spring display next year. Leave out water for birds, hedgehogs, and bees. A shallow dish with pebbles makes a perfect, safe, bee watering station!

We are in the heart of summer, and your garden is bursting with life. So, to try and keep it under control, do at least one job each day then grab your sunhat, pour a cool drink, and enjoy the fruits (and flowers) of your labour!

July Police Update

Operation Identify is a proactive response to ongoing moped related robberies within the city and West Leicester.

On 14th June the Force Priority Team and three off-road bikes from Nottingham joined forces on the operation. Locally, there were two fail to stops but unfortunately those individuals escaped and were lost. However, one quad, one E bike and an off-road bike were recovered. Several arrests were made; all were dealt with for traffic offences and one male for breach of bail.

A total of 30 arrests, so far, have been made across the city during the operation which targets offenders using stolen or illegal mopeds, Escooters and motorbikes.

NPA Commander for West Leicester, Inspector Ryan Hayes said: "We experienced a spike in robbery offences in identified areas across West Leicester and the City centre. We took the decision to target the individuals and gangs causing us harm.

"I have no doubt this work also prevented further robberies and victims."

A man was tasered after a car collided with a concrete bollard at the roundabout at the junction of Aikman Avenue and Letchworth Road.

The two occupants of the vehicle were not seriously hurt but became obstructive towards officers and a taser was discharged on a man.

The male passenger has been charged with three counts of assaulting a constable and the female driver has been charged with failing to provide a specimen for analysis. They will appear in court in July.

Detectives are appealing for witnesses to come forward after a man was attacked on Hinckley Road on Saturday 31st May at around 6.45pm.

The victim, who is in his 20s, rode his e-bike out of Western Park at the Hinckley Road entrance. He was then pushed off his cycle by a group of men who attempted to take it, along with his mobile phone and wallet.

A motorist who was driving along Hinckley Road, at the time, stopped and shouted at the suspects who ran off from the scene leaving the victim on the floor with several fractures.

As this incident happened so close to a busy road, there may be pedestrians who saw what happened, or drivers who caught it on dashcam and can help with the investigation.

Enquires continue after a phone snatch on Fosse Road North. Sadly, it's safer not to use your mobile on a busy street, so try and keep it attached to you with an anti-theft chain or lanyard.
