#### £1.5M MINI HOLLAND REVAMP

#### Work to make permanent a pop-up 'mini-Holland' scheme in part of the West End has got underway.

Leicester City Council is planning to invest up to £1.5 million on permanent measures to help create more space for pedestrians and cyclists in Braunstone Gate.

The aim is to create a more people-friendly place and give more priority to cycles and pedestrians by limiting vehicle access, closing the road to unnecessary traffic at busy times and creating wider pavement areas for visitors to the shops, cafes and bars in the area.



New, wider footpaths will be created, and a section of the street will be repaved in high-quality block paving. The carriageway will be resurfaced in red asphalt. New trees will also be planted as

part of the scheme.

Access to Braunstone Gate from Duns Lane and New Park Street will be restricted to buses, taxis and cycles only, and the left turn from Western Boulevard will be closed to traffic, expect cycles.

Most on-street parking on Braunstone Gate will be removed, with the extra space used to create wider pavements. Businesses will be able to apply for street café licences and outside seating areas.

Disabled parking bays will be retained, and additional pay-and-display parking spaces will now be created on Bede Street and Western Road in response to feedback from local businesses.

Most of the measures were originally introduced on an experimental basis in the summer of 2020. Now, following feedback from local residents and businesses, the city council plans to invest around  $\pounds$ 1.5million to make permanent improvements.

Deputy city mayor and Westcotes ward councillor Sarah Russell said: "Braunstone Gate is home to a vibrant and popular mix of cafes, bars, restaurants and shops and other independent small businesses. It is also a really busy and important route between De Montfort University and the West End.

"This much needed investment represents a huge opportunity for the area. It will help to make it an even more attractive destination, not just for the local community but for the whole city."

#### FIVEWAYS JUNCTION IMPROVEMENTS

Leicester City Council is planning a series of major improvements to completely redesign the busy FiveWays junction which links Blackbird Road, Woodgate, Fosse Road North, Groby Road and Buckminster Road.

The proposed changes include removing the left turn from Blackbird Road into Woodgate, and the right turn from Woodgate into Blackbird Road, as well as closing the existing service road by the shops at the junction of Groby Road and Buckminster Road.

Space will be reallocated for pedestrians and cyclists along with new landscaping and tree planting.

Existing traffic islands, stop lines and signals will be replaced with a simpler arrangement. New crossings for pedestrians and cyclists will also be introduced.

Further improvements between the FiveWays junction and Abbey Gate would see footways widened and a new off-road cycle track along with parking and loading bays. The existing bus stop and pedestrian crossing would be moved and the existing entrance to the supermarket carpark narrowed to improve pedestrian safety.

A new bike docking station is also proposed as part of the Santander Cycles Leicester e-bike hire scheme.

Warning Zone - Volunteers Wanted Local Children's safety charity needs more volunteers. Warning Zone wouldn't function without the generosity of their volunteer guides who deliver sessions during school term times. Some stay for the day, while others go for a morning or afternoon session. The minimum guiding requirement is just 5 hours (2 sessions) per month.

In a normal year they will deliver lifesaving messages to around 10,500 primary school children in year 6 from Leicester and Leicestershire at their state-of-the-art Life Skills Centre, on Frog Island. Warning Zone's aim is to educate young people on understanding risks, peer pressure, anti-social behaviour and its consequences. At the same time, they explain the real



risks of life for children in order to encourage responsibility and sound decision making while living full and active lives.

### May Police Update

Our Fosse team ran an operation to disrupt drug dealing on the beat. The Officers stopped a male who was arrested on suspicion of possession with intent to supply a Class A drug, namely heroin. Enquiries continue.

A 31 year old drug dealer from Beaconsfield Road in Westcotes has been jailed for 4 years after he was found hiding in a bush following a 100 mph chase across Leicester. Brett Smith was found guilty of 5 separate driving, drug and weapon charges.

All the new CCTV cameras have been installed on The Rally which is great news.

2 suspects have been arrested for robbery in New Parks. With the help of CCTV operators, officers were able to locate and detain the two in The Fosse area.

There appears to have been a rise in reports of parcels being stolen from doorsteps by porch pirates. A male was arrested and bailed for this offence while enquiries continue. It makes sense to make use of postal tracking services, video doorbells and secure lockers to prevent theft. The sooner your package is retrieved the less chance there is of it being stolen.

6 uninsured vehicles were recovered by the team over the last month.

A misuse of drugs act warrant was executed on Western Road where £89,000 worth of Cannabis plants were discovered. One male arrested at the scene, charged and remanded to prison pending a court hearing.

A property relating to years of ASB on Bisley Street was closed down after some good partnership work with the city council.

A 21 year old man has been arrested following a report of a serious sexual assault in Great Central Way on April 7th.

A victim has not yet come forward and the report was made by a third party.

A male was arrested following a report of a sexual assault on Western Park on 20<sup>th</sup> March. Following a witness appeal, he was arrested on suspicion of sexual assault and outraging public decency. Investigations are continuing into both cases.

There has been an increase in the theft of catalytic converters across the city. These contain valuable rare earth metals which are in high demand. If possible, try and park your car where it becomes difficult to access from underneath.

Officers have attended the Ukrainian Church on Fosse Road South and taken part in a special service dedicated to those in the Ukraine.

# CAREY'S COMPOST

I've been getting handy with my snippers and doing a lot of pruning this month, especially on spring flowering shrubs such as forsythia,

chaenomeles and choisya. If you cut back the spent spring flowers of the choisya and give it a feed, you are likely to get another set of blooms in the autumn. Additionally, I've been pruning spreading plants such as candytuft, aubretia and alyssum, which create nice shapes and further blooming as they are not overcrowded.



I've been feeding the lawns and repairing any bare patches with seed. New lawns and reseeded lawns need to be kept watered in warm temperatures and seeded areas shouldn't be mowed until approximately three inches long. Healthy lawns can be mowed weekly now, and the blades can be set at your summer cutting height.

It's a good idea to lift and thin out congested spring bulbs like daffodils. I have done this in my garden,

and it will produce a better flowering and more even display next year. I am also earthing up my potatoes, preventing damage from frost on any new shoots which stops light getting to developing potatoes, which will otherwise turn green and be in-edible.

I know we are all desperate to get our bedding plants out, but it's wisest to leave planting out until later in the month. A late frost can damage tender annuals, thus wasting money, time and energy in having to buy new plants. Even if frost is not forecast, it's best to harden them off and acclimatise for about a week which prevents stunting their growth and temperature damage. If you've planted out too early and frost is forecast, try bringing in any containers and cover those in the garden with fleece, which will hopefully give them a little protection. Any plants that you've already bought or grown from seed, and are protecting indoors, should have growing tips pinched out. This produces bushier plants and more chance of flowers.

Now is a good time to trim hedges, but I always check that there are no nesting birds and if there are, leave the hedge until later when nesting has finished. You'll find lots of weeds popping up between plants. It is good to hoe between the plants weekly or take a trowel to the weeds, otherwise they will compete with your prized possessions for nutrients and moisture. As ever, I've been feeding the birds and been keeping their baths topped up. **Carey Tunstall**
