

LEICESTER'S GAS MUSEUM

As the nights close in and the temperature drops, we turn up the gas central heating and snuggle down on the sofa as winter rolls by.

In spite of the dire warnings about climate change at the recent COP conference in Glasgow, the damage fossil fuels have done to Earth's atmosphere over the last 200 years is ongoing and increasing.

Gas, as a major power source, is still very much with us, but how long will it be before it and our traditional boilers and fires are confined to Leicester's National Gas Museum? 2050, if the Net Zero target is met.

Until then, we have 29 years to visit the world's largest and most significant gas history collection, which can be found in the Grade 2 listed gatehouse of Leicester's gas works on Aylestone Road.

From the days when coal or town gas lit London's Pall Mall in 1812 to the 1830s when every large city in the UK had its own privately owned gas works right up to nationalisation in 1947, then onto the conversion to natural gas by 1976 and then back to privatisation in 1986. It's a long story and one that can be relived at the National Gas Museum.

The Museum is run by a charitable trust and was first opened by the British Gas Corporation in 1977, covering two floors containing 4000 items, a lot of which are in storage. But, if you've ever wondered how gas can power a washing machine, iron, hairdryer or even a radio, the answer is here!



In the 19th Century gas was generally used for street lighting and to illuminate factories and it wasn't until the Great Exhibition at Crystal Palace in 1851 that cooking with gas took off after ovens went on display to the general public. These were big, bulky and very expensive affairs but when some gas companies offered to rent them out with a pre-pay coin slot - they became affordable and popular. The thermostat was invented in 1927 and then gas cooking really took off. And the rest, as they say, is history.

SUFFRAGETTE SCULPTURE

New College Leicester is the new home of a unique sculpture of pioneering suffragette Alice Hawkins.

The college was presented with the bust after Year 10 student Gracie Miller won Leicester City Council's essay competition.

The competition sought to find a deserving school to become custodians of a unique piece of artwork produced by Liverpool sculptor Philip Garrett which has been kindly donated to the Alice Hawkins Legacy Group.

Having had to put celebrations on hold due to Covid, New College was finally able to host a presentation event on 5th November. The statue was presented to the school by Leicester West MP Liz Kendall and Peter Barratt, the great grandson of Alice Hawkins.

The event also marked the end of New College's Parliament Week. It included a presentation to the student parliament from Liz Kendall, talking about her role as a Member of Parliament and the importance of democracy and the work of Parliament. Liz was joined by the Great Grandson of Alice Hawkins, Peter Barratt, who provided an overview of his great-grandmother's role in the Suffragettes and her contribution to equality and involvement with Parliament.

Sera Shortland, Head of Citizenship at New

College, said: "It was fantastic to welcome Liz Kendall MP and an actual relative of Alice Hawkins to our school to celebrate Gracie's achievement."

"Winning the essay competition has inspired us to design a corridor of outstanding 'women leaders for change'. Alice Hawkins takes centre stage but a year 10 student has also created artwork of Baroness Doreen Lawrence, mother of the late Stephen Lawrence and British activist, Amika George, to sit alongside Alice as more recent great British women. The artist will also receive a certificate of appreciation for her hard work and fantastic artwork."

*From Hunting to Leisure - Susan Barton's
 The Story of West Leicester's Parks*

PARK TO PARK

At last, it's arrived! After lockdown delays, the book I've been aching to get out is finally here.


"Park to Parks" explores the story of the centuries-long transformation of Leicester Forest's hunting park, from ancient times via its enclosure to create the New Park in Henry VIII's time, its pastoral past, the creation of a public park and the development of the 20th century communities of Western Park, New Parks, Braunstone Frith and Kirby Frith. There are chapters on the archaeology of the area, its medieval history, the post-enclosure rural farming community and its conflicts with the poorest urban dwellers of Leicester who saw the neighbouring countryside as a source of free food to be poached or scumped, while for the prosperous middle-class a country mansion was a status symbol. By the end of the Victorian era the rapidly expanding population of Leicester needed land for housing and for recreation at the same time as country estates around the town began to change hands. Western Park was opened in 1899 as a leisure facility for the West End. This was soon followed by the creation of Western Park Garden Suburb from the mid-Edwardian years with some superb arts and crafts architecture. Post-World War 1, compulsory purchase of more of the farmlands allowed the development of social housing from the 1930s, with the massive construction project of New Parks after the Second World War, followed by Braunstone Frith and Kirby Frith. The book includes sections on transport infrastructure, the turnpike roads, railways and airport that have left their legacies. The book is mostly based on my own original research so includes aspects of our locality's long history not told elsewhere.



HMOs CONTROL PLANS

We are being asked for our views on major new proposals to expand the area in which the city council can control the number of homes being converted to Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs).

Currently, planning consent is not needed to convert a house into a HMO designed for between three and six people to live in. However, where there is evidence that high numbers of HMOs in a particular area is having a negative impact upon that neighbourhood, councils can introduce a legal requirement, called an Article 4 Direction, which would mean planning permission is needed for the change of use.

In the West End, the existing Article 4 Direction covers the streets near to De Montfort University's campus and Leicester Royal Infirmary. The latest proposals would extend the West End zone to stretch from Rowley Fields, to Westcotes, Newfoundpool and parts of the Waterside area.

An Article 4 Direction has already been in place since 2014 in several areas of the city, to control the number of HMOs.

The latest proposals will expand, and in some cases join together, those areas to include thousands more buildings in areas where high numbers of HMOs exist.

Leicester City Council has announced its decision to review the existing arrangements, and as part of that to launch a public consultation to get people's opinions on the proposals and detailing where they would come into effect.

The eight-week online consultation gives details of the proposed areas across the city, and offers a chance for people to give their input on the plans. The information from the consultation will form part of the decision-making process over whether or not to extend the Article 4 Direction.

The consultation runs until January 13, 2022. If the proposals go ahead, the extended Article 4 Direction would be in place 12 months later.

Leicester City Mayor Peter Soulsby said: "While HMOs do have role in meeting the housing needs of groups such as short-term workers, lower-income households and students, they also reduce the number of homes available for families, reduce the variety of housing in an area, create more transient accommodation and are potentially linked to increased noise and disturbance from some occupants."

FOSSÉ CONSERVATION PROPOSALS

A public consultation has been launched to give people a chance to comment on proposals to designate a conservation area centred around the Fosse Recreation Ground.

The proposed conservation area would include the full 11 acres of the tree-lined park, with boundaries on Fosse Road North to the east, and Church Avenue, Merton Avenue and part of King Richards Road to the south.



Among the landmark buildings in the area are the Grade II Listed St Paul's Church, which dates to 1869, the late-19th century neo-Gothic St An-

drew's Methodist Church, the Estonian House on Fosse Road North and several other fine examples of late-Victorian and Edwardian villas and terraced housing.

The area has a long history, with notable archaeological significance dating back to the Romans. It also provides a well-preserved built history of Leicester's suburban development over the last 150 years.

The suggestion to designate St Paul's as a conservation area was originally proposed by local residents and supported by Fosse ward councillors.

Conservation areas are parts of the city that have special historic interest or architectural qualities that deserve to be preserved and enhanced.

There are currently 24 designated conservation areas in Leicester.

Alongside the proposed designation of the new St Paul's Conservation Area, the city council is also planning to extend the existing West End Conservation Area to include Dulverton Road and its townscape of late 19th century houses, many of which retain their original features and character.

TIME OF HOPE


Time Of Hope, published in 1949, is the third in a series of novels with the collective name of 'Strangers and Brothers', written by one of Leicester's most prolific authors, C.P. Snow.

Born in 1905, Snow was educated at Alderman Newton's School, eventually winning a scholarship to Christ College Cambridge and gaining a PHD in Physics.

What makes the Time of Hope, a very interesting read is the fact that it is based in Leicester and gives a rich colourful description of life in the city in the early 1900's.

Its central character, Louis Eliot, is based on Snow himself, who was born and raised in Richmond Road. The book opens in 1914, and there is a lovely description of his first visit to the County Cricket Ground on Aylestone Road, and he talks about the Pavilion Windows, glistening in the sun. The pavilion of course is still there.

There are many other references to well-known Leicester locations, like Hastings Road, Bowling Green Street, Victoria Park, The YMCA and the



long, gone pub 'The Victoria', on Granby Street, which is now a convenience store. There are eleven books in the series, but none describes Leicester as well as Time of Hope.

Nov Police Update

In the early hours of Sunday 7th November, police were called to a report that seven men, who were in possession of weapons including baseball bats, a knife and what was believed to be a BB gun, had broken into a house on Glenfield Road near Fosse Recreation Ground.

A man in his 30s, who was in the property, suffered serious injuries in the incident including stab wounds and pellet wound injuries. He was taken to hospital for treatment.

Two other people who were in the property suffered injuries which are not believed to be life-threatening or life-changing.

The suspects were reported to have left the property, heading down Glenfield Road towards Franche Road. Reports suggest the suspects may have then got into a van to leave the area.

Detectives are appealing to anyone with any information or CCTV or dashcam footage to get in touch by calling 101 or reporting online at www.leics.police.uk quoting incident 79 of 7 November.

The local team have been really busy over the last few weeks. A walk through The Rally with a drug dog resulted in a male arrested for possession with intent to supply Class B drugs. He has been released under investigation pending further enquiries.

A stolen motor bike was recovered quickly following information from the public – Thank you, without your help this would not have happened. A search warrant was executed on Dunton Street where a cryptocurrency mine was located. Again, a huge fire risk due to the equipment overheating.



We've also seen 3 vehicles seized for no insurance. There has been a rise in the number of reported thefts from motor vehicles, so please can I ask everyone not to leave anything on display in vehicles, keep doors and windows locked.

CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER



This year I'm experimenting by taking some hardwood cuttings. It can be a slow process as they can take many months to root. I'm going to give Dogwood (*Cornus sanguinea* or *mid winter fire*) Weigela and Spirea a try once the leaves have fallen. The plan is to place them in outdoor containers after cutting the tops at an angle, just above a bud. I'll then dip the straight cut base in hormone rooting powder and insert two thirds of the 6" cutting below the soil. I'll be keeping my fingers crossed and, hopefully, I will have new plants this time next year!



There is still time to plant bulbs this month, especially if the soil is still warm. Bulbs such as tulips, narcissi and crocus can be safely planted until the end of the month. For a winter colour injection, it's still okay to plant violas, pansies and wallflowers, but if this is done towards the end of the month, I like to add some grit to the soil to improve drainage. In addition, whilst the soil is still warm, I like to add mulch such

as bark, compost, or leaf mould to my garden. This is good especially if there are bare patches where I've taken out spent annuals or I'm using it to surround perennials which have been cut back. It's really important to protect vulnerable tender plants from the cold. Either move them into a greenhouse or conservatory or protect them with garden fleece. I like using garden fleece as it still lets in some moisture and light whilst reducing the risk of frost damage.

My vegetable plot is quite bare at the moment, but I have planted garlic, onions and shallots. These are covered in cloches which helps to prevent frost/snow damage. The garlic needs a period of cold to establish root growth. I'm still mowing my lawns as grass continues to grow when the temperature reaches 5 degrees or more. I am also removing any fallen leaves from the lawn as they block light and moisture which is still required by the grass. If it's still mild it's also okay to scarify, aerate and top-dress.

And finally, please keep the birds well fed during these colder months as they can really start to struggle. It's also good to keep your bird bath full and make sure it doesn't become frozen and therefore inaccessible - the same should be applied to your garden pond if you have one. I put rubber ducks on the surface of my pond so that it doesn't completely freeze over, and they are easily move-able which enables oxygen and ammonia exchange through the hole in the ice which is left.


