Starting a winters day with a bowl of steaming hot porridge might be ideal, but did you know Leicester has a historic porridge pot! Roger Blackmore delves into it's contents.

A PORRIDGE POT

The Duchy of Lancaster and 7 centuries of tradition

An impressive cast iron porridge pot still stands in the hallway of the modern building that is now Trinity Hospital just across the river from the Newarke.



It serves as a reminder that this ancient foundation dates back to 1331 when Henry Grisholm, the Earl of Lancaster and Leicester, and a cousin to King Edward II originally opened it as a hospital for "50 poor and infirm folk" Forever to be associated with the Duchy of Lancaster right up to the present day, Trinity Hospital was by 1609 described as an almshouse for persons 'of honest life and good name and not with any infections or loathsome disease'. Readers may remember the former building has been occupied by DeMontfort University since the early 1990's with the current modern building

providing a comfortable home to some 30 residents along the lines of conventional sheltered accommodation.

At the time the University moved in various sightings of the legendary ghost of Trinity Hospital were reported, presumably the spirit of some long dead Duke of Lancaster!

Today the Lord Mayor of Leicester serves as the Master of Trinity Hospital during his or her term on office and a foundation service is held each year in June at which the porridge pot is still a key attraction to visitors.

New Year Update

From Hinckley Road Policing Unit

The geographical area of Hinckley Road Local Policing Unit has changed to align with the council 'ward' boundaries. The aim is to enhance working relationships between the police and the community. As far as Hinckley Road LPU is concerned this means they welcome the residents, users and businesses in the adjacent Fosse Ward.

Asbo-mobile

The dedicated Anti Social Behaviour car which was running on the approach to Christmas has seen fruitful results. Officers attended all reports of Anti social behaviour and when not attending incidents, they patrolled areas where Western Park residents voiced their concerns. The ASB car will be deployed once again later this month.

Hinckley Road drug dealer receives lengthy custodial sentence

On 4th January 2010 a man was sentenced to 6 years in prison for the possession of Class A controlled Drugs and a two year sentence to run concurrently for the possession of Cannabis with intent to supply in the Hinckley Road area.

Over 3 kilograms of Cannabis with a street value of £1,900 and over 121 grams of Cocaine with a street value of £5,000 was recovered.

Cash and other assets recovered during the investigation have been confiscated under the Proceeds of Crime Act.

Distraction Burglar charged

Hinckley Road officers have arrested and charged a man with four counts of distraction Burglary across the city and Hinckley Road area in December 2009.

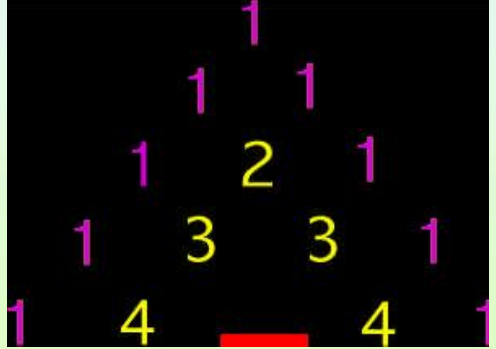

Western Park News Review 2009

JAN- Fire ravaged the Westcotes United Reformed Church at the corner of Hinckley Road and Westcotes Drive at around 1.30 in the morning of December 8th 2008.

Over 30 fire-fighters fought overnight to battle a blaze that eventually destroyed the Church's annex room, with fire fighting efforts leaving water damage throughout the rest of the of the building and flooding the cellar. The remains were demolished in 2009.

FEB- Tesco opened a new store on the site of the old Jessops camera shop on Hinckley Road.

Jessops sold the 20,000 sq ft site which employed 19 after Tesco made them a high undisclosed offer.

Many regarded the loss of "The World Photo Centre" as a real blow to the area and petitioned against the sale of alcohol on the site. The Tesco opened following a major rebuild.

MARCH- One of Leicester's longest running family businesses closed its doors after 73 years.

Lane's Pork Butcher's on King Richard's Road sold their last home made pork pie at the end of March as Alan and Tom Lane join their brother, Rob in retirement.

The firm originally set up by their Grandfather Bernard nearly 100 years ago, in Daventry has served generations of customers in Western Park from their King Richard's Road shop since it opened in 1936.



MAY- Western Park would not become home to a 450ft wind turbine.

The park had been put forward as a potential site as part of a Leicester City Council drive to use more environmentally friendly sources of power but it has now been ruled out of a scheme for six wind turbines around the city.

It has been reported that this is because wind and soil tests to see if the area could support a turbine came back showing it was not viable.

JUNE The new Lord Mayor of Leicester supports a long running local charity running a traditional seaside children's holiday home. Western park Councillor Roger Blackmore had chosen the Leicester Children's Holiday Centre at Mablethorpe as his Lord mayor's Appeal charity.

He said: "Leicester Children's Holiday Centre was set-up in the late 1800s and continues to do a really wonderful job. All children should be able to enjoy the simple pleasures of a seaside vacation and this wonderful charity helps provides this to those who might otherwise miss out".

JULY- Western Park exploded into a riot of colour during the first weekend of July as the latest Open Gardens Event took place.

17 gardens were open to the public following a crowded opening ceremony in the grounds of St Anne's Church.

Over 400 local people enjoyed the sun and ramble around some of the most creative gardens in Leicester raising more than £2000 for Rainbows, the Leicestershire children's hospice and the Community Hall Building Fund



AUG- A local author scored a book deal as Dan Tunstall had his first novel published. Big and Clever tells the story of two teenage boys, Tom and Raks, who find themselves caught up in the murky world of football hooliganism.

SEPT- The historic West Leicester landmark, Bowstring Bridge, which spans Braunstone Gate, was to be demolished to allow redevelopment of the DeMontfort University sports facilities.

NOV- "Old Major" is one of our area's oldest trees. Despite growing quietly in Western Park for over 250 years, its size and age made it unstable. And on 20 August, a large branch collapsed causing significant damage. Leicester City Council officers assessed the tree and recommended reducing its size by up to 25%.

No matter how hard and forbidding winter can be, there is always something you can do in the garden.

Having said that, maybe it would be better to work off that Christmas pud when the chance of frost-bite has reduced, and the glacier has receded from the veg patch. Come to think of it - that comfy chair looks awfully inviting, so maybe now would be a good time to read a stack of seed catalogues and plan another year of gardening?

But this year my New Year's resolution is to use up all those half empty, impulse-purchased, missed-sowing-time packets of seeds, before I buy any new. And I already have enough trays and pots of over-winter cuttings to reforest half of Brazil.

Some things I will have to buy new. Umbelliferous seeds like parsnip and carrot rarely keep well once



open. A row of Nantes carrots has already been planned for my raised beds and I'm determined to get a crop of Florence Fennel that doesn't run straight to seed. On the other hand, tomato seed seems to last forever if I keep it dry and mould free.

What about all those unmarked packets and odds and sods? Well I'm going to mix them all together and play a game of germination bingo by planting them in a quiet corner of a flower bed and seeing what emerges. Now where did I put my pipe and slippers?
