BLACK ANNIS

Of all the characters associated with our Western Park area none is more wreathed in mystery, myth and legend than Black Annis Described bу



past writers as an ogress or a witch, Black Annis lived in a cave close to what is now Westfield Road. A cave which she is reputed to have clawed out of the sandstone rock with her bare talons. The floor was said to be stained with the blood of lambs and children.

The tales told of this cave, or Black Annis's Bower, are legion. In 1874 a writer in the Leicester Chronicle claimed that little children off to play in the Dane Hills area were warned ... "That Black Annis lay in wait to snatch them away to her bower and that many were scratched to death with her claws. She sucked their blood and hung their skins up to dry.'

It was also believed she scurried through a tunnel linking Western Park to the centre of old Leicester where her unearthly spirit still lingers.

According to research by the early 19th Century Leicestershire historian, John Nichols, there was a anchoress, Agnes Scott, who was supposed to have lived in a cave in the west of Leicester called Black Agnes's Bower. Black An-nis herself has been described as having a livid blue face with one deranged eye and there is no doubt that tales of her comings and goings were widespread in the nineteenth Century when she was sometimes known as Cat Anna, who also spent her time in the cellars of Leicester Castle.

Today Morris dancers still skip in and around one or two local pubs in memory of Black Annis and there are those

Nice Box – What's In It?

Don't drop your guard in the battle against malicious computer software!

On 17th November, last year a virus infected the networks of three London hospitals, resulting in considerable disruption to patient care. This virus identified as Mytob carries a Trojan horse that is capable of putting confidential personal data at risk and spreads via e-mail. Surprisingly, this virus, identified in 2005 is now categorised as "low risk" by anti-virus software suppliers. But this can affect home and business computer users across Western Park, and here's how.

Malicious Software or malware writers are developing code for profit rather than simply to cause mischief. The malware is also becoming sneakier in concealing its existence from detection. One anti-virus software supplier claims to be finding almost 20,000 new infected web pages every day,

Experts agree that organisations should never Microsoft Certified Professional Developer and connect computers to any networks that are not running the latest anti-malware applications. Home computers users are in a different position because weakness in your computer's defence is not immediately obvious before personal information is gathered or attacks launched onto other systems.

> The advice is: Don't use old operating systems. If you're a Microsoft user. always enable windows automatic updates. Alwavs install and enable anti-malware software, which is not



expensive and generally, works well with the default setting. Daily updates are vital, so don't let your subscriptions lapse. Make sure also that your firewall is never disabled. Make sure you understand the reasons for changing any anti-malware software configuration settings. Otherwise do not do it!

The Special Olympics GB National Summer Games will be held in Leicester between the 25th and 31st July.

Over 2,700 athletes representing 19 Special Olympic regions across the UK will visit the city over the seven day period along with 1200 coaches and 1500 volunteers.

The 2,700 athletes will compete in a range of Olympic style sports competitions across the city.

Leicestershire County Cricket Club, Leicester City Football Club and Rutland Water are just some of the 21 sporting venues confirmed to host the 2009 Games.

WESTCOTES CHURCH UP IN FLAMES

The big news in the Western Park area was £20,000 renovation and a £12,000 repair bill the recent fire that ravaged the Westcotes United Reformed Church at the corner of Hinckley Road and Westcotes Drive at around 1.30 in the morning of December 8th.

Over 30 firefighters fought overnight to battle a blaze that eventually destroyed the Church's cotes Councilors. annex room, with firefighting efforts leaving water damage throughout the rest of the of the building and flooding the cellar.

The blaze was so severe, that residents of the neighbouring flats and houses were roused from their beds, asked to leave and not allowed back until the afternoon



Nobody was injured, and the cause of the blaze, which is thought to have started on the second floor, is still under investigation. Sniffer dogs were brought in to check for the cause. The fire comes shortly after a recent
