HOLE THING TO MOVE

It has been a prominent West Leicester landmark for thirty five years but now "The Great Hole of Leicester", as it's known, will soon be moved.

The Mermaid's Arch relief is the terracotta and brick circle which stands by West Bridge. The upper mermaid panels originally highlighted the entrance to the old wholesale fruit and veg market in Rutland Street before its demolition in 1972.

The hand moulded Doulton and Co panels were regarded as too good to be just throw out and were put in storage. In 1981, they were set into a red brick circle and re-erected at West Bridge as a feature and talking point.

There are no actual records as to why West Bridge was chosen but now, as part of a scheme to improve and beautify the route from the train station to the Cultural Quarter and surrounding area, the council plan to move the Mermaid's Arch back to its former spot by the Curve theatre.

The aim of the change, along with other improvements to Orton Square and St. George's Church yard, is to make the whole area more user friendly and safer following a series of muggings and petty crime on the route from the London Road station.

The council are currently in consultation and expect to start the 14 week project in the autumn.

BUILDING WESTCOTES

In the 1880s, the Mile Straight of the Grand Union Canal was created, now the site of the Riverside Festival, reducing the flood risk from the surrounding marshy land. At the same time, the Westcotes Estate, covering the area between Westcotes Drive, Hinckley Road and Narborough Road, was sold for development.


Westcotes Drive was previously known as Manor Road; the road leading to the manor of Westcotes. Joseph Harris of Westcotes House (now demolished) gave generous donations to fund the building of the Church of the Martyrs on Westcotes Drive, the Dispensary on Hinckley Road, the Schoolroom and the Library, both on Narborough Road. All these buildings may still be seen today, and the church in particular is thriving. A condition of the gift was the library should not open on Sundays, and that the racing pages should be removed from the newspapers on display there.

Rows of houses sprang up, often built by small local firms who would build a few at a time and then use the money from the sale to build the next batch.

The Church of the Martyrs was dedicated to three Anglican bishops: Ridley, Latimer and Cranmer, who were burnt at the stake between 1555 and 1556 for their Protestant beliefs. They are commemorated in the names of three streets between Shaftesbury Rd and Hinckley Rd.

Two of the other streets. Livingstone Street, named after the explorer and missionary, and Tyndale Street, named after the printer of the first Bible in English, have corresponding stained glass windows inside the church

The cover of the Martvrs Parish Magazine from January 1906 pictures the church standing almost on its own with very little vet built around it. But shops on Hinckley Road were already busy, and



their advertisements in the magazine show the boots, hosiery, clothing, sewing machines, furniture and general ironmongery for sale.

There will be other themed fundraising event days throughout the year for age UK and Barnado's at Santander Narborough Road.



April Police Update

As we move into the Spring season, officers have been springing into action in tackling the nuisance caused by motorbikes and mopeds being ridden in an anti-social manner across our public spaces such as The Rally and Western Park. We are taking action from all departments of the West Leicester Neighbourhood Policing Area including Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers and officers from our Neighbourhood Priority Team, who are reacting to the reports received of vehicles being ridden on public spaces. We are also looking at I where these vehicles are coming from and regularly find that they are actually stolen vehicles. Therefore we monitor the reports of what vehicles have been taking from where and noting descriptions and recognisable features. I encourage those, like myself, who own motorbikes or mopeds to make sure that they are well secured. Preferable locations are inside bricked garages, with anchor points to the floors or walls; where a reputable branded lock is used to secure it. Please mark protectively mark your vehicles with your postcode or register them with tracking services.

THE UK NATIONAL PROPERTY REGISTER

A service we recommend is 'Immobilise', which is an online system that you can register your valuables or personal property. If officers at a later date come across any stolen items, we conduct checks on any serial numbers or details found. If they are registered it dramatically increases the chances of you being reunited with your items.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

In an event as rare as a solar eclipse, I recently enjoyed a few blissful hours on my own, in the garden, on a beautiful spring day. With eyes closed and warmed by the April sun, I found myself experiencing the garden in a way I never consciously had before; with my ears. The sound of Spring was more calming and joyous than any Zen CD or mindfulness class. In an ornamental garden the aim is to stimulate or pleasure the senses - but how often do we consider the soundscape we create?

Many of the noises in the garden are produced externally and are beyond our control. I find the sound of life going on beyond the walls of my garden comforting. Even the sound of traffic can be intriguing and interesting. To block it out is a near futile task. Hedges have little effect in absorbing noise. Tall solid walls or special acoustic fencing are expensive solutions, only for the desperate. An easier solution would be to mask intrusive noise with the sound of a water feature. This doesn't have to require a pond as there are many stand-alone water features that provide the soothing sounds of splashing, gurgling and dripping water.

are habitual so providing all year round food and the protection of large shrubs will bring a loyal feathered following. With the internet it's relatively easy to identify different birdsong which can add to your enjoyment. The industrious sound of bees going about their pollinating business is another comforting sound, and we should all be trying to stop

the decline of our native bumble bees.

I have mixed feelings about wind chimes. Some impart a gentle arrhythmic sound, clanking tunefully in the breeze. Others produce a relentless metallic off-key tinkling like aural water torture that can slowly chip away at a gardener's sanity. Much more comforting is the sound of the breeze brushing through foliage. Poplar trees, like Aspen, sound amazing, assuming you own a park! In smaller gardens Bamboo is effective, as are grasses like *miscanthus*. On a miniature scale, *Briza maxima* or Quaking Oats is a little gem with pretty heart-shaped rattling seedheads. There are many other plants with foliage that rustles and seed pods that rattle. The art of enjoying the sounds of your garden is not simply to drown out all unwanted noise but to be able to focus in on the natural sounds that go unnoticed. Mindfulness gardening I bet there's a few quid in that!
