IntaSound have sold everything from plectrums to percussion to the city's musicians over the last 49 years from their shop on Narborough Road, but now the time has come to move out.

Originally opened as an organ shop in 1976 by Malcolm Wright, it expanded over the years to include many more instruments as well as studio and stage equipment and a large online presence.

Now run by Malcolm's sons, Lloyd and Alex, who feel it's time to move on and take their business to the next level.

Lloyd said: "We've evolved over the years and we've out-grown our premises. We now do a lot more outside stage equipment hire; light, sound, that sort of thing. It's big, heavy stuff and we don't have the space to store it all here and the parking is terrible on Narborough Road. #### OLD TOWN FESTIVAL

A funny thing happened on the way to the forum as the Easter break ended with a spectacular romp through Leicester's early history!

The free Old Town Festival celebrated the city's Roman heritage and St George's Day, effectively killing two dragons with one pilium.



What have the Roman's ever done for us? Well thousands turned up to find out and get a taste of Roman occupation as the legion camped out near the impressive forum, custom built from carboard and tape, by artist Olivier Grossetête's team.

Roman warrior training, where children learned to march like a legionnaire, wield a sword like a true

centurion, and attack their parents with pointy sticks was a highlight for many young visitors.

For the grown-ups; hands-on archaeology, Roman theatre, artisan craft activities, food and jewellery were all on display or up for grabs as long as you had a purse full of denarius.

Centring on Jubilee Square and the Old Town, the festival featured an urban mosaic workshop at the Guildhall, themed storytelling on the children's bookbus, Morris dancing, face-painting and a medieval dress-up booth for young festival-goers.

A dangerous fire-breathing dragon was on the loose in Cathedral Gardens, alongside stilt-walking jesters, magical wizards and a trio of clumsy knights taking on daring quests.





#### COST TO PARK IN LEICESTER GOES UP

The cost of parking in the city has risen as new parking fees and charges came into effect in Leicester's council-run car parks, multistoreys and on-street parking bays.

This increase brings the council into line with similar authorities and private car parking operators and should reduce some of the strain on the council's beleaguered finances.

The revised fee and charges mean that, in council-run city centre car parks, costs will start at £2.50 for a one-hour stay, up from the current £2.

Costs for a three-hour stay will rise from £4 to £5, and from £5 to £6.30 for a four-hour stay.

Standard fees for evening parking in car parks will also be charged, with the cheaper Night Owl rates due to end.

On-street parking bays will see charges rise from £2 to £2.50 for one hour, with varying charges for longer stays depending on the location and free on-street parking on Sundays will stop, with standard rates being charged instead.

It's thought that the changes will bring in an additional £1.1million in parking revenue. Around half of this will cover rising costs in the management, operation and enforcement of parking facilities, with the remaining £600,000 due to be ringfenced to offset budget pressures in highways and transport services.



### **DIGGING IT ALL UP!**

A £295,000 scheme to improve road crossings at the junction of Blackbird Road and Parker Drive has got underway.

A new signal-controlled pedestrian and cycle crossing, an additional zebra crossing, and the replacement of traffic lights make up the scheme which is linked to new housing on Somerset Ave-

The work is expected to take 6 months.

#### WESTCOTES DRIVE 20 MPH ZONE

Work is continuing on a new 20mph zone covering nine residential streets surrounding Westcotes Drive in at a cost of £140.000. The

work is expected to be finished by the end of June.

The council consulted 326 households and received 106 replies, less than a third responded, with 88% of those saying they agreed with the proposals.

Westcotes Drive had become a rat-run for traffic trying to bypass Hinckley Road, Fosse Road and Narborough Road during



the rush hour. Its junction with Hinckley Road has been barriered off to traffic, except cycles for around 5 years.

layouts, which include narrowing The new Westcotes Drive and Dulverton Road at their Hinckley Road junctions, are aimed at encouraging traffic heading out of the city to stay on the main road network (Hinckley Road & Wyngate Drive) rather than using Westcotes Drive. The hope is to preserve and improve the amenity of the area by reducing the speed limit along the road.

#### JEWRY WALL MUSEUM TO OPEN

It might feel like it's taken as long as the Roman occupation to sort out, and at £16.8 million cost just as much, but the Jewry Wall Museum is due to open it's doors in July.

Situated just a stone's throw town-wards of West Bridge, visitors will be able to see how the remains of the Roman bath house at Jewry Wall have been incorporated into a contemporary museum, with more than 100 Roman artefacts, all discovered in Leicester and county, along with the latest digital technology helping to bring Leicester's Roman past to life. # CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

A wildlife garden is a haven for local species and a great way to support doorstep biodiversity which is something very close to my heart. It doesn't matter if you have a large garden or a modest patch, creating a space for nature can be simple, rewarding, and beneficial to the environment.

Begin with plants that are native to the UK, as they provide the best food and shelter for local wildlife. Wildflowers like cowslips, oxeye daisies or Pyramidal orchid attract bees, butterflies, and other pollinators. In fact you can pick up a packet of scattering seeds for 50pl Native hedgerows such as hawthorn, blackthorn, and dog rose offer nesting and food opportunities for birds and small mammals.



Creating diverse habitats, by using a mix of features to support various species, is how you do it. A pond is great for amphibians, insects, and birds. Even a small water-filled container can make a big difference. Piles of logs, stones, and leaves offer shelter for hedgehogs, frogs, and invertebrates. Let a corner

of your garden grow wild to provide a safe space for creatures to thrive undisturbed and avoid pesticides or chemical fertilisers, as these can harm insects and the animals that feed on them.

If you have the time, space and money, you could install different types of bird feeders and nesting boxes to attract different species, like blue tits, robins and swifts.

It's a different type of garden experience as you provide hedgehog houses or leave gaps in fences for their safe passage. You're regularly topping up ponds, cleaning bird feeders, and refreshing nesting boxes. You're also mowing less often, in spring and summer, to let flowering plants bloom and seed. You could leave a space that isn't mown and incorporate wildflowers to create a natural, rich meadow area while you're composting garden waste to enrich your soil organically and provide a home for decomposers like worms and beetles.

A good way to be involved and stay informed, is to join the Leicestershire and Rutland Nature Trust or citizen science projects like the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch to learn more and track the creatures visiting your garden.

With some thoughtful planning and care, your wild-life garden can become a thriving ecosystem and a peaceful retreat. It's a small but powerful way to reconnect with nature and contribute to the conservation of UK wildlife.

## April/May Police Update

On 29th April a Leicester man was jailed for 12 years at Leicester Crown Court after he was arrested at Fullhurst Avenue Post Office for sending cocaine through the mail.

Zakira Jawaid pleaded guilty in February to supplying class A drugs between 23rd September 2021 and 8th November 2024.

Enquiries revealed he sent parcels via special delivery from the Post Office after police became aware that a package containing cocaine was redirected to a retail store in Glasgow in September last year.

CCTV enquiries carried out at the branch showed Jawaid sending multiple parcels at the same time as the one later seized in Scotland.

A total of 4.6 kilograms of cocaine was found at his home – estimated to be worth around £460,000 and \$24,000 in cryptocurrency.

Investigations are ongoing after a man was taken to hospital with non-life threatening stab wounds, following an incident on Narborough Rd, on 13<sup>th</sup> April.

Police have spoken with a number of witnesses and continue to establish the full circumstances behind the incident.

Two suspects were arrested following a fight involving multiple people in the county.

Firearms officers were called to Golf Course Lane in Braunstone at 2.34pm on Thursday 24th April.

It was reported that weapons had been seen but there were no serious injuries.

A 31-year-old woman and a 41-year-old man were arrested on suspicion of causing actual bodily harm and were placed in custody.

Detectives are appealing for information following a robbery on Western Park where a 12-year-old boy was shoved off his pushbike by a group of males, who then stole it.

This was between 11 and 11.30am on Saturday 19 April, when the group, wearing dark clothing and balaclavas approached the boy.

Detective Constable Hannah Wayman is asking for any witnesses on the park at the time to come forward and that park users should remain vigilant and report anything suspicious.

The Fosse Neighbourhood Team arrested a man on two serious drugs related charges, who will now be enjoying porridge for breakfast until 2029.

Additionally, four more positive arrests due to the individuals being found in possession of drugs, and a male was caught dealing on the Rally. A good outcome for April as drugs are one of Fosse Beat's main priorities.
