Poetry in Leicester

With the recent appointment of Simon Armitage as the new Poet Laureate, it seems appropriate to take a look at poetry within our community.

Throughout the years, interest in poetry and poets has remained strong in both the City and County, as can be seen at the annual Everybody's Reading Festival and at community events to celebrate National Poetry Day.

Local initiatives to help poetry to flourish include the former Leicester Poetry Society, Word! and Leicester Writers' Club

Poetry at the Western, the pub venue close to Narborough Rd junction will be familiar to a number of readers, with many performances throughout the year.

Soundswrite, a women's poetry group meets regularly at the Friends meeting house on Queens Road and performance poetry is staged at various venues locally, including both our city universities and the Y centre.

A prominent Jamaican poet, Jean Binta Breeze, has made her home in Leicester. Other published poets from the area include Davina Prince, Caroline Cook and Pam Thompson, the latter being a prize-winner in last year's Ledbury Poetry Festival competition.

Leicestershire is also unique in one interesting respect. In the 1970's its County Councillors decided to produce an anthology containing poems written entirely by members. Officers unkindly cast doubts on whether councillors were up to this task but in the event, the appointed independent judges declared the work of a generally high standard.

Interest in poetry continues to thrive here, though Leicester has yet to produce a local poet laureate.

Imagine I have one of those booming cinema trailer voices and you can hear me say this... "Castlemead Academy – coming to your community this Autumn".

Lots of kids I know are going to be turning up there for the new school year but there has been something missing... a school! In case you didn't know where it is based, it's down by the Mile Straight near the old Kirby and West Dairy site.

You'd be forgiven for not knowing as nothing has happened there for ages. Kids all received offers for places at the school in March but still no building occurred on the site. I've been waiting and watching with interest to see what it will look like.

For many of us, school included lessons in 'the mobile' but things have moved on since I was at school. I've learned that there is a catalogue for mobile buildings to be used in education. Schools' management teams can pick the level of finish they want and all they have to do is find a site, provide utilities and order a school! That is top level shopping. Rushey Mead School showed parents their mobile buildings and promised the Castlemead ones would be of the same standard, this is not the mobile you remember!

After months of seeming inactivity on the site, I was walking along Hinckley Road and lo and be-

hold! I saw a lorry with a mobile on it. Not unusual in itself, but this one had a sign in the back saying Castlemead on it. I quite literally followed a chunk of it along Hinckley Road as it arrived on the back of a lorry. I posted a picture on social media. Then saw another lorry, and another.



Suddenly the site is all activity. If you take a stroll along you can see the buildings all being stacked up and landscaping is taking place. My excitement level at this is probably too high, especially as my child isn't going there, but seeing something appear out of the ground, something that will nurture kids and provide them with a place to grow is exciting. All that promise and potential in one place should give us a warm glow. At last we have a new school.

Aug Police Update

Your local policing teams based at Hinckley Road are continuing to fight the dangerous use of property to grow large scale 'cannabis-factories'. Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

When the editor sent me a request for some horticultural scribbles for the latest issue of the Gazette, his message found me on holiday in the French Alps.

Away from the coal face, or rather the gardens of Leicester, I've found myself far too chilled to think of anything to write about. As I've cycled through wildflower meadows, hiked through Alpine scenes of floral beauty, no subject matter sprang to mind. Obviously, my creative ability was on holiday as well! I consoled myself by cooking dinner for the family. A spicy tomato sauce made with locally-grown produce sounded just the ticket, but where to find the herbs to flavour it on a Sunday afternoon when most French shops shut by 12.30? Luckily, 'I've got a very particular set of skills' to quote Liam Neeson, and set off down the country trail leading from the campsite.

Oregano, *Origanum vulgare* grows wild in the verges here, its sprays of pale pink flowers providing nectar to a myriad of local insects species. At least I assumed it was Oregano. It's easily confused with Marjoram. Their leaves are almost identical. Marjoram flowers are often whiter, but

they interbreed, creating many varieties. Analysing the plant's sepals, the growths that cover the

buds and fold back underneath the opening flowers, can help determine which is which. Oregano sepals are often much bigger than Marjoram.

Another way to distinguish between them is the flavour. Marjoram is considered mellower, whereas Oregano is more spicy and stronger in flavour. But the main reason I assumed it was

Oregano is that it was growing in an area that's cloaked in snow and ice all winter, something the more tender Marjoram is

unlikely to survive.

Back at home I grow Oregano "Aureum", dotted along the front of some of the beds. This golden variety makes an excellent lowgrowing border perennial. If only I was back there, I'm sure I would have thought of something to write about!


