

A MAGNIFICENT MAN

The history books tell us that on December 17th 1903, Orville Wright made the first powered flight. It lasted just 12 seconds. But for a horrific accident in the autumn of 1899, Leicestershire might have gone down in history, instead of Kitty Hawk North Carolina, as the location of a pioneering flight in the history of aviation. Today the county is famous in several ways for the development of powered flight not least with the jet engine development work of Frank Whittle at Lutterworth in the 1930's and 1940's.

Our particular magnificent man in a flying machine was Percy Pilcher. He was born in Bath in 1866. During his six years in the Royal Navy he developed an increasing interest in engineering. Over the years his interest in aeronautics grew. In 1895 he built a hang glider which he called the Bat to be followed two years later by another which he called The Hawk.

It was with The Hawk that, not long afterwards, he broke the world distance glider record at just over 800 feet flying at Stanford Hall in the south of Leicestershire.


Percy Pilcher now began to turn his attention to the possibilities of powered flight. Despite increasing money worries he persevered with this and by the autumn of 1899 he believed he was in a position to fly his new tri-plane fitted with an internal combustion engine. To this end he invited members of the Aeronautical Society to Stanford Hall for a demonstration flight.

Alas his new plane suffered a broken crankshaft and despite bad weather he prepared to give an alternative flight in The Hawk. The Hawk rose to thirty feet at which point there was a loud crack as the tail gave way.and Percy crashed to the ground. He was taken to hospital but died two days later.



Had he survived that accident he would almost certainly have gone on to develop the first means of powered flight in Britain and indeed the world. His face might well have appeared on our bank notes and his fame outshone that of the Wright brothers. As it is his story remains one of the great "ifs" of history

A monument to his memory may still be found near Stanford Hall. Roger Blackmore



TRAFFIC ACTION GROUP

Lord Willy Bach & Liz Kendall in Western Park Lord Willy Bach, the Police and Crime Commissioner, visited our area on Tuesday 14th November. We took him on a walk around the area - highlighting traffic related issues - speed and volume of traffic, parking around the schools, and size of vehicles which use the roads as a cut through. A good number of people joined the entourage and spoke to him about their concerns and experiences. We spent time on Hinckley Road – talking to the home owner whose wall was demolished by a speeding driver on the previous Saturday night - as well as experiencing the horrors of the traffic on Hinckley Road.

Lord Bach then met members of the community in St Anne's Church: representatives from Community Speed Watch, Neighbourhood Watch, residents, parents and 3 of the local schools.

Councillor Su Barton gave an update from City Council highways dept about the 20mph zone and proposed schemes for Dovelands and other schools in the area. Many issues were raised and discussed and people also provided written comments and suggestions.

We have written a summary for Lord Bach and he has promised to discuss the issues with the City

Leicester West MP Liz Kendall came for a short visit on Friday 24th November. We highlighted our concerns and asked her to raise questions in the Houses of Parliament:

- About the lack of Police resources to address increasing road and traffic offence issues due to 'austerity' - and to press for more funding for the Police
- To initiate a nationwide campaign to address driver behavior and speeding.



Local Charities Benefit From Beer Festival

The Western Park Beer Festival Committee is delighted to announce that the total raised for charity this year was £8,275.

The money will help LOROS, our local hospice, support one nurse and two healthcare assistants for a whole month. A donation will also go towards installing a disabled lift at St Anne's Church Hall, the venue of September's two-day event.

Members of the beer committee were recently shown the facilities at LOROS's Groby Road hospice by senior fundraiser Adrian Walker and fundraising co-ordinator Abi Jarrom. The tour included a look at the hospice's complementary therapy rooms, the day therapy room, an arts and crafts room, the multi-faith chapel and the home assessment room where patients can learn techniques and experience new equipment to support them living in comfort at home.

The group also learned that LOROS has a specialist lymphoedema service for patients in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. Lymphoedema is a chronic swelling that can affect any part of the body. It often develops as a result of cancer surgery, but can develop for any reason when the fluid drainage system – the lymphatic

system – is struggling. This specialist service makes a huge difference in helping people control their symptoms and manage their condition. With the continuing support of Western Park's thirsty denizens, the beer festivals have raised £20,000 for local causes since 2015. Charities and organisations can now apply for support from 2018's fundraising.



Dec Police Update

Our 'Darker Nights' campaign aims to prevent an increase in burglaries over the winter by reminding residents to lock their homes and leave a light on. The winter nights make it easier for burglars to hide and empty and unlit houses are easier to spot. An operation is running to target and arrest those who are committing the offences and extra patrols are in place in key areas - both high visibility and plain clothed. We also want to encourage homeowners and businesses to review their security and take a few simple, cheap precautions to protect themselves. I'm hoping to get people to think about their home security before it's too late.

You can buy light timers and security lights cheaply at most DIY stores. Other burglary crime prevention advice includes; keep doors, windows and gates locked at all times and remove keys, put valuables and presents out of sight in a safe place, don't keep large quantities of cash or jewellery at home, use a door spy hole or door chain, don't leave packaging from expensive items outside your home. If you're going away, don't advertise it on social media and ask a neighbour or relative to collect post and open and close curtains while you are away. Finally register your belongings with www.immobilise.com

There has been a number of local patch walks across the Fosse. Westcotes and New Parks areas over the past month by Police and Partners, including council, housing and street cleansing departments. These identify local issues, graffiti, hazards and general refuse affecting specific areas. Please engage with those conducting these walks and make sure your issues are highlighted.

There are street consultations and community events listed on the Force website to provide more chances to engage with your Local Neighbourhood teams. To find these details look under the 'local policing' section of the Leicestershire Police website and look for your own area.

We have identified a number of cannabis grows across the area. These pose a significant fire hazard and potential health issues to the occupants and neighbours . If you have concerns or suspicions about any address please contact 101 or speak to your local Neighbourhood officer in complete confidence. Signs to look for include; Strong pungent smells, plastic sheeting, condensation, unexpected fan noises, irregular visits to a previously vacant premises, seeing large numbers of lighting, reflectors, extractors and grow bags.

A new Facebook page covering the 3 policing Neighbourhood areas - 'Fosse, The West End and New Parks Police' has now been launched and will include things of interest and issues we wish to highlight to the Community.
