### BRICKS FOR BRAUNSTONE GATE

Bricks for Braunstone Gate is a non profit project that uses plastic bottles containing compacted plastic bags and wrappers to use as bricks. They provide the inner basic structure and are covered in cement and used to make furniture, small walls and other outdoor structures.

Traci Howard is the local artist behind the project.

She says: "I first saw the idea of ecobricks on Facebook and thought what a brilliant idea it was and promptly began to put any piece of plastic or wrapper that was not able to be recycled, into empty 2 litre water bottles. It took a while to get used to washing the bags and making sure they were dry before putting them\_into the bottle, but



now it's second nature. I began compacting the contents with a spoon handle and was amazed at how much plastic fitted inside.

"After a few months I had about ten bottles and

decided I would look up where I could take them to but I soon realized that wasn't anywhere so I decided to do it myself".

At the end of last summer Traci went to the opening of the Bede Street Community Garden Project in Braunstone Gate, the community project aims to create a garden and space in one of the archways on Bede Street. Armed with a bottle and flyers she'd made; Traci proposed her idea. The volunteer loved the concept that part of the building work could use ecobricks.

On the last Saturday of every month and between 10-2 on Wednesday, members of the community, and anyone interested in helping, gets together and works on the project. All Traci needed now was to find a place where the public could drop their bottles off, which could then be taken to the arches. The manager of 96 degrees Cafe, a local coffee shop, offered to help.

Traci said: "The objective is to make us aware of our use of plastic and offer a solution to a very important environmental issue, whilst bringing the community together at the same time.

"As the project grows it would be great to see people take the initiative and start their own projects, like building benches and other structures in allotments and in local communal areas".

### Newfoundpool

This, one of the most unusual of Leicester's nineteenth century suburbs, will forever be associated with the name of Isaac Harrison, whose initial letters( IHARRISON) spell out the names of the streets between Pool Rd and Beatrice Road, for example Ingle, Hawthorn and Alma.

Harrison, a market gardener, bought the land at about the same time as the Leicester and Swannington Railway was being planned in the 1830's. He had started building a hydrotherapy centre on his newly acquired land with a view to creating a spa but the venture was doomed to failure. In time the family took up residence in Newfoundpool House (which was to become the Empire Hotel prior to becoming a 21st century supermarket). Isaac passed on the property to his nephew, another Isaac, and later to Beatrice.

Orson Wright, a local builder, bought the land off the Harrisons in 1885 and began building mainly two storey terraced houses with provision of a shop on every corner. The houses proved very popular. Before long there was a mounting demand for school places for the 500 or so children living in the area and Orson Wright sold the land where Inglehurst Junior School is now, to the newly established school board.



Surprisingly, Newfoundpool was not part of the city until 1891 when the city determined to extend its boundaries. The area quickly developed a strong sense of community. The old Fosse Cinema, replaced by Fosse Bingo and later Tesco, was a popular venue. Institutions, like the Newfoundpool Working Men's club and the local Neighbourhood Centre, still play vital roles in the social life of the area. These each, in their way, together with the local school provided a wide range of local activities from a lively debating society at the Working Men's Club in the 1950's to dance and theatre classes at the Neighbourhood Centre in more recent times.

To this day, Newfoundpool possesses a character of its own, still treasured by many long term residents. **Roger Blackmore** 

### 20mph Zone Update

The residents' consultation across Western Park should get underway later this year. Those within the 20mph zones should have already received a letter from Leicester City Council and Arcadis about the proposed traffic calming scheme. The two areas are; all roads between the Hinckley Road and Glenfield Road including Dovelands Primary School, and those between Glenfield Road and Aikman Avenue. Both areas stopping at Woodville Road but not including the main roads.

The area is beset by speeding, bad parking near the schools; causing terrible congestion and a particularly difficult crossing point for many pupils, pedestrians and cyclists at the junction near St Anne's church.

Residents want the traffic slowed down; they want ways of addressing the inconsiderate parking and safer streets for pedestrians and cyclists.

We are hopeful that the scheme should at least make a robust start to achieving these aims.

Please get in touch if you have questions that Traffic Action Group (TAG) may be able to help with - but most importantly; make sure that you let the City Council know your views through the consultation. Everyone living on the affected roads can give their views about the proposals.



### Feb Police Update

In January your local Fosse, Westcotes and New Parks team have assisted the national week of action led by the National Crime Agency (NCA) to disrupt criminals exporting drugs through children and other vulnerable people, otherwise known as 'County Lines'. This also includes targeting the practice of 'Cuckooing' where criminals take over the homes of vulnerable adults to store and move drugs using intimidation, control and violence.

The police have responded to this issue at a number of locations in the area by securing the support of the local community to provide evidence to then action drugs warrants and/or drug closure orders. This month a drugs warrant was completed at one address in Braunstone, numerous vulnerable addresses were visited in New Parks and two significant drugs arrests were made in the Narborough Road and Groby Road areas.

More great work was been completed on Operation Wham which runs regularly and involves high visibility and plain clothes operations to target criminals who use the roads to commit rime. Since the first operation, back in May 2018, 36 people have been arrested on suspicion of offences such as drug possession, burglary and driving offences.

Finally we continue to uncover cannabis factories in the area on the back of local concerns about unsafe properties. In the last month we have completed a drugs warrant at an address on Pickwell Close where one man was arrested who has since been deported for being in the country illegally. Another address on Mellor Road



has been searched with numerous cannabis plants recovered and enquiries ongoing. This work continued with the discovery of over 100 cannabis pants growing at a property on Tudor Road. This action takes funds out of the hands of serious organised criminals and also prevents potentially catastrophic fire risks.

### Tony Huxley's **Compost Corner**

#### No matter how grey and miserable February gets, it's now just a short wait till we see the colours of spring.

I've had my fill of pastel shades, so I was happy to hear that 2019 is predicted to see bolder colours being used in the garden. I thought I should check out what's available. Today I was working next to West Lodge Plant Nursery near Desborough and decided to spend my coffee break talking to the owner, Richard. It's great to find a well-stocked, independent nursery, that's not just ponds. In contrast, the foli-

the floral display for an overpriced tearoom.

As luck would have it, they'd just taken delivery of this season's herbaceous perennials. They arrive as young plants, then they are typically potted up and grown on before sale. However, for a short time, Richard sells some on at a discounted rate. It's an economical way of



buying plants, especially if you're able to pot them your garden.

up and grow them in an unheated greenhouse or cold frame for a month or two.

The most striking of the new arrivals was Heuchera "Peach Flambé". The leaves are a riot of burnt orange, which become a darker, peachy pink as the season progresses. Another example of bold foliage was Lobelia "Chocolate Truffle".

This perennial species has a rosette of bronze foliage that's topped by a spike of crimson flowers in the sum-Although extremely mer. hardy, it likes to be kept wellwatered; some people even grow it in the margins of age of Coreopsis "Bengal Tiger" is delicate and feathery, but in summer it dispenses with false modesty



and puts out a profusion of vibrant yellow flowers with red banded petals. Completing my herbaceous wish list is Geranium "Ballerina". A great ground-cover plant, especially in semi-shade, which stands out with the purple washed white flowers that have deepest purple veins.

So next time you visit the garden centre, be brave, think bold and put a little colour back in Tony Huxley
