WOODGATE SITE UPDATE

The Gazette's main story last month concerned the dangerous state of the derelict factory site opposite Repton Street in Woodgate.

The site, which is earmarked for development, has fallen into extreme disrepair with evidence of fly tipping, dumped furniture, arson and, according to witnesses, needles.

The Woodgate Residents Association remain frustrated with the situation as the area has also become a playground for local children due to easy access.



The Gazette approached Leicester City Council for comment, but the reply came too late to print in the last issue. A city council spokesman said: "The land is privately owned so it is their responsibility to secure the land to prevent access. We recently met the landowners on site and asked them to ensure that access points to the site are closed off to prevent people getting in and to stop fly tipping.

"There was no evidence of discarded needles at that point, but we have requested officers from our Enviro Crime team to revisit to see the current situation. If the site is no longer secure, we will be following this up with the landowners.

"We have met several times with the owners, potential developers and the Environment Agency to look at what would be needed for the site to be redeveloped. The main issue is the flood risk at the site. which would need to be assessed and measures put forward to address it as part of any proposed regeneration work."

Motorbikes On Our Parks

Many local residents have expressed concern over the number of motor cycles, mostly dirt bikes, being ridden recklessly across Western, Braunstone and Fosse Park.

The Western Park Traffic Action Group put together an action plan to help deal with what is now seen as an increasing danger to the safety of park users.

1. Report all issues to the police. If they are not reported, incidents will not be logged. If there is a risk of injury such as riding near or at people, sporting teams, near play areas or on access paths, ring 999. If bikes are present but not threatening please report using 101.

2. Give a description of rider; colour of clothes/helmet /bike and location/direction of travel. Entry and exit points and photos if possible.
3. Use the What3Words App which provides a 3 word code giving a location to pass onto police.

4. Photo evidence can be emailed to the duty officer on West Leicester - Beat 01 New Parks NWBeat01@leicestershire.pnn.police.uk

CCTV is helpful in identifying routes taken and a bid for additional CCTV has been submitted. Most important advice - In all incidents please make sure you remain safe yourselves.

MORE TREES FOR WESTERN PARK

Nearly 2000 new trees will have found a home in Western Park by March after the city council secured £139,665 from the Forestry Commission's Local Authority 'Treescapes' fund to plant 85 standard trees (3-4m in height) and 1.875 small trees.

This is welcome news following the potential loss of at least 108 trees, some 125 years old, due to disease. Cllr Piara Singh Clair, deputy city mayor responsible for parks, said: "This is good news for everyone who values Leicester's parks and open spaces.

"These new trees will be a welcome addition to Western Park... but they also represent

our commitment to planning for the future.

"In 25 years or so, these trees will have grown and matured – and will be enjoyed and treasured by future generations too."

All the new trees will be bedded during this year's planting season, which runs until March.

Tree canopy already covers around 1,200 hectares in Leicester, with the city council owning around 153,000 individual trees and around 109 hectares of woodland

Feb Police Update

Another busy few weeks across the area. On Braunstone, officers executed a search warrant on Winstanley Drive under the Misuse of Drugs Act. A small amount of cannabis was recovered, and the offender dealt with out of court – PS 2017 Nick Golden

Several beat surgeries have been held on N.P.E (New Parks Estate) and knife sweeps had been conducted over Stokeswood Park and surrounding areas. That week, several knives had been recovered by police on the streets of the N.P.E. Two cars, with no insurance, were also seized. – PS 181 Matt Hutton

A misuse of drugs act warrant was executed on Tewkesbury Street where two males were arrested for production of 104 cannabis plants. The drugs recovered had a street value of £72,800. The males have already pleaded guilty and are awaiting sentencing. A male was arrested for attempting to import an offensive weapon on Vaughan Street. Of note, the law changed on 14th July 2021 around possession of offensive weapons. It is now an offence to be in possession of items such as knuckle dusters, any kind of flick/gravity knives and zombie knives in private dwellings as well as in a public place. Two males were arrested for Immigration offences on Bosworth Street and six vehicles recovered for no insurance across the Fosse Ward.

Three men have been charged with drugs offences following the discovery of several cannabis plants at a business unit on Carlisle Street on the 27th of January.

Emiljo Bigaku, 22, of Bolton Road, along with Sali Dragodi, 23, and Erald Dragoti, 32, have all been charged with possession with intent to supply a controlled class B drug.

A male and female have been charged with multiple vehicle crime offences in Westcotes and have been sentenced at court. Police officers have executed a drugs warrant on a house located on the Westcotes, resulting in over 270 plants being found plus one male being arrested, charged for drugs offences and being remanded to court.

A 30 year old man from Fosse Lane has been jailed for 19 months after he threw a brick at a police officer. Jameel Chenia plead guilty to 3 counts of common assault, using violence to secure entry to a property; 9 counts of criminal damage; possession of cannabis; possession of Class A and assault occasioning actual bodily harm on a police officer.

A number of improvements to Bede Park such as lighting and CCTV are now underway and scheduled to last into spring time.

Finally, a series of cycle prevention events took place where over 40 D locks were given to bike owners and crime prevention advice was provided. This has proved to be really useful and received positive feedback from those who engaged – *PS* 1966 Anil Mehta

CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

This is a very busy time for gardeners, especially when preparing for the coming seasons.

I had to have a few fence panels repaired after a battering from the harsh winds. Now the fence is secured, it just needs repainting and re-wiring, then my climbing plants are ready to thrive in a secure environment in their growing season.

Now is a good time to prune plants such as clematis, the late flowering variety, also known as group 2 and 3. Group 2 requires a gentle prune, and they are characterised by large flowers during summer. Group 3 can withstand a much harder prune, they generally flower mid to late summer. Group 1 includes early flowering varieties such as Ar-



mandii and Montana, these should not be pruned now as we would remove the flowering stems. In addition, I'll be pruning back Mahonia, Winter Jasmine and bush and climbing roses.

It's also a good time to re-nourish your soil. I like to spread a mixture of well-rotted manure and

compost around my established shrubs and roses as well as a sprinkling of slow-release fertiliser. It's a good idea to give summer flowering bulbs head starts by growing them on indoors. I plant pots up with bulbs such as Liatris, Agapanthus and Lillies. I feed these regularly with tomato food, so they are nice and strong for when they are ready to plant out.

I'll also be dividing mature clumps of snowdrops, replanting at the same level and ensuring the white part is under the soil. This will enable more flowers next year as they won't be so congested. If you don't have any mature clumps to divide you can always plant snowdrops in the green to give you a better display next year. It's also a good time to remove any netting you might have installed to prevent leaves falling in your pond and then remove any plant debris, including any escaped leaves and duckweed to stop water pollution.

We all want to encourage more wildlife into our gardens, and I hope to install another bird box as, whilst cleaning an old one, I discovered it had become a little rotten. I will erect the new one in a sheltered spot with a northeast aspect. I'm also going to hang homemade fat balls in my roses and shrubs as this obviously feeds the birds and encourages them to pick at any pests that might be present on the shrubs.


