## LET THERE BE ROCK

A three-day live music event featuring 20 all-female bands will take place next month at venues around Leicester as part of International Women's Day.

The festival, which runs from March 8th to 10th, is organised by Leicester's Unglamorous Music project, which has sparked the creation of more than a dozen local all-female punk and garage bands



The project was the brainchild of Ruth Miller, who started it in 2022 with the aim of giving women in Leicester a chance to learn to play an instrument and start a band. Sadly, Ruth died in October last year as a result of

breast cancer at the age of only 61, but the women she brought together are carrying on her mission under the Unglamorous Music banner.

Rehearsals are well underway at Stay Free Music on Woodgate. Sophie Cottis-Allan from Leicester band Velvet Crisis said, as the band were warming up: "It's really a privilege to carry on the Unglam spirit with our International Women's Day music festival.

"Thanks to Ruth our Unglam bands have taken the Leicester music scene by storm over the last year or two and brought lots of people out to see live music again. And the movement is fostering a safe and supportive environment for people to do that and to enjoy going to gigs.

"The songs are fantastic, spirited and fun. And our bands have a lot to say. An Unglam gig is always a night to remember, I'll say that much!"

The Unglam International Women's Day events take place on Friday, March 8, at Firebug, Saturday, March 9 at The Donkey, and Sunday, March 10, at the Attenborough Arts Centre.

At the Sunday event people will have the chance to take part in an Unglam-style workshop where they can play instruments and see which ones they like.

Sophie continued: "We hope the Unglam International Women's Day events will encourage even more women to join us, pick up a guitar or drumsticks or mic and fulfil a dream of being in a band."

#### New College - Heritage School

New College Leicester has been awarded a prestigious national accreditation for our work in teaching local history. We are pleased to announce that we have been awarded Heritage School Status from Historic England.

The award recognises New College's ongoing commitment to teaching local history and working in partnership with local heritage organisations.

The award application was made by Head of Diversity at New College Leicester, Mr Haroon Mansoor. In his previous role as Head of History, Mr Mansoor consistently ensured local history was at the heart of the history curriculum and everything the school has done over the past five years.

Mr Mansoor comments: "At New College Leicester we have engaged with Historic England extensively through training and trips. We have a local History walking tour that Year 7 go on to bring local history to life and all students at New College start their history lessons by looking at the 'Story of Leicester' which took inspiration from the fantastic website produced by Leicester City Council. The topic looks at 2000 years of local history and even includes the building of New Parks and surrounding areas!"

"It is important that the students see that historic events took place in Leicester. History happened here, it is not something distant that we cannot relate to. The Romans were here as well as the Normans and Saxons. We made sure to include how Leicester has played its part in the history of Britain through the curriculum."

Historic England's Heritage Schools programme is part of a range of cultural education work funded by the Department for Education (DfE). Local Heritage Education Managers work with clusters of schools across the country to co-ordinate training, offer curriculum support and broker partnerships with local heritage providers.

Ismail Dale, Local Heritage Education Manager from Historic England comments: "The students speaking about what they have enjoyed learning about with local history was fantastic. The work at New College embodies everything the award is about."

#### HUGE FINES FOR LANDLORD

A landlord, based in Briton Street in the West End, with nearly 260 properties, allowed his tenants to live in unsafe conditions for nine months in spite of a warning from the city council.

Amarjit Singh Kullar, who trades as A & S Properties, breached two Emergency Prohibition Orders which had been put in place at flats he owned in Cavendish Road, Aylestone.

The council said it issued the EPOs in September 2021 following significant concerns and safety fears over the illegal extraction of electricity. As a result, National Grid had to disconnect the power supply to the homes. However, Kumar allowed his tenants to continue living in them, against the terms of the orders.

Kullar denied he had breached the Emergency Prohibition Orders, but was found guilty following a three-day trial at Northampton Magistrates' Court, which ended on February 13th. The court fined Kumar £10,000 for each of the two offences and ordered him to pay £21,587 costs and a £170 victim surcharge.

In December 2021 Kumar was also served with an Emergency Prohibition Order applying to a flat on Narborough Road, once again due to problems with the electrical supply, which he ignored. The National Grid was forced to disconnect the power, making the flat uninhabitable. Nevertheless, Kullar still let the tenants live there. He again denied the charge at a hearing at the magistrates' court in October 2023, but was found guilty of breaching the order following a two-day trial, and was brought back before the court for sentencing on Wednesday, December 6. On that occasion, he was fined £10,000, and ordered to pay £15,000 in costs, along with a £190 victim surcharge.

The city council introduced new licensing in Westcotes, Fosse, Braunstone Park and Rowley Fields, which required privately rented homes to be licensed to protect vulnerable tenants and improve the standards of private sector rented housing.

# CAREY'S COMPOST

As the winter chill fades and spring approaches, we gardeners eagerly anticipate the dynamic burst of colour that accompanies the summer months. To ensure a vibrant and flourishing garden, strategic planning and planting are key. Here are some ideas for flowers to sow and plant now for a colourful summer garden:

**Lavender** is a fragrant and versatile herb that thrives in the British climate if planted in well-drained soil and a sunny spot. Its purple blooms attract pollinators and add a beautiful hue to any garden.


