WOODGATE ROAD CLOSURES

Work continues throughout the summer on the £10.4 million FiveWays junction road improvements.

Blackbird Road will close southbound, towards Fosse Road North, from Ravensbridge Drive to Fiveways on 27 July.

Woodgate will close on 8th August from Balfour St to Fiveways eastbound, towards the city centre, and up to Marshall Street between 10th-25th August, westbound, away from the city centre.


Resurfacing work on Groby Road starts on 24 August and is due to be completed by 20th September

The work, which should be completed by next January, is designed to make it safer for all road users, including cyclists and pedestrians, and improve the busy bus routes in and out of the city.

Deputy City Mayor Adam Clarke said: "It is a major investment that will help ensure this busy and important part of the city's transport network is able to accommodate the predicted growth for decades to come."

The huge project aims to improve access by linking the city centre up with surrounding neighbourhoods. It will also develop new routes and crossings for e-bikes, public transport and pedestrians.



NEW HELP FOR TENANTS

Housing tenants can now report concerns about antisocial behaviour to a dedicated new team which has been set up to help.

A new Antisocial Behaviour Team has been launched by Leicester City Council's to make it easier for tenants to report issues, and to provide a specialist service aimed at investigating and resolving problems.

The team, based in the city centre, forms part of the council's community safety service and has close links with its crime and antisocial behaviour unit (CRASBU), along with the police and housing services.

Tenants will still be able to report antisocial behaviour to their housing officers, but cases will be investigated by the new dedicated antisocial behaviour team.

Leicester assistant city mayor for housing and neighbourhoods, Cllr Elly Cutkelvin, said: "...this team will make it easier to focus on resolving antisocial behaviour problems, while freeing up housing officers to support council tenants with other pressing housing issues."

Anyone with concerns about antisocial behaviour in their area can report it to their local housing officer or the new Antisocial Behaviour Team at communitysafety@leicester.gov.uk or on 0116 454 0250.







Project Hive is run by the WWCE, a group of local residents raising funds to redevelop the former Eco House into a community space.

We have recently signed the lease on a virgin double plot on the Rancliffe Allotments site. The plan is to have the community involved in the development and operation of this space through a variety of engagement events that will begin over the summer period and continue through all four seasons of the year. The goal of this new venture is to give us the opportunity to deliver some of the activities that we plan to offer once work on the Hive building is completed. July Police Update

PCs and PCSOs have been out with Fosse Councillors around the Tudor Rd area.

We've been showing them the number of cannabis grows which we have closed down, including those that have resulted in fires and keeping them up-to-date about the work being done to educate the public and landlords on what to look out for. In the same vein, the proactive stop searches have continued to identify those involved in drugs or weapons.

9 males aged between 16 and 32, were arrested on 5th July following a proactive operation targeting the supply of drugs in West Leicester.

The 32-vear-old was charged with drugs offences and possession of criminal property and a 23year-old was charged with driving offences. The other seven have been released on bail. More than £7,000 in cash, together with £5000 worth of cannabis and cocaine with a street value of £1.000 were recovered.

Officers also recovered two electric pushbikes and a lock knife. A stolen vehicle and an uninsured vehicle were also seized.

There have been spates of vehicle thefts in the area so I would encourage people to keep keys away from doors or letterboxes, in a secure place or in signal blocking pouches (Faraday pouch). There have been several reports of theft from vans across West Leicester. The vans are being targeted for power tools that have been left inside, so please don't leave any items of value inside any motor vehicle. If you must leave tools in a van overnight, mark them clearly with your name/company and address using paint pens and seal with a clear lacquer spray. Items that are clearly marked are less attractive to thieves and more difficult to sell on.

If anyone has any information in relation to any of the thefts or where the tools are being sold, please call 101 or anonymously to CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111

Fosse officers ruined the party after a car was stopped on Tudor Rd and all their balloons/ canisters were seized! The driver, who had been inhaling Nitrous Oxide "laughing gas", initially said he was making cream cakes... He wasn't laughing after being dealt with for offences.

On 27th June, two males were arrested by the Fosse Team, one for a recall to prison, and one for a public order offence. One car was seized for no insurance, which had links to previous burglary offences.

On June 17th police stopped a vehicle on Buckminster Road and a male was arrested for proceeds of crime due to having over £1000 in his possession. No vehicle license or insurance either, so the car was taken off the road too.

CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

There's still just about time to grow veggies from seed this month and I've been taking full advantage of this window of opportunity. July is the last month to sow carrot seeds. I've been sowing them very sparingly, in shallow drills. This reduces the risk of carrot fly, which becomes high risk if you must thin the seedlings out. July is also the last month in which you can sow dwarf French beans so that you can get a crop before the first frost sets in. They can be sown either in pots or straight into the ground and need regular watering. Radishes, on the other hand, can be sown until the end of August. They're great for kids to sow during the summer holidays as they provide a crop quickly, allowing them to eat healthy home grown snacks later in the year. I will sow them every two weeks to enable a constant availability. I will be sowing lettuce fortnightly too. I find sowing a combination of varieties produces more colourful and interesting salads. Loose leaf varieties can be harvested from six weeks and heart lettuce around ten weeks. I sow them straight into the ground and cover them with a layer of vermiculite, which lets in more light and seems to deter slugs

and snails. If they need thinning out, when they start growing, you can use this as micro salad and they taste delicious.

This year I'm trying something new: Pak choi, I have been reliably informed, if sown in fertile soil and well watered, should produce a good crop. We'll see!

For winter crops I have sown turnips and cabbages. The cabbages will be covered with netting to

deter pigeons and help to prevent cabbage white damage. I'm not sowing too many turnips, as they don't store well, but an added benefit is that you can also eat the greens (leaves) as well as the root. I've also thrown in a few beetroot seeds, as long as they are well watered, they should crop before the first frost too!

It seems strange to be mentioning frost whilst we are in the middle of summer, but planning ahead is key. The summer growing season could well be extended, but as with all weather predictions there are no guarantees, I'm just hoping for a bountiful crop.
