REVAMPING THE RALLY

Work has started to improve routes through the Fosse's Rally Park for walkers, wheelers and cyclists.

The city council secured £1.8 million from the Active Travel Fund to create new walking routes and cycle tracks through the Tudor Road park, as well as funding improvements to park entrances, more street furniture, new lighting and additional planting.

The aim is to create wider walking routes and segregated cycle tracks on existing routes that run through Rally Park.

Entrances to the park, at Tudor Road, Bonchurch Street, Richard III Road and onto Fosse Road North, will all be improved. New lighting columns will be installed, overgrown vegetation will be cut back to improve visibility and safety and new seating will be installed.

The area next to the park's historic train platform, which dates to the creation of West Bridge Station in 1840, will also be upgraded with new paving.

Access to the park will be improved, particularly for those going to and from the Castle Mead Academy, while new sealed-surface paths will replace the well-used but muddy routes surrounding the school. Seating, landscaping and new trees are also planned to enhance the route between Tudor Road and the school.

The improved cycle tracks through the park will also link directly to new dedicated cycle lanes on Fosse Road North.

Some Ash tree removal works are also being carried out due to dieback, but at least 24 new trees will be planted in more suitable locations within the park as part of the wider scheme.

Cllr Geoff Whittle, Assistant City Mayor for Environment and Transport, said: "Once complete, it will provide a much-improved link between Newfoundpool, Frog Island and the new Waterside neighbourhood for people on foot, on bikes or using wheelchairs or other mobility aids."

The overall programme of improvements on Rally Park is expected to take around 10 months to complete and will be carried out in phases to help minimise disruption.

I use that junction most days and I can tell you it's not better.



GENERAL ELECTION 2024

Liz Kendall easily retained her seat in Parliament to represent Leicester West, but it was all change across the rest of the city as Leicester East and South changed hands. Labour's Johnathon Ashworth was beaten by independent challenger Shockat Adam to the tune of nearly 1000 votes while Leicester East flipped from a once Labour stronghold to Conservative with Shivani Raja. Previous public issues with former Labour MPs Keith Vaz and Claudia Webb clearly effected the result as they polled 9,213 between them compared to Labour's 10,100 and the Conservatives 14,526.

In Leicester West with 74,102 registered voters the turnout was a low 48% down 5.2% on 2019.

Liz Kendall kept the seat for Labour with a 46.8% share and a vote of 15,798, down 4.7%. The Conservatives reached 7021, down 16.18%, mostly caused by the emergence of Reform UK who achieved 5,666 votes and a 11.5% share.



July Police Update

A man from Cambridge Street in Westcotes, who committed eight knifepoint robberies in the space of 24-hours, was jailed this month for a series of offences.

Between Thursday and Friday 12/13 October last year, multiple reports of robberies were received where victims were threatened with a knife and several mobile phones were stolen.

Some of the victims managed to track their phones which led officers to Bede Park where they found and searched 24-year-old Seye Djli who was found with five mobile phones, bank card and a knife. Following a check of his home address, officers found two more phones.

Djli pleaded guilty to six counts of robbery, two counts of attempted robbery and two counts of possession of a bladed weapon and was jailed for four years.

Another man has been arrested and charged with the murder of Junior Osbourn on Narborough Road on 27th September last year. 45year-old Clifford Alverez appeared in court on July 9th.

A man has appeared in court charged with the wounding with intent of another man following an incident in Fosse Road North on 8 July.

40-year-old Costel Remus Galoi, has also been charged with possession of an imitation firearm, (air pistol) possession of a knife, robbery of the victim, and two counts of assaulting an emergency worker.

A man from Harrow Road has been jailed for 8 years and placed on the Sex Offenders Register for life after his vulnerable 21-year-old victim disappeared overnight while waiting for a Taxi on Western Road. She had felt ill and was on the phone to the emergency services when Jagdeep Singh offered to help. She later managed to contact her parents and Singh was arrested shortly afterwards.

A 62-year-old man has been charged with drink -driving and has appeared in court after a 4-year -old boy was hit by a car Cranmer Street in Westcotes on 29th June.

The child was taken to hospital for treatment but his injuries are not thought to be life-threatening.

The summer school holidays have brought several reports of anti-social behaviour and young people setting fires.

These have been across western Leicester on our green spaces. Small fires have been set on Beatrice Road, Western Park and Belgrave Cemetery.

This is extremely serious, so officers across all beats will be targeting hotpots areas and liaising with partner agencies to tackle this issue.

CAREY'S COMPOST

In the summer months our gardens come alive with a variety of wildlife, offering a haven for numerous species. Garden enthusiasts can expect to see a wonderful mix of birds, insects, and small mammals enjoying the warmer weather and abundant food supply.

Birds are a prominent feature in our gardens. Common visitors include the robin, the blue tit, and the great tit, all known for their vibrant plumage and energetic behaviour. Blackbirds and sparrows are also frequent guests, often seen foraging for insects and seeds.

The melodic choruses of the song thrush and the goldfinch

add a charming soundtrack to any garden and you may even catch a glimpse of the juvenile Peregrines which have fledged from the Cathedral spire.

Insects play a crucial role in the garden ecosystem, particularly during the summer. Bumblebees and honeybees can be seen buzzing from flower to flower, pollinating their favourite plants such as



zinnias, asters and echinacea. Butterflies, such as the peacock, red admiral, and small tortoiseshell, bring a splash of colour, although I've seen far

fewer than previous years, possibly due to the heavy persistent rain?

Ladybirds and various species of beetles help control pests, while dragonflies and damselflies can often be spotted near ponds or water features.



Hedgehogs are a welcome sight and more likely to be seen during the summer as the nights are shorter leaving them less time to search for slugs, snails, and insects. They can be pregnant this time of year so the females still need a home in which to raise her hoglets. If you're lucky, you might even spot a fox passing through in the early morning or late evening and Muntjac deer have also been spotted in the Western Park area.

Additionally, amphibians like frogs and newts may be found in gardens with ponds, contributing to the biodiversity. Providing suitable habitats, such as bird feeders, insect hotels, and log piles, can encourage these creatures to visit and thrive in your garden, creating a vibrant and dynamic natural space right on your doorstep.
