

Leicester suffered more than most cities during the pandemic. Covid 19 took many lives and the extended lockdowns crippled the local economy. At one past midnight on Monday 19th July, England

entered Step 4 of the coronavirus recovery plan.

In the city, this meant that a throng of immortal young club goers were queuing up outside Club Republic, ready to party without masks from the stroke of midnight. Here in the West End, the bars shut and prepared for the following day.

It could have been the heatwave, the Monday morning blues, the July Fortnight or a combination of all of these, but "Freedom Day" came and went without a murmur.

Taking a walk around

Braunstone Gate, the number of patrons in the local bars could be counted on both hands.

Even for a humid Monday evening - it was very quiet. Tommy Coombs who owns the Metal Monocle said: "We've been busy at weekends since reopening but it tends to pick up after nine during the week. We've put



in a new stage for live bands, so that'll help". His main concern is the possibility of another lockdown:

"We will survive as we have an awesome following, but we'll, yet again, have to cancel all the live bands and won't know when to book them again".

Across the road, West End Brewerv owner. Josh Grav said: "The only changes we've really made are no more table service but no vertical drinking. Go to the bar, get your drink and sit



back down. Luckily our customers are quite sensible, so there won't be a problem". He added: "I'm trying not to think about further lockdowns. The last thing we need is another one, but if there is then we'll get through it like the last one and the one before that".

The Crows Nest (Cover pic) made some changes, the large marquee in the carpark is down, following Euro 20 but the outside seating, now with added bouncy castle, remain. It was quiet with small groups sitting outside enjoying the evening sun. Manager Ray Cooper has consistently tried to provide a safe environment for families as lockdown rules were relaxed but he remains optimistic about the future.



July Police Update

As the summer stretches ahead and many of us take our annual holiday, please remember to secure your home. Window locks, CCTV, alarms, light timers, can all help reduce the risk. If you live in a flat don't let anyone in you don't know, even if they say they are expected or know another resident - and don't let them follow you in. Changes to legislation brought about by the Offensive Weapons Act 2019 mean that it is now illegal to possess items like knuckledusters, throw-

Other sections of the act include an updated definition of flick knives to reflect changes in weapon designs, and the banning of private possession of flick knives and gravity knives.

ing stars and zombie knives, even in private.

The rest of the act will bring in new provisions for the control of goods sold online, as well as placing responsibility on delivery companies to conduct age verification at delivery stage. These are important developments that will help us to address the growing issue of online sale of knives. Knife crime remains a priority for Leicestershire Police and the additions to the legislation will support our officers to further tackle serious violent crime.

Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) is a term used to describe the manipulation or coercion of children and young people into committing crimes such as selling and storing drugs, carrying weapons and committing burglary, robbery or theft.

Currently, we are seeing children and young people, between the ages of 9 and 17, being used by criminals. If you think a child could be involved in this type of activity, you can contact Leicestershire Police on 101 or online. If you suspect a child is in immediate danger always call 999.

Six men from an organised drugs crime group, including three from New Parks and Braunstone have been taken off the streets and sentenced to more than 44 years in prison between them.

This follows a huge covert operation spanning two years which saw over 50 people arrested. 29 year old Benjamin Miller of Walpole Court, was sentenced to 6 years and 6 months, 39 year old Philip Warren from Hinckley Road, was jailed for 7 years and 6 months and 46 year old Richard Elton of Rancliffe Crescent was sentenced to 6 years and 6 months.

Two men were arrested in connection with a serious collision at the junction of Hinckley Road and New Parks Way on July 3rd at 11.30pm. The 25 year-old was arrested on suspicion of causing serious injury by dangerous driving and the 18-year old on suspicion of dangerous driving.

The collision involved a black VW Golf and a blue Nissan Micra. The driver of the Micra, a woman in her 20s, was hospitalised and is receiving treatment for her injuries.

CAREY'S COMPOST OF CORNER


I know we've had a lot of rain at the start of the month, but it can be deceiving how quickly water can evaporate, so please ensure ponds, bee baths and bird baths are topped up regularly. Fruit and veg plants should also be watered daily - this is when your water butt comes in handy as Severn Trent has requested we reduce the amount of mains water we are using.

If you're suffering with mosquito larvae in water containers, a couple of drops of washing up liquid affects the surface viscosity, which stops the survival of the larvae. If you haven't done so already it is also helpful to mulch your borders as this helps to retain moisture for your plants and reduces the amount of weeds that grow, at the expense of your prized flowers.

I've been picking off dead flower heads from my bedding plants and flowering perennials such as hardy geraniums and lupins. This promotes new growth and new flowers. It is a good time to prune back any deciduous Magnolia and reshape if necessary, whilst Wisteria should have the whippy new growth clipped back to about 5 leaf points from the main stem. I've also summer pruned my

espalier pear tree to try and retain its shape by removing any long new growths and dead or diseased branches.

In the vegetable garden I've been picking courgettes whilst they are young, which encourages more fruit production. I've also been pinching out tomato side shoots and removing any leaves below the first fruit truss. These actions help to concentrate energy to fruit production and im-



After this summer of football your lawn is probably looking a bit worse for wear so it's okay to give it another feed to green it up. If rain is not imminent after feeding it is best to water it in so that the grass doesn't become scorched. A word of warning - don't feed it after the end of August as new growth at that time can be susceptible to cold weather, pests and diseases. *Carey Tunstall*




