

The festival which is held along the banks of the River Soar, Castle Gardens, Bede Park and Western Boulevard is Leicester's biggest free event.



BRAUNSTONE HALL

During the past few years there have been numerous attempts to find new users for Braunstone Hall. Let us hope that current £2 million renovation plans bear fruit.

Over the centuries there were various owners of the manor of Braunstone including, for a time, the famous Hastings family. Ownership having passed to the Winstanley family at the time of the English Civil War, it was they who decided to build the current Braunstone Hall in 1776.

Interestingly the family decided to use a local Leicester builder, William Oldham, who worked using local Leicestershire brick and Swithland slates. This was remarkable at a time when the employment of London based architects and designers was all the rage. The famed walled garden became the family kitchen garden with its attendant fruit trees.

Faced with the need for new homes in the aftermath of the First World War, Leicester City Council cast its eyes on the Winstanley estate at Braunstone as a location for new housing and began to consider compulsory purchase. Eventually in the 1920's the Winstanleys agreed to sell. Houses were built on large swathes of the estate and

Braunstone Hall opened as a school in 1932.

During World War Two the Hall and its surrounds found several wartime uses including as a base for the local Home Guard. Trenches were dug for air raid protection and in February 1944 American troops arrived in preparation for the D Day landings.

Braunstone Hall continued to be used as a school right up to 1996. Inevitably in such historic surroundings legends of local ghosts began to appear. Frequent sightings were reported of a young girl called May who died of tuberculosis at the age of eighteen. It is not quite clear whether May was in service at



the Hall or a member of the Winstanley family.

Other stories are told of a ghostly horse drawn carriage clattering down the drive to the Hall.

So today the Grade Two listed building contemplates its future, standing at the centre of one of our City's largest parks. It certainly has an historic past.

The one thing that would significantly improve my experience would be the absence of traffic. If it weren't for the noise of the traffic passing, and the smell of the fumes, I would definitely be sitting outside.

Some shop owners seem to be under the impression that they would lose business if the street were pedestrianised. Yet evidence shows that people arriving by foot on average visit more businesses in a shopping district than people arriving by car.

Like the bar owners mentioned in your article, I think pedestrianisation would be good for local shops and businesses, good for promoting a community atmosphere, and have health benefits in getting people more active and improving air quality in the area (which I've read is atrocious). WESTERN PARK GOLF COURSE - UPDATE

At a Council meeting in January Western Park Golf Course received a stay of execution when many local councillors spoke out in support of keeping the course open. One by one they spoke of the benefits the course brings to the community and what a shame it would be to waste this asset without at least exploring every possible way of keeping it open.

Following this, a decision was made to delay rubber stamping the closure of the course and a motion (raised by Councillor Susan Barton) to "refer the decision back to the executive to allow further business plans to be considered" was unanimously backed by the whole Council. It was decided that there would be no deadline to this and business plans would be considered right up to the proposed closure at the end of October 2015.

The committee at Western Park Golf Course is now putting the finishing touches to a business plan that we hope will convince Sir Peter Soulsby to keep the course open. Key objectives are to remove the financial burden on the Council, to demonstrate a self-sustainable financial plan to allow the course to continue, to maintain the course as an asset of the people of Leicester.

In order to sway the decision of the Mayor we will require the backing of local councillors and the community. Whatever happens the course will be open until the end of October but we hope to keep it open for many years to come.

OPEN AIR SCHOOL PETITION

An online petition to prevent the demolition of a severely vandalised but historic West Leicester landmark has been launched.

The Western Park Open Air School in Western Park could eventually face demolition if nobody comes forward with a successful business proposal to use the buildings.

The school was built between 1928 and 1930 with the original aim of helping children and young people with complex medical issues and severe breathing problems. It was based on the assumption, that clean, fresh air and a well ventilated school could help treat TB and other respiratory conditions.

The school finally closed its doors in 2005 after nearly 75 years and has been boarded up ever since. The buildings have become the target of at least two arson attacks and regular vandalism in spite of beefed up security patrols. The site has fallen into disrepair and although buyers have been sought, planning permission has, so far, not been granted due to access problems in Western Park.

The school is a grade 2 listed building but if it becomes a danger to the public the Council may have no option but to demolish it. This month they are taking steps to remove asbestos which has been loosened due to deliberate damage. Vandals have even set fire to the asbestos warning signs in the buildings.

An online petition to save the buildings has been launched with the aim of persuading the council to preserve the buildings and turn them into a community asset. Suggestions from the website included: "It would be ideal to open this as a cafe as currently there are no facilities at the park, it could become a museum for education within the city". Jane Gambol. "...could perfectly house a gallery, craft shop, cafe, youth club and could provide a shot in the arm for rebuilding notions of community". Marco Scalotti.

City Mayor Sir Peter Soulsby says there is no realistic prospect of the council developing the site themselves but they are actively seeking an outside organisation with a sustainable plan for the buildings. To sign the petition search www.change.org



PADDLING THROUGH THE CITY

Now is the time to dip your oar in the waters of the River Soar as a new 27 mile canoe trail meanders its way through West Leicester.

Running from Trent Lock, near Long Eaton through to Narborough, the Canal and River Trust worked with British Canoeing to create the £12,000 trail which includes a range of access improvements on the river such as special platforms making it easier for canoes to be lowered into the water.

Canoeists say there are many attractions to paddling on the Soar such as the mix of rural and Victorian industrial landscapes and many backwaters as they paddle through St Margaret's or under St Augustine Rd bridge.

Andy Oughton, a member of the Trust's Central Shires waterway partner-

ship said: "There's something very special about canoeing on the River Soar, it's a great opportunity to see Leicester from a completely different perspective. This trail will enable more people to

do just that – making it easier and more appealing for them to head into the city and beyond".

June Police Update

SHARK WATCH with Sqt. Kev Sharkey This month has seen an Operation Tiger week of action in which several local addresses were searched and persons arrested for drug offences. Drugs, weapons, cash and stolen property have been recovered including a significant number of power tools believed to have been taken from van thefts in the area. These tools can be viewed online at www.leics.police.uk so please take a look and see if they are yours. This is an important part of our work which disrupts, prevents and detects crime in our community.

The Riverside Festival was well attended no doubt helped by the glorious sunny weather. It was good to see everyone using Bede Park and surrounding area in a hugely positive way. There were a few incidents of alcohol related disorder after the event closed each day and arrests were made accordingly. In response to the two previous knife related incidents, a patch walk was completed by Leicester City Council, park & city wardens, community safety, councillors, police and youth workers. The views of local people were also canvassed to improve the park for all users. We will look to be improve lighting & CCTV, clearing undergrowth, cleaning up graffiti and we will work with the city traffic wardens on Tarragon road for parking problems. The derelict school on Western Park has suffered from a spate of vandalism and has recently been discovered to be an asbestos risk. Western park police have raised this at the Joint Action Group with the city council to ensure better signage to warn of the dangers. The asbestos will shortly be removed by the council. We have also raised that the fencing needs improvements to stop young people from entering the grounds. Please ensure that you speak to your children to warn them of the dangers of going into the fenced off grounds of Western Park School.

Fosse ward held a health & wellbeing event along with Leicester Riders and Leicester Tigers as well as LCFC which was a great way to build links with the kids. About 75 kids attended in all which was followed a few days later by the Big Lunch event on the Rally park. This saw about 600 people come out and have a mass picnic in the sunshine and even saw the Lord Mayor come along to give his support.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

June is when gardens long to explode with incendiary colour. But in recent years gardeners and designers have lost their nerve, opting for safe pastel shades or monocolour beds of insipid blue or virginal white. Now garden pundits, and exhibitors at flower shows like Chelsea have, once again, decided it's ok to be bright and brash. It's also no longer a sin to use the Marmite of the designers palette, orange! So let's celebrate this often maligned colour and Tango our gardens.

Some of the most vibrant oranges are old favourites like marigolds. Forget those weedy mildew prone pot marigolds your Granny grew and try "Pacific Flame Beauty". Their two tone petals marry orange with Pacific Flame Beauty shades of lemon and red.



For more pizzazz try Gazania "Sunbathers" in borders or planters. Another old South African worth rediscovering is Kniphofia or Red Hot Poker. K. rooperi has a deep orange firework of a flower that adds height to the middle of a border. It'll grow in most spots that aren't waterlogged, but they can be a haven for snails that are partial to their flower buds.

For something even more exotic try canna lilies. There are dozens of cultivars to choose from, many with multi coloured and patterned flowers - how about the delicious "Orange Chocolate". But the orange crown should probably go to the Gerbera with cultivars like "Revolution Orange". Like Cannas this half hardy perennial will only survive the



mildest of winters but is well worth the effort of lifting and storing over the winter.

Hardier but no less beautiful are Alstroemeria. These clump forming perennials don't like having their roots disturbed, but do make great cut flowers. The variety "Orange Glory" would steal the show from those dull pastel shades we've grown too comfy with. Go on, embrace your inner orange this Summer. © Tony Huxley


