

Over the first weekend in June, thousands of people made their way to the banks of the River Soar to enjoy the 22nd Riverside Festival.


As always there was much to see and do including the Broken Records Swing Festival at Castle Gardens, in which visitors got into the groove with swing dancers, jazz performers and live music from local soul musicians including KGB Jazz, The Citizens of Swing, Gareth John and Groove and the Bathtub Pings, along with jazz bands from both the city's universities.

Bede Park was transformed into a funfair, while the banks of the River Soar came alive with a bustling street market, performers, and canoeing activities on the river itself, including scores of colourful narrow boats, boat rides and the traditional floating tea shop.

For the second year running, Art On The River gave local artists, painters and photographers the chance to display and sell their work along the riverside.

And for the first time, three special locally brewed riverside-themed ales were served at the festival.

Leicester deputy city mayor for culture and leisure Piara Singh Clair said: "We are blessed with the River Soar running through the city, providing us with the perfect location for fun on the water and the surrounding areas".

Janet Setchfield

Janet Setchfield's whole life was steeped in Labour politics from an early age. Her maternal grandmother was a founder member of the Labour League of Women back in 1906 and her parents, Rowland and Molly Hill, were both local Labour activists.

Janet grew up locally and went to Newarke Girls' School. She became very interested in domestic science which she went on to study at College. Her interest was such that she was able to build a career in this field, teaching cookery in various schools.

Her political career took off when she won her home ward of North Braunstone in 1970. She continued to hold the ward through good times and bad, until lost the seat to the Liberal Democrats in 1999.

In 1973 a major change in the system of local governments was introduced, with the city council becoming subordinate to the County - a system of which Janet did not approve! She continued to represent North Braunstone on both the City and County councils right up to the day unitary status was restored to the city in 1997.

In 1985 she became Lord Mayor of Leicester and capped this by later being elected Chairman of Leicestershire County Council. Throughout this period she grew to be an increasingly powerful figure in the West Leicester Labour Party.

Always interested in educational issues, she served on a wide range of education committees and relevant sub committees, and also school governing bodies. She also played a role in a range of local groups in the area including Leicester Playscape, off the Hinckley Road, which manufactured children's wooden play equipment.

Never afraid of controversy, she became involved in several left-right conflicts within her local party, a party to which she was fiercely loyal. Janet Setch-field was a powerful voice in her party for over thirty years.

ReFiesta is an entirely home-grown, Leicester-based and volunteer-run initiative, aiming to inspire positive behaviour change for a greener city and a cleaner planet, through local festivals and events.

Look out for us at the Western Park Festival, where we plan to offer a washing up service at the Croc 'n' Roll gazebo, which will be near the food vendors. We ask that you pay a deposit of £1, take a reusable plate and cutlery, go to the food stall of your choice to purchase your food. There will also be a supply of reusable plates at the food stalls, again for a £1 deposit. Enjoy your meal, whilst also basking in the knowledge that you are not creating more rubbish for landfill, then return the plate to the Croc 'n' Roll tent for washing up, and either get your deposit back, or you may, if you wish donate it to ReFiesta, to enable us to grow.



In addition to plates and cutlery we do a have small supply of reusable cups, however would recommend that you bring your own reusable cup/beer mug. Also please bring your own filled reusable water bottle.

There will also be orange recycle bags at the Croc 'n' Roll gazebo. So if you could please bring your festival recyclables to be disposed of, the Planet would be grateful.


DIGGING INTO THE PAST

This summer, help celebrate a rich and fascinating heritage. Explore the archaeology of our area, watch experts at work and experience the excitement of archaeology with have-a-go events.

On Saturday 29th June the Leicestershire and Rutland Festival of Archaeology, the UK's biggest archaeology festival, begins with over 80 events

planned throughout July.

The Festival has something for everyone, with family friendly activities at museums, guided walks of our counties' historic sites, talks by experts, displays and exhibitions, and chances to get your hands dirty with a bit of excavation.

TRAFFIC ACTION

Since 2016 the Traffic Action Group (TAG) has tried to relate residents concerns regarding our local traffic issues To the City Council.

Speeding, congestion, school parking, traffic volumes, rat running, HGV's, motorbikes and unsafe

crossing points are on our agenda.

Community surveys and consultations all raise these issues many times over. The traffic survey, by the consultants, Arcadis, has been used only to look at the average speeds over a two week period in June last year. No account has been taken of the peak speeds or volumes through our residential roads. This limited data has been used in the design of the scheme and it would appear that all our other concerns and data, including Community Speed Watch, has not been taken into consideration.

We hear that the scheme has been passed to the City Major for approval but we don't know when the

final consultation will begin.

TAG has requested, since March, that either Arcadis or the Highways Department should be updating the local community with revised time scales for this project. Sadly this hasn't happened, and hence this article. Therefore, we encourage you to contact the City Highways department for further information.

OVER HILLS & DOWN DALES

I love riding my bike, a lot. Some days it's the best thing in the world, others less so, but I've never been for a bike ride and regretted it. What could be better than riding my bike for 10 consecutive days? Well, doing it on a bike I built from scratch and for an awesome charity might do it.

Rewind to January and I'm sat in a bunk room, on my own, in deepest, darkest Kent; working on learning to build bike frames. A post pops up on my Instagram and I learn about the GB Duro 2019. This is an unsupported bike race from Lands' End to John O'Groats in June. 2000km of on & off road racing, totally under my own power, carrying all my own kit; through some of the finest landscapes the UK has to offer. This year's route links some of Britain's wildest places with its rich industrial past, taking in the Brecon beacons in Wales, through the middle of Manchester and up the middle of the dales and the length of Scotland.

Since this is a fairly large challenge, 200km a day for 10 days, I figured I'd try and do something good with it. I've been lucky enough to help the Big Difference Company out with a bid for some bikes for their green initiative and have got to learn about the amazing work that they do. Essentially, these guys bring us the comedy festival every year, and spend the rest of the year working with all kinds of groups of people to do good through laughter.

After filling out a form detailing why I wanted to do the race, what my ethos on adventure racing was, what I'd do if I had to accept help and was technically DQ'd (I'd carry on to the finish, there's a party and I don't get out much), I sent off my application. I assumed that since only 40 people were being selected (20 male, 20 female) I was in with no chance. But two weeks later I was told I had 48 hours to pay for my place.

I am a fully qualified frame builder and bike mechanic so I set about designing and building my perfect adventure bike, a hybrid road/ mountain bike designed to be quick over tarmac and comfy over rough terrain. Crafting the perfect frame is about buildsomething makes you smile every time you ride it, making you want to ride more.



So now all that is left is to complete my epic adventure and hopefully raise some money for a great charity as well. Follow me on Facebook. Twitter and Instagram (search alfano frameworks) and wish me luck! Pete Alfarno

Please view our Facebook account "Fosse, The West End and New Parks Police" to find a video of your local officers enforcing a drug warrant at an address on Luther Street. More than 150 cannabis plants were recovered and two men were arrested who later pleaded guilty to cannabis cultivation. This has taken drug money out of the hands of serious organised criminals and prevented another potential fire where electricity had dangerously been bypassed!

As well as asking local people to report any suspicions, we are asking local landlords and property management agents to take a closer eye on their properties to try and prevent cannabis factories from being set up. Signs to look out for are windows being blacked out, a pungent smell or sudden fluctuations in electricity usage.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

They say you learn something new every day, except for Thursdays - but maybe that's just me? Recently, a friend asked me to smell his Iris... Once I'd been assured he meant his plant, and not an elderly relative or something even worse, I did as requested.

I've always believed that Iris are a great addition to most gardens. But I'm ashamed to say that when it comes to scent, I usually think of I.foetidissima, the Stinking Iris. A great plant for deep shade, but as the name implies, its fragrance isn't one you'd call attractive, unless



you're a blue bottle! But the Iris in question was an heirloom variety called Caprice and its scent was heady and sweet. Although not as garish or as tall as some bearded Iris, its violet blooms are still attractive and would make a great addition to more subtle or cottage garden planting schemes.

Iris graminea is another understated plant, its purple blooms often hidden by its foliage, it is

blessed with a fabulous plummy scent. It will happily form neat dense clumps in most dry sunny positions. The scent of *Iris unguicularis* is also overlooked while gardeners focus on the fact that it flowers throughout the



winter. It's particularly prized for flower arranging and has colours ranging from deep violet to white. Bad weather can easily damage the blooms, so it's best planted in a sheltered but sunny spot.

But if you wanted both scent and the flamboyant blooms of a bearded iris then you're in luck. There are dozens of varieties to choose. From the red-

violet of "Aaron's Dagger", to yellow and raspberry ripple of "Ziggy" – fragrant varieties range from white to black with nearly all colour combinations in between, and a variety of scents to match.



So next time you see a display of Iris, you may want to stick your nose in

there. You never know, you may find out that it belongs? *Tony Huxley*
