



HOMES GET GO-AHEAD

Councillors have approved plans to build twenty new eco-friendly homes on Western Park's Hinckley Road car park.

There were fifty-eight objections to the scheme for two two-bed homes, twelve three-beds and six four-beds homes. Objectors cite potential problems including the loss of park land, car parking, increased traffic, and potential harm to wildlife.

Those in favour of the plans say the site, which is next to the old Eco-House, has been derelict for several years and has become a magnet for vandalism, arson and anti-social behaviour.

The success of the planning application also means the Constance Jackson Centre site, Parkfield (old Environ offices) and the former Fosse Riders base will be demolished to make way for the new estate.

Developer Naresh Parmar, who has already taken on large run-down council properties, including Winstanley House and the City Rooms, says: "Our intention is to create a sustainable housing development in keeping with the parkland that surrounds it. And to show other developers that these kinds of projects are possible."

To this end Butcher Bayley Architects have been appointed to ensure the successful planning of minimally invasive Passivhaus style homes. These are houses built to ultra-energy efficient design stand-


ards so that they maintain an almost constant temperature, with minimum power requirements.

Speaking about the project Director Carrie Bayley said: "It's very much about enhancing the parkland setting. This project is an amazing opportunity to showcase the potential of Passivhaus-principled design in Leicester and across this region."

Planning permission was granted in 2022 to convert the severely damaged former open air school, further inside the park, into individual offices spaces and a café.

It is the hope that the new offices, housing and the proposed community hub, based at the Eco-House, will make Western Park a more pleasant and safer place to visit.



Robert Hall Church History Project

Robert Hall Memorial Baptist Church stands proud on the corner of Narborough and Upperton Roads. Built in 1901 alongside many of the local residences, it has long been a significant player in the development of the neighbourhood.

A church and community history project has recently been launched focusing on the story of the church in the context of the surrounding community. Several studies are being created including a demographic study 1902-1906 of the original members, an oral history project, and research into archival and newspaper records.

Regular events with expert speakers are under way along with Tea & Cake afternoons for encouraging memory sharing. The project will end in late 2026 with a celebration of the 125 years of church and community and the publication of a historical

account which will include the stories of the local people alongside the historical research.

Opportunities for volunteering in every aspect of the project are now available offering free training in the necessary skills. Additional volunteering roles include publicity, events, photography, and administration. This is a great way of making new friends and meeting up with old ones.

March Police Update

Following an intelligence gathering operation we knocked a door and found approximately 100 cannabis plants inside a Westcotes house. These have been destroyed along with the growing equipment and we have increased our picture of what is happening and where.

We have been attending locations that our residents have reported are hotspots for drug users and dealers and we are keeping a strong police presence to further disrupt their activities.

The stop searches have also resulted in cannabis being seized from a male who has been charged with the offence.

Every day is different for the Neighbourhood Policing teams. On one particular day in March the Fosse team patrolled hot spot locations linked to drug dealing and use. We held consultations along Mostyn Street where residents were signed up to Neighbourhood Link.

Colleagues located two males who had reportedly been seen trying door handles near Glenfield Road. After a search, they were later found out not to be the suspects and the caller was updated with the outcome. If you see anything suspicious where you live, please report it via 101. The sooner a potential crime is reported. the sooner we can conduct enquiries to identify those involved.

Also on the same day, enquires were conducted relating to ASB around Fosse Road North and we'll be moving ahead with the landlord and the council to reduce the issues occurring here.

The following day we were out in Woodgate speaking with residents on Bonchurch Street and the surrounding area after concerns were raised about road safety Issues in the area. We look to gather information about specific issues. how often and what times they occur so that we can decide on the best route of action to deal with offenders.

Whilst taking a stroll through the Western Ward officers noticed that the theme of the week appeared to be dumped motorbikes. We identified the owner of one abandoned/stolen bike who will be contacted. Please secure your expensive motorbike as best you can.

Staying on the transport theme, The Braunstone Beat Team has continued to issue warnings to electric scooter users, meanwhile PC 406 Gandwan along with Western Beat colleagues were out and about stopping and educating people around E-scooters. During this time, they stopped 11 people riding electric scooters. These machines are illegal to use on public roads and pavements in Leicester as the city and county are not in the trial areas. If you are unsure of the legislation around electric scooters please reach out to the team.
