

Have you ever sat on a Dryad? No, it's not creature from Lord of the Rings or Harry Potter, it's a valuable piece of furniture and you may have one hidden at home.

## Delights of Dryad

On a recent visit to the recently opened National Trust property at Stoneywell Cottage in the heart of Charnwood Forest our guide pointed out a Dryad cane chair.

In a cottage so reflective of the Arts and Crafts movement this is hardly surprising since the Leicester company of Dryad was, at one time, known all over the world both for its manufacture of cane furniture and production of craft materials.

Dryad Furniture was originally established in 1907 in premises on Belvoir Street


by Benjamin Fletcher and Harry Peach. Fletcher was the Principal of Leicester School of Art and Peach originally a bookseller specializing in rare books. Within a few years the new company was employing fifty people and by 1911 the firm had to

move to new larger premises in St Nicholas Street. By the outbreak of the First World War in 1914, Dryad was employing nearly 200 people.

During the war Dryad supplied a wide variety of cane offcuts for encouraging the use of craft work as occupational therapy for wounded soldiers, a development which led to the establishment of Dryad Handicrafts in 1918. In 1915 Harry Peach was also one of the founders of the Design and Industries Association.

Dryad developed its businesses all over the world including supplies of craft materials for both educational and commercial use. Interestingly, Dryad cane chairs, being lightweight, were used as the principal seating in the first passenger aircraft as these developed in the years after the war. Mail order business also developed with the Leicester based company sending its products all over the world to as far afield as Japan and South America. By the 1930.s Dryad had become the biggest supplier of craft materials in the world. A second London showroom had been set up in 1928.

In 1972 Dryad of Leicester was acquired by Reeves and Sons but the name Dryad still lives on. Perhaps its time to check whether you have one of their cane chairs in your attic or garden shed! © Roger Blackmore

Imagine my perplexed face then, when I got my polling card and it indicated I would have to head off to the foreign world of Wyngate Drive if I wanted to vote in person. Our polling station has moved. For some reason it is deemed not sensible to put the polling station within walking distance of a house but it now necessitates a car journey. We could have walked, admittedly, but it's quite a long way and it was the same day as our small person's swimming lessons. #### BRAUNSTONE GATE FACELIFT

Leicester City Council is planning to give Braunstone Gate a facelift. They hope to promote a continental café style environment by making the road more cyclist and pedestrian friendly.

The council in partnership with Sustrans, a charity aiming to convince people to travel by foot, bike or public transport, are talking to businesses, pedestrians and residents on Braunstone Gate.

Business owners raised concerns at a "Braunstone Gate - Places for People" meeting, held in March, over the proposals. These included worries over the lack of short stay parking for out of town customers and a potential fall in trade due to a drop of drive-by customers should the area be totally pedestrianised. Some felt clientele would be discouraged by the lack of parking. Bar owners were more positive, hoping that improved pedestrianisation would make the area a more attractive place to visit by creating space for outside tables and chairs.

Val Smalley from the West End Traders Association said: "Café culture? Which two days of the year are they thinking of doing it? When did we last have a long spell of warm weather in Braunstone Gate?"

Other suggestions included making the street one lane - one-way and converting the rest to pedestrian areas, changing the arrangement of the parking spaces, dropping curbs and making the whole street 'shared space' for cars, people on bikes and pedestrians similar to Jubilee Square.



Andrea Cooper from Vickers Florist didn't mince her words: "There's not enough people around here to pedestrianise it. I'm not anti but why don't they just close it (to traffic) at night? I don't want this during the day. If it becomes all pedestrianised, that's us done. It's ridiculous".

Charlotte Jones from Sustrans said in an email to traders: "I will be contacting other businesses, residents and street users, to introduce them to the project. I'm also doing lots of research on similar street design projects, so that I can bring lots of examples and ideas from other cities, including solutions to parking issues".

## May Police Update

SHARK ATTACK with Sgt. Kev Sharkey

On 22/4/15 local officers out on patrol found a completely naked man in the street on Harrow Road. The officers were initially concerned for the man's well-being but on speaking to him it was quickly established that the man was very aggressive. He was arrested and subsequently charged with indecent exposure.

On 24/4/15 a warrant was executed at an address on Beatrice road. A cannabis grow was found and a 49 year old woman and a 41 year old male were arrested and later released on Police bail pending further enquiries. We will continue to proactively target people involved in drugs which can bring a lot of harm to the community.

On Thursday 30/4/15 there was a disturbance between two groups of males on Tarragon Road which moved onto Bede Park in which one male received multiple injuries from a knife. The injured man is recovering in hospital and the investigating officer DS Cairns is appealing for witnesses to come forward. Were you in the park between 6.30pm and 9.30pm? Did you see a number of people congregating in the park that evening? Did you witness the disturbance? If you can help, then please call on 101 and quote incident 656 of the 30<sup>th</sup> April. Our current focus is on incidents of thefts from vehicles which are being targeted by two different methods overnight; firstly by being broken into by the window being smashed and property taken and secondly, Peugeot 206 vehicles in particular are having the door locks removed to gain entry and property taken. Our patrols and enquiries continue to target and disrupt the persons responsible but I would encourage all vehicle owners to be vigilant and not to leave any property in their vehicles, even loose change which has often been the target of these attacks. It is worth noting that none of the attacked vehicles were fitted with an alarm and owners should consider fitting an alarm to their vehicles to deter these offences and to prevent the cost and inconvenience of replacing windows and doors, sometimes more than once.

Lastly, an address on Henton Road has been identified as the focal point of a series of antisocial behaviour incidents recently and we will be working closely with the Leicester Anti-Social Behaviour Unit to resolve this problem.

assets but let's be honest, great gardens don't really rank among them. I love the University of Leicester Botanical Gardens and would thoroughly recommend it, but it's not a Wisley or Great Dixter, both stunning gardens and well worth a visit. Abbey Park is the green jewel in the city's crown but it's more a pleasant open space than a magnet for horticultural tourists. The great stately homes are so far away from the city centre they're practically falling into other counties, in fact I think several have.

So where should we flock to, to see an amazing floral display? It turns out, we might not need to go far at all. Recently, Japanese tourists have discovered our farmland turns a bright and sulphurous yellow in early summer and they've gone absolutely mad for it. Yes, the big draw is the annual oilseed rape crop, and now there are even organised tours to accommodate enthusiastic camera clicking hordes.

The oilseed crop divides opinion more clearly

than Marmite. My son loathes the smell and makes me close the car windows and turn off the air-con whenever he sees it. There are also deluded hay-fever sufferers who curse it, even though the pollen is too heavy to be blown by the wind - it needs millions of appreciative bees to help it along.

I think it's a natural wonder when massive swathes of countryside change colour almost overnight. And rapeseed oil has better cooking properties than olive oil, with lower fat too! In the 19th century it was grown to lubricate steam engines.

The agricultural palette isn't limited to yellow. Watch out for sky-blue squares of linseed, or the deeper hues of borage that produces starflower oil. So why not drive out


