Tin Annie Reborn

Over 120 local people crowded into the newly rebuilt St Anne's Hall on Letchworth Road to witness the official opening of the £380,000 project.

The huge nine month scheme was undertaken by local builder Paul Kilgannon (Left pic with Rev'd Stephen Burnham) from Henderson's and a team of contractors with the aim of constructing a future proof, state-of-the art community venue.

Once known as Tin Annie, due to its corrugated iron construction, the original 100 year old building had fallen into disrepair. Local people, along with the Diocese of Leicester, voluntarily raised the funds needed to build a modern community hall.

The official grand opening and ribbon-cutting ceremony on May 6th provided the opportunity for local people to meet up, take a look around the new hall and celebrate a considerable achievement with music, maypole dancing and a buffet.

Councillor Susan Barton (Right pic) said she was honoured to be asked to cut the ribbon and believed the new community hall would last at least as long as the original Tin Annie.

After the ribbon cutting, St Anne's Vicar, Stephen Burnham, and the Archdeacon of Leicester, Dr Tim Stratford, led short services of thanks.

Freda Hussein - A Life Well Lived

It is just over a year since the death of Freda Hussein, former Principal of Moat Community College and former High Sheriff of Leicestershire.

Freda Hussein was born in Lahore in 1947, studied zoology at Manchester University and went on to become one of the most celebrated head teachers in our city.

She first came to Leicester in 1979 when she secured the post of Head of Physics at Sir Jonathan North Community College in Knighton. In 1991 she became Principal of Moat Community a post in which she achieved considerable distinction, so much so that some years later she was awarded an MBE for services to Education. In 2005, Ofsted described the work of the college as outstanding.



It was from 2004 to 2005 that Freda served as High Sheriff, attending a wide variety of functions all over the city and county. In 2006 she was appointed Deputy Lieutenant of the county, and a couple of years later was awarded an Honorary degree by the University of Leicester.

Freda also became involved in numerous community activities, serving on a range of local organizations including the Leicestershire Economic Partnership. She also took a particular interest in the Special Olympics which proved such a success when held in Leicester.

Through a number of activities Freda, together with her husband, sought to promote inter-cultural understanding, believing this was key to harmonious relations in a modern society.

After an illness lasting several years Freda Hussein passed away in April of last year. In a tribute to her, City Mayor, Sir Peter Soulsby described her as "a remarkable woman who was quickwitted, warm and generous".

She left behind her, her husband Asaf, who was always very supportive of her work and also a daughter and granddaughter. She will also be fondly remembered by the many pupils who benefited from her educational work and teaching.

Park Buildings-Decision Near

A LOCAL developer and community group could be working in partnership to revive land and empty buildings on Western Park.

Leicester City Council announced that two bids have been short listed for the purchase and redevelopment of two areas of land on Western Park which, between them, contain the former openair school, and the Eco House.

The council put the land and buildings up for sale in June last year, with the aim of finding a buyer

who would bring the sites back into use while respecting their history.

The buildings have stood empty for a number of years, and would need extensive refurbishment and partial rebuilding to be brought back to life.

One of the bids is from Leicester company Parmar Properties and Western Ward Community Enterprise (WWCE) and the other is solely from Parmar Properties.

Parmar Properties have successfully refurbished a number of historic buildings in the city including

tree and stump removal | tree pruning | planting | hedge

the City Rooms on Hotel Street and promise to prioritise the refurbishment of the Grade II listed former school, transforming it into eight individual office spaces for let or for sale. They would then develop 20 two-storey houses on the other, bigger site – four of which would be affordable housing – and redevelop the Eco House for use as their own private offices.

Under the joint bid with Western Ward Community Enterprise, they would lease the Eco House to the community group on a 999-year lease, for a peppercorn rent.

WWCE would be responsible for raising funding to refurbish the Eco House. The building would be used for a variety of community purposes, including providing a base for the Western Park Freeriders, a group of volunteers who run the BMX and mountain bike track on the park.

WWCE Chair Person Anna McAuley said: "This is a wonderful opportunity for the people of the Western Ward. We are delighted to be one of the final two bids and hope that we can provide the necessary details to secure the joint business model with Palmer Properties as the winning bid!"

As part of this proposal, WWCE would also be given a 999-year lease for a detached classroom building at the southern end of the park site, from which they would operate a community café.





May Police Update

Earlier this month we supported our city centre colleagues with the Royal visit by both The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh who attended Leicester Cathedral for the Maundy Service. A number of officers from West Leicester were involved in lining the streets, assisting with crowd control and ensuring the event passed safely. There were no reported incidents and we received words of thanks from Lady Gretton, HM Lord-Lieutenant of Leicestershire for our efforts on the day.

We have had nine burglaries in the last month so we are urging residents to be cautious with securing their properties, as some of the burglaries have been committed after doors have been left unlocked. It is also common place during the warmer months that windows are left open and as such it adds to the potential for any opportunists in the area to break in. Once again we urge you to ensure that you windows and doors are locked. It is also important to remove the key from the back of the door, especially if there is a pane of glass next to it. If you see any suspicious behaviour then we encourage you to report it.

At around 01:00hrs on Sunday 2nd April we received the report of a Robbery on Tudor Road. The victim, who was near the STA coffee shop, when he was approached by two men who demanded his phone, wallet and watch, then assaulted him by kicking and punching him in the head. We were given a direction that they had run away in and officers began searching the area. A group of males were spotted near to King Richards Road, who promptly ran away. A male was detained who matched the description given by the victim and was promptly arrested. He remains on bail for this incident. We are still trying to identify a second suspect who is described as having a light complexion, in his late teens and around 5ft 6ins tall. 
Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

It's been funny old weather so far this year. With the mild winter everything

has come through weeks early. And while trying not to constantly bang the climate change drum; there are real and important consequences for domestic and commercial gardeners.

In the UK early spring harvests have meant a clash with foreign imports that Supermarkets had ordered months in advance. In the short term this glut has led to dramatic price reductions. But a 40p cauliflower today may mean a £1.40 cauliflower later in the season when there are no more available to harvest.

But the most immediate and visual problem I've encountered in the garden is frost damage. Today I noticed the frost had killed the new growth on a neighbour's Castor oil plant, Fatsia japonica, more effectively than a flame thrower could! The mild winter has caused



You may also see black spotting on evergreen plants like Camellia and Garrya. Fortunately most perennials should survive. When the threat of further frosts subsides, cut out dead sections back to undamaged growth. Left in place, they could be the source of fungal infection. Apply a general fertilizer to encourage strong new

growth. Even tender plants like canna and dahlia can recover from frost damage with a bit of TLC.

Unfortunately many soft fruit crops will have been lost. Some damaged fruit plants may recover enough to give a smaller, later crop, but don't expect to be stocking the larder with homemade jam this autumn. Grapevines seem to have been hit particularly hard so it could be a very tough year for domestic wine producers and those hardy souls who make their blackberry wine in plastic buckets at home.
