

MURAL TO BE OVERPAINTED

It took a month for London based artist Richard Wilson to paint, but it will take only hours to cover up after the new owner of the former Mark's Electrical showroom building on King Richard's Road decided to redeveloped the site into flats.

The Kate Street mural, which attracted world wide attention when it was completed to celebrate the Foxes winning the Premier League title in 2016, is set to be painted over, but that may not be the end of the iconic work.

Developer Steven Levy and Mark Smithson from Mark's Electrical have agreed to pay the artist to repaint the mural in a more prominent position closer to the Leicester City grounds.

Forest Walks Festival

Our County has become famed for its various festivals in recent years. For instance the Leicester Comedy Festival has developed an international reputation. Our Riverside Festival has grown from relatively humble beginnings to become an ever popular summer event.

More recently the National Forest Walking Festival, part of which covers Leicestershire, was established 12 years ago (www.nationalforest.org) and now sponsors some hundred different walks under its auspices in May of each year.

Last year Hilary and I enjoyed several outings during the Festival period starting with a two and a half mile tree walk at Calke Abbey sponsored by the National Trust. The Trust also arranged an interesting walk around the gardens and woodlands at Stoneywell Cottage near Markfield, the former summer residence of the Gimson family.

(We also, independently, completed a walk from Ratby Burroughs and a three mile circuit of Thornton Reservoir, as a personal acknowledgement of this walking festival).



Walks vary in length from 10 miles to one mile Health Walks. This year they include several walks over the hills of Charnwood Forest and a number in the Bradgate area. Nordic Walking is also the focus of quite a number of walks this year, frequently with training for beginners. Another popular local walk which takes place every year is the farm walk from Achille Wood near Packington featuring bison on the route.

A couple of years ago we enjoyed a historical walk around Whitwick organized by the local history group. Another regular favourite is the walk from Thringstone, featuring a visit to the ruins of Grace Dieu Priory.

Walking Festivals have gained in popularity in recent years with some like the Isle of Wight Festival growing in size and scope year by year. The NF walking festival is worthy of support by the walkers of Leicestershire.

Colour powders were handed out free of charge to people arriving at Holi and people who then wanted extra paint powders had to pay a small charge.


A total of more than 60 kilograms of paint powder was handed out at the Holi festival.

May Police Update

Your local beat teams have been very busy in the past month leading to a number of enforcement warrants linked to drug activity. This has been based on valuable community information given to us by local people! Targeting drug activity has a big impact on reducing subsequent violence as well as anti-social behaviour

linked to drug dealing in public places.

A Misuse of Drugs Act warrant was executed at a property in Paton Street where seven men were arrested on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of class A drugs. Detective Inspector Richard Hiom said: "The community provided us with valuable information to allow this work to go ahead so I would like to thank those that came forward with information".

In another case; more than 100 cannabis plants have been recovered and three people have been arrested after officers executed a warrant on Ruby Street. Again this was based on information passed to police from members of the community that there may be a cannabis grow inside a disused commercial premises.

Finally Operation Lionheart has been targeting activity known as county lines, which is the movement of drugs in and out of Leicestershire. Over 130 drug search warrants have been completed across the county leading to multiple arrests and charges for those involved in supplying class A drugs. A 33-year-old man has been charged after firearms officers were deployed to Western Park on April 29th.

The charges relate to an incident following a report of a man seen with a sword.

Igors Jefremovs, of no fixed address, has been charged with one count of possession of a bladed article in a public place and one count of possession of a class B drug.

Officers recovered a lock knife at the scene and It was established the sword was a plastic toy.

In other news the Leicestershire Police website has a brand new crime prevention information page. Follow the link from the home page of the website to find a whole host of crime prevention advice from industry specialists and police officers as to how you can prevent your chances of becoming a victim of crime. You can also report crime, road traffic incidents and anti-social behaviour on the website.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

After Tony Huxley's inspired look at the many surprising horticultural uses for baking soda last month, I thought I would investigate 'gardening hacks'.

Simple off the wall ideas to make gardening easier or cheaper can't be a bad thing and let's face it; if there's a short cut - use it.

So with 'work smart - not hard' and a 'penny saved is a penny earned' as mottos, here we go!

Turn an old toilet roll into bio degradable seedling pot by just forming it into a squarish shape, making 4 cuts in one end and folding them together. Voila! Or how about using half an orange or lemon rind as a starter? Poke a hole in the bottom for drainage, add some potting soil, a couple of seeds and a little water. When they've sprouted transplant them in the garden and the peel will act as com-



post. You can actually do the same with a carefully peeled eggshell if you're taking things to the extreme

or you can even crush egg shell into a powder to sprinkle in the garden for a calcium boost.

If you have problems with starting seeds, or serious available space issues, how about a really small greenhouse? All that's needed is a 2 litre lemonade bottle. Cut the base away and take off the labels but leave the top on. Then place it snuggly inside the rim of the plant pot. Your very own micro greenhouse!

There's a very easy way to make your own organic weed killer; it takes just two ingredients and a spray gun. White vinegar and a little washing up liquid. The washing up liquid helps the vinegar stick to leaves but remember this is a pretty indiscriminate plant killer, so watch where you point it.

If you're away for few days and are concerned about keeping the indoor plants watered, then fear not because the answer lays with paper towels... Soak a good handful, without breaking them, and put them a draining board. Then place the plant pots on top. The towels retain moisture and spread it out allowing plants to drink.

Fresh herbs are great at any time of the year, but why would you head to the supermarket for them when you can grow your own and freeze them? Just fold a few leaves and put them in an ice tray, fill with water and freeze or blend them with olive oil and freeze. Works well for basil, chives, lemon balm, mint and tarragon.


