

FAMILY TIES

Last month Hilary and I went down to the Tower of London to witness the ceramic poppy field spread around the moat of this most historic of buildings. We were joined by my second cousin and her daughter and, at what would have been sunset, (it was in fact pouring with rain) the Constable of the Tower began to read out 180 names to add to the Roll of Honour. One of those names was that of my mother's brother, Sergeant Arthur Becklake, who had been killed near Ypres. The first name read out that evening was that of Nurse Edith Cavell.

It is notable how the anniversary of the start of the First World War has kindled a real interest in family history. The poppy field at the Tower has been visited by millions, and up and down the country, people have become interested in the stories of their own relatives who lived in those times.

Here in Leicester, on the edge of Victoria Park, stands the impressive war memorial, designed by the celebrated architect Sir Edwin Lutyens. This has become the focus of our own annual Remembrance Day Civic Service, attended by thousands each year. The monumental arch, erected in 1923, is complemented by the twin Victoria Park lodge gates by the same architect. As folk mingle after the service, memories are exchanged covering the

stories of many who had both survived and died in the conflict.



Interestingly it is not only veterans of other conflicts who share in these conversations; there are plenty of young people these days who take a lively interest in their own ancestry. Moreover, Family History groups and societies have spread all over the UK with a vast amount of research being undertaken into the period from 1914 to 1918, investigating the effect on the lives of ordinary people caught up in the conflict one way or another.

ously stuck because a car had parked across the dropped kerb. He was quickly joined by another chap in another motorised wheelchair. Both stuck. Both cross.



The woman who had parked her car so inconsiderately across a dropped kerb and on double yellow lines appeared and there was some shouting. I crossed the road and looked at the woman and she seemed to be seeking support. I said I was sorry but she had parked on double yellow lines, implying that she deserved a bit of a telling off. She told me in no uncertain terms she had been donating goods to the charity shop as if this somehow vindicated parking on double yellow lines. I shrugged and went inside to deliver my goods.

While inside, I heard the row escalating with more shouting and some truly choice language was used by the two men in the wheelchairs. The sort of language that is derogatory to women and is never heard on television. I got a bit cross at this point and went back outside to express my anger and disappointment that the two men should use such language and told them I found it appalling and I expected it to stop right now. The woman said something smug and I told her she should be quiet and move along as she was also in the wrong. I went inside feeling like I'd admonished a bunch of children, not grown adults.

The problem was born of selfishness, that ugly character trait of which we are all guilty to some extent and the message is clear, THINK before you act so you don't adversely affect others. If someone does something that affects you, make your point but remain POLITE! Are we all clear now? Good.



November Police Update

The Smart View with Sgt. Rod Smart On 1st October, a 45 year old man from the Saffron Lane area was arrested on Narborough Rd, having racially abused a local lady who he had begged for money. The man has been charged with a racially aggravated public order offence.

On 9th October a 68 year old man from Henley Rd was sentenced to four months for breaching a Restraining Order by racially abusing his neighbours over a period of time.

Such incidents of hate crime are relatively rare and are treated as especially serious by the Police and the Courts due to the impact on the victim and on wider society. We would urge anyone who is the victim of hate crime (whether due to race, religion, gender, sexuality or disability) to contact the police as soon as possible so that the matter can be investigated and suitable support offered.

On 13th October, a 21 year old student damaged a taxi mirror whilst arguing with his girlfriend on Paton Street. The student was arrested and the matter has been dealt with by way of *Community Resolution*, with him paying for the taxi to be repaired.

On 22 October, a 56 year old local man was arrested for theft of a car on Henton Road. He has been charged with taking the car and driving without insurance.

Over the last few months the west side of the City has been suffering from a significant spate of Peugeot 206 cars being broken into. The problem has been particularly prevalent around the Westcotes area and Rowley Fields. On 25 October a 39 year old local man was arrested following a theft on Rowley Fields. He has subsequently been charged with twenty six thefts of motor vehicles across the area.

On the same day, a 31 year old man from Spinney Hills was found in the secure compound of a business address on Blackbird Rd He has been charged with attempted burglary, going equipped to steal and possession of a knife.

Over the past few months, the number of burglaries across the area have been reduced but we are still suffering from a significant number where the occupants had left a door or window unlocked. During October, 14 burglaries took place across our policing area through unlocked doors or windows. Local residents are reminded to lock their doors and windows, even if they are in the house. Fitting window locks allow them to be left ajar but secure. Anyone needing crime prevention advice should call into their local Police Station or contact the police on 101.

smell of napalm in the morning, but I personally can't beat the scent of Viburnum x bodnantense on a winters day. Forget the blousy flowers of summer; winter is when the freshest, sweetest most sophisticated perfumes paint the air.

Viburnums range from compact shrubs to small sized trees, both evergreen and deciduous with many that flower during the winter and early spring. *V.farreri* is another sweet smelling deciduous shrub. *V.tinus* is a common evergreen species with clusters of fragrant apple white flowers. It can be grown as informal hedging, but it's prone to *Viburnum* beetle that make the leaves look like miniature tea strainers.

Some shrubs can look dull and boring most of the year, but come winter produce flowers with knockout scent. *Lonicera fragrantissima* or winter honeysuckle is one such shrub. In the middle of winter its leaf-less twiggy form is smothered in small creamy flowers that pump out a heady sweet and spicy perfume.

Mahonia are evergreen shrubs, many lend the garden a sculptural presence and their sulphur yellow flowers exude an intoxicating aroma. *Mahonia x Media* are the most common winter flowering species. There is even a variety called "Winter Sun". The razor edged leaves form rosettes on ribbed yellow stems that can grow to 4mtrs high. To maintain a sensible size you'll need to prune back hard after flowering, but wear tough gloves and a thick coat because *Mahonia* really is the Freddy Kruger of the plant world.

But it's probably *Sarcococca confusa* that tops my winter scent list. Also called Christmas or Sweet Box it can sprout as high as six feet and can be grown as a blight free alternative to *Buxus* or Common Box.

Even as winter's grip tightens; Azara, Clematis armandii, Hamamelis or Witch Hazel and many more plants will continue to perfume the garden when you can no longer smell the roses.




