WESTERN PARK DEVELOPS

The future of two sites on Western Park still hangs in the balance as Leicester City Council mulls over which of three bids will provide a sustainable solution to the derelict buildings at the edge of the park, including the Eco House and the Grade II listed Open Air School.

The three bidders; the Eco community bid, Western Park residents community bid and a local developer have submitted detailed, long term business plans to show how they would raise the money to renovate and finance their projects, in particular the Open Air School.



Given the size of the development, The Western Park residents bidders say their 'makeshift' committee felt: 'We should explore a potential partnership with the developer to put forward a more economically viable and sustainable option that might be taken more seriously. This possibility was always been subject to consultation with the community'.

At a public meeting on 12th October, the votes from five options were counted with the majority of the community in favour of a partnership with the developer.

Meeting organisers say: 'This supports our view that this is the only viable option for our community and should enable us to positively influence the development on the edge of our beautiful park whilst ensuring we secure community space for generations to come'.

A formal committee, The Western Ward Community Enterprise (WWCE), is now in place with members originally in support of this option and who could take on an active role in a complex process.

The committee is due to launch a regularly updated website and community consultation evenings will be held at critical stages along the way.

It still remains to be seen whether this, or any bid, will be accepted.

With A Rebel Yell

It is June 1685. A young son of King Charles II has landed at Lyme Regis in Dorset and is laying claim to the throne of England. Following the death of his father, three months earlier, this popular but illegitimate son is raising troops and marching towards Bristol in a revolution to overthrow his uncle King James II. James Scott, The First Duke of Monmouth, is on the warpath.

What did all this have to do with Leicester? I hear you ask. The answer is more than you think. The Government of King James II was very worried that the rebellion might spread. If it did, then fears grew that there might be considerable support for such an uprising amongst the people of Leicestershire in particular. The Lord Lieutenant's men were alerted and within days, various suspects were being taken into custody or in the words of the time 'fetched in'. In total 21 individuals were imprisoned and 12 fetched in.

I am grateful to an article in the current edition of the Leicestershire Historian by Alan Betteridge which describes how these suspected trouble-makers were rounded up. Many were connected to nonconformist sects and included ministers of religion thought to be hostile to the rule of King James. One of those imprisoned was William Inge of Knighton, who came from quite a well to do

family.

The revolt itself came to an ill-fated end in Somerset at the Battle of Sedgemoor and a few days later its leader, Monmouth, was captured hiding in a barn, and soon executed for treason at the infamous Tower Hill on the 15th of July.

The Leicestershire suspects were all quickly released as the initial panic died down. The citizens of Leicester even held a victo-



ry bonfire to celebrate the failure of the rebellion and no doubt to prove their loyalty at the same time

Others were not so fortunate. After the defeat at Sedgemoor, the last pitched battle ever fought on English soil, they were arrested and sentenced either to death or transportation by Judge Jefferies in what became known as the 'Bloody Assizes'.

As West Country people, six Blackmore's fought at Sedgemoor, all on the rebel side. At least one was executed and two transported. My Leicestershire ancestors, as far as I know, did not get involved.





Nov Police Update

We have been extremely busy across the force recently with two critical incidents in the city centre and the tragic news from Hinckley concerning the deaths of two boys and their father. We have also had to help police the Diwali celebrations, as well as Halloween and Bonfire night. During this we have also been occupied across the county assisting our colleagues from other teams in dealing with these incidents and events.

The most important news from West Leicester, is the incident in Bede Park on the morning of Saturday 29th October. Subsequently a 32 year old male has been charged with a number of offences including three counts of rape, one count of assault ABH, sexual touching, assault by penetration, attempted theft, theft and robbery. Following on from this, NPA Commander Insp Rob Randell attended a patch walk across Bede Park, along with counsellors, CCTV managers and Parks Officers; who will all be looking at measures to review the safety of the park.

We have been working hard to drive down the number of burglaries across West Leicester. In the last seven days alone we have significantly reduced the number of burglaries in comparison to other areas of the county. In the weekending 4th November alone we have made two arrests for burglaries from two different incidents. We are rolling out our Darker Nights campaign, which can be found on the website at: www leics.police.uk/categories/darker-nights This is designed to encourage residents to keep their households secure and to keep a light on to deter any opportunists in the area.

Finally, our #LivesNotKnives campaign continues, with an amnesty bin located at all city centre police stations. We are encouraging people to hand in knives to the bins, without the fear of prosecution, in an attempt to reduce the number of knife related incidents. This week we have had fifteen bladed articles, including a samurai sword brought into the Hinckley Road Police Station; notably this collection here...



Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

This year the autumn colours have been breath-taking. I'm told this is

due to the unusually dry weather we've had. I can't prove this theory but I know I'll be clearing

up vast quantities of leaves for the next month! While it's tempting to let nature mulch the beds and borders, it's important to remove any leaf build up on the lawn. This can leave the turf patchy and grass bare. The simplest method is to mow them off. This minces up the leaves perfectly for composting. If you've used any lawn treatments make sure it's safe to compost



the clippings. Some products have a residual action that can affect the plants you use the subsequent compost on.

I'm often asked if you should mow a lawn during Next m the winter. A lawn should be mown whenever it fox pie!

needs it, just avoid doing so when it's waterlogged or frozen. Set your mower a little higher to save churning up the soggy winter ground and leaving

the slower growing grass a bit more length to photosynthesise with.

A mossy or thatch ridden lawn would benefit from scarifying. Half an hour with a spring rake on a Winter's day is great exercise. Work in lines up and down the lawn, remembering to change arms regularly or you'll be visiting the physio. If that sounds like hard work mechanical scarifiers



are quite cheap to buy and larger machines can be rented.

If your lawn is prone to waterlogging or suffers from compaction try aerating the ground with a garden fork or hollow tiner, or hiring a mechanical version. This can improve drainage and the grasses ability to root better. Top-dress with sharp sand or a mixture of sieved topsoil. Then sit back with a cuppa and watch squirrels, cats, birds, and foxes dig holes in your masterpiece.


