£1.8 Million Facelift For The Rally Travelling through West Leicester's Rally Park for walkers, wheelers and cyclists will become more pleasant thanks to a successful bid for funding from Active Travel England.

The city council has won £1.8million from the Active Travel Fund to create new walking routes and cycle tracks through the park off Tudor Road, as well as funding for improvements to entrances, street furniture and additional planting.



Wider walking routes and segregated cycle tracks will be built along existing routes, including National Cycle Network Route 63, the Forest Way, which runs through the park. This will link to the new dedicated cycle lanes on Fosse Road North, ex-

tending the route as far south as the A47, and connect with a new cycleway up Groby Road to the Glenfield Hospital.

Access to the park will be improved, particularly for those going to and from the Castle Mead Academy, while new sealed-surface paths will replace the well-used but muddy routes surrounding the school. Seating, landscaping and new trees are also planned to enhance the route between Tudor Road and the school.

Deputy city mayor Cllr Adam Clarke, who's responsible for active travel, said: "When this scheme's complete, there will be a muchimproved link between Newfoundpool, Frog Island and the new Waterside neighbourhood for people on foot, on bikes or using wheelchairs or other mobility aids."

Consultation will get under way with local residents, park users and schools over the coming months, with stakeholders invited to consider design proposals this winter.

Construction work is expected to get under way during the spring and is likely to take several months to complete.

Project Hive is run by the WWCE, a group of local residents raising funds to redevelop the former Eco House into a community space.

You may be wondering where the project stands from a fundraising point-of-view as another year draws to a close. To date the lion's share of our funds have come from the local community, predominantly via supporting our events. Broken down in simplified terms:

Income to date. Money raised during our 2019 crowdfund: £26,500 Money raised from other events and donations: £18,700 Giving a total of £45,200. Expenditure to date. Surveys & Searches: £3300 Architects Fees: £23,500 Planning Application: £950 Public Liability Insurance: £600 Giving a total of £28,350. This leaves the current balance of the WWCE bank account at £16,850

The next stage of the project requires the capital funding to get the building re-developed. We will not be asking the community for this and will be seeking funding from national streams. We are in negotiations with an experienced bid writer who we feel will give us the best chance of securing this. We will provide updates on this soon.

Oct Police Update

Well last month has seen a mixed bag of incidents we have dealt with.

No month would be complete without our efforts in dealing with the scourge of cannabis growing and yet again we have uncovered another dangerous address containing over 300 plants. Once again, we are reassured that the person in question is no longer growing cannabis, a property is made safe and HMP will have another allinclusive guest. Please report any suspicious behaviour regarding cannabis growing in the area, we feel that those responsible are getting the message and together we can drive this from our doors.

I do understand some peoples view on the use of cannabis but regardless, it is still an illegal substance. The addresses we target are often part of a bigger picture which can encourage County Lines drug dealing and lead to those more vulnerable becoming involved.

There is mention in national news about shop-lifting and a lack of Police action. I can say that as a team on the Fosse Ward, we take this very seriously and make every effort to identify those responsible to support our local stores. Several individuals have been arrested and we continue to show a presence in the area. Please feel free to speak to Officers in shops, they can also inform you in person of the work we do and ways to engage through the Neighbourhood Link if you give them an e-mail.

We have also had an increase in incidents involving e-scooters being ridden dangerously. One chap almost hitting pedestrians on the pavement before crashing to a stop and running away. Thankfully no one was hurt and I now have his £500 scooter and phone. Feel free to come and collect it from PS825 Cannings!

E-scooters fall under Road Traffic legislation. We will speak to those using them in public first, to advise and educate regarding the law. But will seize them if this advice is ignored.

We have had reports of some youths causing Anti-Social Behaviour on or around the Rally Park, impacting on others enjoyment of the area. I believe we know who they are and have been in the process of engaging with them.

Once again, the team have made good use of stop and search powers to target those carrying weapons and/or drugs during proactive patrols.

On a lighter note PCSO 6017 has managed to work with LCFC to provide some youth coaching engagement at the Rally Park. It is open to those between 8 – 18 years old, 1-2.30 on each Saturday until 11th November.

October is upon us, the season of Halloween and fireworks. Please be responsible and stay safe.

CAREY'S COMPOST CORNER

October, the season of mist and mellow fruitfulness, marks the transition into the autumn season. As the days become cooler and shorter, there are several important gardening tasks I like to tackle to prepare for the winter months in the hope of ensuring a vibrant garden next year.

October is the ideal time to plant spring-flowering bulbs like daffodils, tulips, crocuses. They'll establish roots over the winter and provide a burst of colour when spring arrives. I'm also trimming back spent peren-



nials, removing dead or diseased plant material, and clearing fallen leaves. This tidying up helps prevent diseases and pests from overwintering.

I like to gather the last of my homegrown fruits sons. and vegetables. This includes apples, pears, pumpkins, and squash. I store them in a cool, dry place so they can be enjoyed throughout the winter. I'm continuing to mow my lawns as long as they are growing, but I am gradually raising the cutting height. I'm also aerating the lawn to im-

prove drainage and prevent waterlogging where needed. Now is a good time to sow Green Manure, such as clover or field beans in empty vegetable beds, this enriches the soil and suppresses weeds. Autumn is an excellent time to plant new trees and shrubs. It gives them time to establish roots before the winter sets in. It's also perfect timing to divide overcrowded perennial plants like hostas and irises. Replant the divisions elsewhere in your garden or share them with friends. Once planting has taken place, add compost to your garden beds to enrich the soil and apply a layer of mulch to insulate the soil and reduce weed growth.

I like to put out new or fully cleaned bird feeders and provide fresh water for the local bird population. It's a challenging time for them to find food, and they will appreciate your support. In addition, I like to plan for next year. I use this quieter time to reflect on my garden's successes and challenges. I plan improvements, consider new plantings, and research gardening projects for the coming sea-

October is a month of change in our gardens, with the last hurrah of autumn colour and the start of preparations for winter. By taking care of these essential tasks, you can ensure a beautiful and healthy garden in the months to come.
