Poison on the Park

Bags of Asbestos were found dumped on Western Park Road, off Hinckley Road at the beginning of October.

Several black bin liners stuffed with, what peared to be, broken down ceiling panels of the toxic material were left just inside Western Park next to

the cut-through entrance.

City Council Environmen-Enforcement Officer Steve Lally said: "The suspected asbestos was taped off and removed for testing within 24 hours; investigations are ongoing".

Due to asbestos's highly

poisonous nature, Freemans Common is the only recycling centre in Leicester that will accept it, but only in cement bonded form and as long as it is aware the plan remained condouble wrapped in plastic.



Leicester's First Prima Donna

It's surprising what you learn about a famous nineteenth century Leicester-born opera singer on a visit to Berkeley Castle in Gloucestershire.

Earlier this year, during a visit to this impressive 12th century edifice, I came across the story of opera singer Elizabeth Austin and Francis Henry Fitzhardinge Berkeley.

Francis was the fourth son of the ninth Earl of Berkeley. After a contested court action about the legality of his father's marriage, Francis was in fact, found to be illegitimate. Nevertheless he was destined to go on to lead a remarkable life with a Leicester born soprano who became one of the most renown opera singers of her time.

Born Elizabeth Clarke in 1798, the future operatic star married John Austin at the age of 15. She had voice training under William Gardiner, the Director of Music at Great Meeting Chapel and by 1821 was singing at the Dublin Opera House. Her popularity as a singer in the Italian style rapidly grew and she performed back in her home town at the Leicester Music Festival of 1827.

It's not known exactly when and where the dashing young aristocrat, F.H.F Berkley met the already famous Elizabeth Austin but he went on to

become both her lover and her manager. This was quickly followed by several years in the United States of America where she played to packed houses for a number of years. She gained a tremendous reputation as an operatic prima donna and be-



came a wealthy woman in her own right. Francis accompanied her to the USA and acted as her agent as well as her companion. She gave her last performance in New York in 1835.

Elizabeth and Francis went on to have two children, Elizabeth and Francis Junior, both born out of wedlock as the couple did not marry until 1856, some time after the death of Elizabeth's husband, John.

In 1837 Francis was elected as MP for Bristol and he became a strong supporter of the idea of a secret ballot. This was finally introduced in 1872, two years after his death at the age of seventy five.

Elizabeth outlived Francis by a few years and died in London.

I don't often welcome road works. For the most part they are noisy and inconvenient in the extreme, especially when they are near your home and cause tailbacks. It isn't the queue that's giving me the warm fuzzies, it's the unintentional consequences. Have you noticed how much quieter Hinckley Road is in the mornings? We walk to school every day and wonder at how few cars there are coming into town along our road, even when the traffic lights aren't there. Coming home at night is a joy because there aren't so many cars roaring past. It's like all the people who previously used it have forgotten it's there. The only big lorries we get at the moment are the ones slavishly following a sat-nav to get through town. It's all to do with patterns of behaviour. In the world of radio where I work from time to time (Have you listened to Smooth Radio on a Sunday afternoon recently... that's me!) you are rarely allowed to have holidays in September because that's when people's patterns are set for the year. The summer holidays mean the flow of daily life for many is disrupted and our roads are clear of school traffic. Then September comes and we fall into a routine. We use the same roads every day and the pattern is set. If something disrupts that for at least 15 days in a row, we find a new route, we change our behaviour. The result is quiet roads.



I was in a shop in town the other day and the lady cashier suddenly let out a moan and said her husband had texted her to say the road works were back on Hinckley Road. Her journey home would be over an hour and she was going to have to find a new route. Inside my head, I did a little happy dance. She won't be coming down our road any time soon. So raise a glass to roadworks on Hinckley Road, in fact, lets invite them back next September. © Helen Knott

Narborough Rd Robbery

A middle-aged man and woman were brutally attacked and robbed in broad daylight by two masked men as they headed to a Narborough Road Jewellers.

The two were attacked with an iron bar opposite Arti Jewellers and had a bag, containing a large amount of 22-carat gold Indian jewelry, snatched at around 1.45pm on Friday 3rd of October.

The robbers escaped towards Upperton Road in a car driven by an accomplice.

The couple were taken to hospital for treatment to head injuries and bruising.

Bhasen Pattni who owns Arti Jewellers knows the victims: "It's Diwali soon and they were bringing us some samples. He's a jewellery dealer and family friend from London. I was serving a customer and I didn't see what happened but suddenly his wife was banging on the door, crying and shaking. "He's in shock and I'm trembling just thinking that this happened on a major road in broad daylight."

Detective Constable Jenny Tattersall, said: "We would like to speak to anyone who witnessed the incident or saw either of the men fitting the descriptions of the suspects acting suspiciously in the area around the time of the incident.

"We would like to speak to anyone who has any

information about the gold jewellery or is offered the items for sale in suspicious circumstances."

One of the two suspects is described as a 5' 8" slim white man wearing black clothes. A second man is described as slim, 5' 11" and also wearing black. A third suspect is thought to have been waiting across the road in a black Skoda Fabia with tinted windows and alloy wheels, which was seen driving off at the time of the incident.

Police carried out two warrants at addresses in Leicestershire on 8th October and arrested a 27 year old man in Barrow-upon-Soar on suspicion of robbery. Enquiries are ongoing.



October Police Update

The Smart View with Sgt. Rod Smart
On 23 August a burglary took place at an address on Luther Street where the door had been left unlocked overnight. A 36 year old man from the City Centre has been arrested and charged with the burglary. On 30 September a further two burglaries took place (one on Bonchurch Street and one on Eastleigh Road) where the burglar had entered through an insecure window or door. We have seen a reduction in burglaries recently but residents are reminded to make sure that they lock their doors and windows, especially at night.

On 4 September, a young lady had her mobile phone snatched from her hand by a passing cyclist on Narborough Road. The offence was witnessed by plain clothed Police officers who detained a twenty 28 old Beaumont Leys man who has been charged with theft.

On the evening on 27 September, several of officers, including armed officers, attended the Hinckley Road entrance to Western Park, following the report of a male waving a Samurai sword around. A 17 year old youth was located but it transpired that he had actually been waving a stick around which was mistaken for a sword. The youth, who was found to be in possession of a knife, was arrested and later bailed pending intervention by Youth Intervention Officers.

Over recent weeks, we have seen an increase in cars being broken into overnight around the area, with door locks being drilled or windows smashed. Peugeot 206s' seem to have been particularly targeted by the offenders. Additional patrolling is taking place and car owners are advised to remove valuables from their vehicles over night, to park them in a well-lit and secure area (ideally in a garage) and to consider fitting an alarm. For crime prevention advice, please contact your local Police.

Hallowe'en will be upon us very soon and, although a fun time for many young people, it can be a troublesome time for others (especially older people). Local residents are asked to keep an eve out for older residents around them. Police do not advocate practices such as 'Trick or *Treating'* but if considering it we would encourage parents to educate their offspring on how to do it whilst causing as little disruption to local residents Additionally, parents should be as possible. mindful of the safety of their children if out 'Trick or Treating', should give suitable safety advice and ideally should accompany their children. Your local Police have a supply of double sided Trick or Treat posters for residents to put in their windows. One side advertises that householders welcome Trick or Treaters and the other sides states Trick or Treat - No Thanks.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

It took a while but eventually the seasons have caught up with us and the hard winter frosts are only a few clear nights away.

Now is the time adventurous plant lovers start to worry about the exotic purchases they made during sunnier times. But all is not lost. Last winter was so mild that all the pelargoniums in my hanging baskets survived outside to see another summer. You can give pots of tender plants extra protection by simply moving them closer to a southerly wall.

On colder evenings, drape horticultural fleece over less hardy plants. I remember marvelling at how an Agave enthusiast had carefully fleece-wrapped his prized spiky succulents. Judging by their maturity it was a successful technique. With larger specimens like hardy banana Musa basjoo and tree ferns, pack the plants



with dry straw first. This stops the fleece trapping moisture against the plant when it gets damp.

Some plants can benefit from a mulch of leaf litter, but be aware you could be providing a winter home for slugs and their buddies. Leave the old foliage on herbaceous perennials, like penstemons and verbenas. to deflect the frost. Some shrubs evergreen Choisya can get scorched



by the cold, so leave shoots longer than you need them in the Autumn as a sacrifice to Jack Frost.

But there are some plants it isn't worth taking a risk with, like the beautiful Salvia "Amistad" my wife got me in June and the ginger lily from our Cornish holiday. They'll be carefully lifted, potted and placed in an unheated greenhouse. Don't be tempted to keep your garden refugees any warmer than necessary. This will lead to weak leggy growth. Remove damaged foliage and keep watering to a minimum to reduce the chance of rot.

Talking of rot, more garden mumblings next month!

Local writer, Melissa Lawrence, is planning a book on the life of Ethel North based on an inherited collection of letters written by Ethel, between 1919 and 1933, to Melissa's grandmother.

Ethel was the eldest daughter of butcher Harry North whose original shop sign can still be seen on the corner of Hinckley Road and Ridley Street in the West End.



She was the close companion of Lady Burghclere, sister of the 5th Earl of Carnarvon who funded the discovery of Tutankhamen's tomb. Ethel travelled all over the world with "Lady B" as she called her, visiting exotic locations and meeting the rich and famous of the day including Rudyard Kipling and Howard Carter

Fans of the hit television series *Downton Abbey* will know that the fictional Earl of Grantham and his family are based on the Carnarvons. Much of it is filmed at Highclere Castle in Berkshire where Ethel and Lady B stayed on several occasions and also at Lady Carnarvon's villa in Portofino.

Ethel eventually went on to work for the Leicestershire Branch of the British Red Cross until her death in 1960 when she was living on Wynfield Road.

Melissa is in the process of putting together a book based on Ethel's life and wants to get in touch with any descendants of the North's family or anyone who has any recollections of Ethel or any of her six sisters.


