GOLF CLUB SHUTS

Campaigners hoping to save the 105 year old Western Park Golf Course from closure on October 31st have all but given up.

Martin Cobb, Vice Captain of the Western Park Golf Club and member of the development committee tasked with trying to save the course said: "In spite of two public consultations, a petition in our favour and support of local people, councillors and Liz Kendall, I think we were on a hiding

to nothing.




"We've done our best to provide a sustainable business plan but the Council wouldn't budge.

"Over the years the course has suffered from a chronic lack of investment which caused a dip in membership but the closure will mean there's no accessible course in the area".

City Mayor, Sir Peter Soulsby, says Leicester cannot afford to run two large municipal golf courses as he looks for ways to cut the city's £2.9 million sports budget. In a letter to Martin Cobb, Sir Peter wrote: "Turning around Western Park Golf Course would be a major undertaking involv-

ing many people and considerable financial resources over a long period... I have concluded that were both Western Park and Humberstone Heights to remain open, neither would be able to generate a sustainable level of interest and membership. Very soon both courses could be forced to close".

Leicester City Council plans to pump some of the saved cash into the re-



maining Humberstone Heights course. But Martin Cobb says: "Many users won't transfer to Humberstone. Less than 10% will move but many are just knocking in it (golf) on the head.

"The grounds here are 148 acres of mature parkland. You could never make a course with an expansive layout like this today; there's not enough space. It's a tough enough test for golfers, in fact, we've had loads of county champions and dozens of pro's learning at the club.

"This course was opened in 1910 by a Mayor of Leicester to provide affordable golf and now it's being closed by one".

The first Western Park Beer Festival proved to be a huge success raising over £5000 towards the rebuilding of the Tin Annie community hall on Letchworth Road.

However, more than this was the genuine sense of community and the incredibly lively, friendly and happy atmosphere that was generated by the people of Western Park and beyond over the three sessions.

"The festival was enjoyed by people of all ages, from the two day old son of Rik, a member of the festival's organising committee, through to a huge number of parents and children on the Saturday afternoon, to octogenarians who rarely have the opportunity to enjoy the company of their local community over a beer or two.

"The planning for next year's festival has already begun and we will be holding an open meeting for people who wish to become involved in the next few weeks. We're also considering some other potential events prior to next year's festival - but suffice to say it will involve beer and considerable good cheer!"

KNOTT'S LANDING

I'm cross again. I recently had a chat with an oral health promoter in Leicester and it was like The Enlightenment.

I have been with the same practice for about seven years. In that time my dentist has checked my teeth, done x-rays, filled holes, made crowns and regularly sends me off to the hygienist for a clean at a charge of around £25. So far so normal. Well no actually, not normal. In their contract with the NHS.



the basic treatment you are entitled to, the one I pay £18.80 for, includes a scale and polish if clinically needed. Apparently I haven't clinically needed a scale and polish for seven years but I have needed regular cleaning of my teeth through the hygienist at £25 a go. Can you see why I might be a bit peeved? I do understand that 10 minutes with the hygienist is better than a couple of minutes of my dentist having a go but that's not the point. EVERY time I go I get told off for having tartar below my gums and that I need my teeth cleaning but the dentist never makes any effort to

do it. So off I trot to the hygienist and pay extra. I'm lucky, I can afford it, but there have been a few times when it has been hard to find an extra £25 from nowhere.

Now I can cope with fighting battles over my own teeth but then I heard something that REALLY made me mad. It turns out my now not so little one should have been having fluoride varnish painted onto his teeth twice a year since he was 3 and up to four times a year since we found a cavity (yes, I am totally shamed and horrified but it happened and we deal with it). It should be being applied FOUR TIMES A YEAR. This has certainly not been happening.

Leicester has the worst dental health in under fives in the country. That's a horrible statistic. Little kids are going through pain and suffering, having their teeth taken out under general anaesthetic, having tooth plasters, and my dentist isn't routinely painting on fluoride varnish, a free procedure on the NHS, which might prevent it from happening in the first place. Grrrr.

So here's my tip. If you have a child of under 18 go and ask your dentist for fluoride varnish for them. Tell them you heard it's free on the NHS and you can read about it here:



One of West Leicester's most popular watering holes has been named an Asset of Community Value or ACV.

The Western pub off Narborough Road is also the home of the city's only pub theatre, Upstairs @ The Western, a unique achievement in itself, but now the building's future is secure. The AVC gives it special protection to guarantee it stays at the centre of the neighbourhood.

Leicester City Council agreed to a request from Camra, the real ale group, for the pub to become the first in the city to be named an Asset of Community value following concerns over the amount of student accommodation being built in the area.

The award makes it harder for developers to change the use of the building in the future.




Gazette Ruins Vandals Day A member of the Gazette's staff interrupted two vandals as they were putting finishing touches to their latest graffiti scrawl.

Oct Police Update

SHARK WATCH with Sgt. Kev Sharkey We received a report from Linkway Gardens of some suspicious males and attended to find six men and two vehicles one of which tried to drive off on seeing officers.

All six men were detained, searched and the vehicles were checked for documents. One vehicle was subsequently seized as there was no driver with a valid licence. This will hopefully send a clear message to these men who had been gathering in the area for a little while.

An update for the street drinking reported around the Fosse Road area and Merry Monarch car park is that the community meeting has taken place in which the licensee of the Monarch, Stan, encouraged residents to tell him when things need sorting on the car park. He will then forward the concerns directly to the brewery who are responsible for its upkeep. A multi lingual poster



has also been produced and distributed to places selling alcohol in the area to warn customers not to drink and cause anti-social behaviour or face alcohol confiscation and possible arrest. We will continue to monitor this situation.

Staff at the Westcotes House NHS Centre on Westcotes Drive behind the Westcotes doctors surgery have asked us to remind residents that the grounds are private property. There have been problems with people walking their dogs in the grounds which can cause some patients distress as they are being treated for canine phobias. Can residents please find an alternative location to walk their dogs and leave the grounds if asked to do so by staff to avoid Police being called to assist in removing trespassers.

On a routine job, officers entered an address on Fosse ward and found a small scale drug lab used to produce meth amphetamine. The scene was made safe by the fire service and the volatile chemicals removed by an expert chemical company. One male was arrested.

We have seen a small increase in vehicles being attacked overnight for fuel particularly around Hinckley Road / Letchworth Road area. Fuel tanks have been drilled and fuel taken.

Please remain vigilant and report all suspicious events giving as clear a description as possible of people and vehicles, including registration numbers, and also direction of travel, if they are leaving the scene, to enable officers to detain and check them as soon as possible.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

During my years of gardening during the 'season of mellow fruitfulness', I've been hit on the noggin by many things but being crowned by a peach was a first. Lucky it was soft. It was also ripe, juicy and delicious. This year fruit has been raining from the skies. The apples and pears have been fantastic and my fig bush has produced its first crop. Inspired by this

bumper harvest I've decided to increase my range of fruit. But I've set three parameters to my search. They have to be unusual, aesthetically pleasing, and of course good to eat.

One contender is Fuchsia. Yes, I too was surprised to discover the fruit is edible, in fact so are the flowers, but times would have to be hard before I ate my favourite "Robin Hood" double blooms.

Rubus phoenicolasius or Japanese wineberry

must also make the list. I've been looking for an excuse to grow it since seeing one at a local open gardens. Its fruit look like strange exotic jewels and the thorn encrusted stems are a vibrant rusty orange giving year round interest.

If I was shopping by names alone, the treacleberry, Smilacina racemosa, would be top of my list. A shade loving plant related to Solomon Seal this is ideal for underplanting trees and shrubs.

A plant I've been meaning to grow again is

Decaisnea fargesii. This shrub produces broad bean like seed pods that are a surreal blue colour. The seeds are inedible but the pulpy inside of the pod is said to be sweet and tasty. But the plant I'm most looking forward to trying is the Chilean Guava. Although requiring protection in the hardest winters it's less fussy about soil conditions than its cousin, the blueberry, and produces more fruit!


