

REMEMBERING PASSCHENDAELE

At a recent Cathedral Service to mark the hundredth anniversary of the Battle of Passchendaele, two young people read out the names of the thirty six soldiers from Leicestershire who were killed on the first day of one of the bloodiest battles of the First World War.

The battle, also known as the Third Battle of Ypres was marked by appalling conditions. Torrential rain led to atrocious muddy fields, with thousands slipping to their deaths and even drowning as they attempted to capture a hill known as the Passchendale ridge. The struggle was to last over three months.

A few years ago Hilary and I travelled to Ypres and visited the imposing Menin Gate which serves as a memorial to tens of thousands of soldiers who lost their lives in the area but have no known grave. Here we laid a wreath in memory of the fallen on behalf of the people of our city.

The First World War touched with tragedy almost every family in the land. My own mother's big brother, Arthur, met his death in the mud hereabouts in September 1917. My Leicester grandmother was to lose her cousin Tom Lewin who died shortly after the end of the war still suffering from the effects of gas attacks and Hilary's grandfather died near the Somme.

At the packed Cathedral service of Commemora-


tion a former High Sherriff of Leicestershire read out a moving extract from the diary of one Private Alfred H Burrage which painted a horrifying picture of life and death in the Battle of Passchendaele. He wrote: "Dawn reveals to us a sight which nobody could visualise without having actually seen it......It is like being on the sea, but our sea is a sea of mud."



Not long ago an old lady in Beaumont Leys recalled to me her childhood memories of a war veterans' parade returning to Leicester, including the wounded, the blinded and the gassed. It had clearly made a deep impression on her..

And just recently eight bells, cast by Taylors of Loughborough, have been sent in the company of World War One army trucks to St George's Memorial Church in Ypres. Proof, if it were needed, that those from our county who fought and died at Passchendaele are not forgotten.

WESTERN PARK DEVELOPMENT

A local community group and a Leicester developer could soon be working in partnership to breathe new life into land and empty buildings on Western Park.

Parmar Properties and Western Ward Community Enterprise (WWCE), have successfully bid to buy and develop two areas of land on the park, including a former open-air school, and a pioneering eco-house.

The council put them up for sale in June last year, with the aim of finding a buyer who would have the resources to bring the sites back into use while respecting their history.



Parmar Properties is owned by Naresh and Sharon Parmar, who have successfully refurbished a number of local historic buildings with Grade I and Grade II listings. These include The Pavilion on Western Park, Belgrave House and stables and The City Rooms on Hotel Street. They are also nearing completion of a major renovation of Winstanley House (formerly known as Braunstone Hall) on Braunstone Park.

The Parmars' plan to prioritise the transformation of the former school into eight individual office spaces, and then develop 20 two-storey houses on the other, bigger site - four of which would be affordable housing. Five of the houses will be built to Passivhaus standard, and the rest would also meet high environmental standards.

Parmar Properties will lease the Eco House to WWCE, for a peppercorn rent, subject to the group being able to raise the funding to refurbish it. The building could be used for a variety of community purposes. WWCE will also be given a 999-year lease for a detached classroom building at the southern end of the former school site. from which they would operate a community café.

A formal decision on the sale will be taken by Sir Peter Soulsby, Leicester's City Mayor.

The Western Ward Community Enterprise will have their update in the November Gazette.

PLACES FOR PEOPLE

WALKING TO HEALTH

The five walks held so far have attracted a number of people of different ages and backgrounds, who show an eagerness to join the next week's activity. As one walker said, "It's been really positive for me socially. There's been a marked improvement in my physical

and mental wellbeing".

Offering a series of weekly walks starting from the BRITE centre in Braunstone Avenue, it caters for most abilities. The scheme has accreditation from Walking for Health, the respected national and organisation. Leaders are trained and operate to guidelines that ensure attention to the well-being of participants.



All walks are local, making use of parks and open spaces wherever possible, are mostly on paved and even paved surfaces and are intended to be social as well as physical.

Everyone is welcome. Meeting on a Thursday at 12 noon, a programme of walks of varying length and duration will suit most capabilities. Come and give it a try!

Inconsiderate parking during school pickup times is a problem across the country. In Western Park it is a huge issue for residents around Letchworth Road and Glenfield Road. So Much so, that a Traffic Action Group 'TAG' has been set up by residents to tackle the problem.

Community Speed Watch

We knocked on front doors during March this year to ask for support for a proposed Community Speed Watch (CSW) project. More than 450 households signed to show their support and we heard many tales about peoples' experiences with speeding cars and anti-social driving behaviour. We submitted our application and then we heard in May that there wasn't any funding available for the CSW in this area.....so frustrating!

The TAG have been like a dog with a bone, we tried other avenues. We met with Lord Willy Bach, the Police and Crime Commissioner and described the local traffic speeding problems and he was very supportive saying he would investigate options. He is coming to visit the area in October, together with Sir Peter Soulsby, Liz Ken-



dall, local Councillors, city council traffic team and local school representatives.

We are still keen to set up the Community Speed Watch programme – average traffic speed has increased bringing greater risks for pedestrians and residents.Breaking news, we have just had an email confirming that the County have found a speed camera for our CSW group to use. Perhaps all those meetings are paying off!

The great news is the City Council have appointed a consultant to work on the 20mph scheme for our area....and the scheme will be implemented in the next financial year – 2018-2019. Consultation should begin in November.

We have asked that this includes a 7.5T weight limit for lorries – of course apart from deliveries. Since the New Parks Way was closed for resurfacing in July the number of bigger lorries using Letchworth and Westfield as a cut-through has increased. We are optimistic that restricting the speed and reducing the big lorries will make this area much safer for residents, pedestrians and cyclists.

Narborough Road: It has been a busy month for the West End of Leicester, the team have been busy out patrolling the Narborough Road and surrounding streets. We are receiving reports of street drinking and antisocial behaviour which continues to be a priority for our local businesses, shoppers and residents. The team have been working hard to tackle these issues both engaging with the street drinkers and using our powers appropriately during a weeklong operation between the City and West area neighbourhood policing teams.

Daneshill Road: An update on the investigation into the Daneshill Road incident has seen two men charged after a serious assault and items found during subsequent searches at properties in Leicester.

A 51-year-old man has been charged with section 18 wounding with intent. The charge relates to a report of a serious assault on Wednesday 20 September.

Another man has been charged with manufacturing explosives under suspicious circumstances, under Section 4 of the Explosive Substance Act of 1883. They both appeared before Leicester Magistrates' Court in September.

The charges follow prolonged searches at addresses in Leicester. The investigation is continuing but we would like to reassure you that none of the arrests that were made last week were under the Terrorism Act.

We would like to thank the local communities for their patience and understanding while those enquiries were conducted.

If anyone has any concerns about the incident or the police activity please speak to local officers or call 101.

We are working to reassure local residents, so please speak with the team when we you see us out and about.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

It's been a terrific summer, but for me it's going to be, cue bad pun, an a-mazing autumn. I've been commissioned to design and build a maze by my friend "Farmer Ed" from Westlodge Farm Park in Desborough.

The earliest known maze was at the ancient Eygptian tomb of AmenemhatIII, 6,000 years ago! In Britain, mazes have been a feature of grand

country estates since the 16th century.

The most famous is the Hampton Court Maze, which was constructed in 1690. Its walls were originally hornbeam but this was later replaced with yew hedging. There are many other fine mazes around the country including Longleat, Chatsworth, and a recently built one at Burleigh House. My family always



make an annual visit to the Wistow Maize Maze.

maze. I've seen simple mazes of lavender or box, of no more than a few square metres. A pattern could be set out using coloured stones or mowing a design into the lawn.

The maze I'm building is based on a design in Victoria Park, Glasgow. It is unicursal: it has

one path that leads you along a meandering route without puzzling alternative options. But my design has incorporated a few extra little tricky sections to keep you guessing.

Unfortunately I can't wait decades for hedging to grow. This maze will be constructed with more than 150 metres of fencing, under the shelter of a small stand of Norway Spruce that have been topped to create the close, dark feel of thick woodland. With any luck, the maze will ready for Halloween. By which time Farmer Ed hopes to be back from his shopping trip to Crete. He's seeing a bloke called King Minos who owns a labyrinth and has promised to loan Ed something called a Minotaur. Sounds like a lot of bull to me, but maybe you should check it out for yourself!


