

Mansions of Leicester

Throughout Great Britain during the twentieth century, literally scores of country mansions were demolished. Either their owners found the cost of upkeep too high or death duties prompted wealthy families to look again at their residences. Bodies such as the National Trust and Ministry of Works (now English Heritage) were unable to cope with the volume of requests to take over and maintain such properties. Thus it was that over the course of the century Leicestershire lost some of its finest country mansions.

For example, in 1951, in the west of the county Gopsall Hall was demolished. Situated in the middle of a vast estate, it was described by the famous architectural historian, Niklaus Pevsner, as: "the most extensive and lavishly decorated eighteenth century house in the county." Designed by local Leicester architect John Westley, pictures of it could be viewed in magazines such as Country Life.

A few years later, in 1964, I well recall reading in the Leicester Mercury that Garendon Hall near Shepshed was to be razed to the ground to provide hardcore for the M1, then being built through the county. Garendon Hall was originally built on the site of the former Cistercian Garendon Abbey.

Papillon Hall near Market Harborough had an interesting history going back some four hundred years when it was occupied by a refugee Hugenot family. Between 1902 and 1904 it was remodelled by the famous architect Edward Lutyens, who also designed Leicester's iconic war memorial. It too was sadly demolished in the 1950's. Attached to Papillon Hall is the legend of the Cursed Shoes. These shoes were said to belong to the Spanish mistress of a former occupant of the house. Either the curse was issued by this lady upon her lover, or it came about as a result of her untimely death. It is said that the Curse of the Shoes still haunts the site.

It is possible that some readers may actually have visited one or more of these mansions in their younger days. It would be interesting to know if any such memories exist locally.



At certain times of the year I've heard vixens and owls call and other residents have reported seeing muntjac deer. I've also watched a sparrowhawk hunting through the trees and landing on my lawn! And all within the limits of a thriving, modern city. Isn't this amazing? Shouldn't we be proud of this microecosysytem? The charity has up to 100 volunteers and averages up to 50 new clients each month.





Sept Police Update

Officers across the three Neighbourhood Wards of Fosse, Westcotes and New Parks have been very busy over the past month looking to target those carrying knives, drug production, burglaries as well as some of the issues raised to us by the community such as road and cycle safety.

We have devoted officers on patrol at key times and places to specifically focus on those carrying knives. If you know of anyone in your community that is carrying knives then please report that to police via 101 or anonymously to Crimestoppers by calling 0800 555 111.

At the end of August a warrant was conducted at an address in the West End where a large cannabis grow was located and two persons were arrested and charged for the production of cannabis. The issue of cannabis grows presents significant dangers of fire. The money used by the sale of this drug also funds serious and organised crime. Please help us by telling us about suspicious addresses in the area again via 101 or to Crimestoppers.

Officers have been conducting a range of high visibility and plain clothes patrols targeting those committing burglary. As the nights draw in please take the time to review your home security to prevent burglary. Window and door locks, security lights and timers as well asking neighbours to watch over your property are all good ways to protect your home.

Following concerns raised from local residents, your local beat team have been on Glenfield Road to educate some cyclists in relation to the dangers and laws of riding on pavements. The majority of cyclists were recorded to be riding appropriately, 7 given words of advice. We will refer the findings to our partners in Leicester City Council to consider longer term approaches to manage this issue. Again as the nights draw in please take the time to ensure your cycle has all lights fitted and in working order. Reflective clothing is a must.

The investigation into February's Hinckley Road explosion continues. Three men have now been charged with murder. Aram Kurd, 34, Hawkar Hassan, 32 and Arkan Ali, 37, appeared at Leicester Crown Court where they were each charged with five counts of murder.

All three men are also charged with arson with intent to endanger life and manslaughter.

A 33 year old woman from Leicester was arrested on 31 August on suspicion of conspiracy to commit arson and was released under investigation later the same day.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner


With autumn rapidly approaching, your garden maybe starting to look

a little tired. Dead heading and clipping back herbaceous plants can encourage a late season flush, but this rarely compares with their main season flowering. If you're looking for extra colour before autumn becomes winter, then late summer flowering bulbs can give you quite a bang for your buck.

For South African exuberance try growing some Nerines (pictured). They're hardy and come in a wide range of colours from white to purple with shades of fluorescent orange and violent pink in between.

Exotic and often highly scented lily flowers can be a perfect complement to an autumn flowering border.

Recent problems with lily beetle have made them less desirable and with wet weather, like this year, they can become a magnet for slugs. Growing



Crocosmia has no such problem with pests; in fact the insipid orange variety that once filled so many old ladies' gardens is itself a pest in the wild. But there bolder, many worthwhile cultivars. ruby red Lucifer is still my favourite.

There are several species of autumn flowering crocus. C.nudiflorus (pictured) has

large violet blooms and C.specious comes in many varieties. They work well in an alpine or rockery situation but will also be happy in any open well drained site where they won't have to compete with larger plants.

Acis, alliums, cyclamen and Gladiolas, (I particularly like the more compact butterfly varieties) are just a few other species worth considering. So pop down the garden centre and see what bulbs can brighten up your garden this autumn.


