DEMOLITION GIVEN GO-AHEAD

The Open Air School on Western Park had its fate sealed as the City Council's Planning Committee unanimously voted to allow two of the three blocks to be knocked down making way for new office buildings. The remaining structure will be converted into a café to be run by the Western Ward Community Enterprise residents group.

The 92 year old school closed in 2005, and has been the target of vandalism and arson ever since in spite of costly security measures being put in place.

The plans from Parmer Properties, who are behind the scheme, were met with some opposition from local people who say the land should



be reclaimed and kept in public hands. Speaking at the start of the consultation in 2015, City Mayor Sir Peter Soulsby said there was no realistic prospect of the council developing the site themselves, but they were actively seeking an outside organisation with a sustainable plan for the buildings.

SCOUTS ON FUNDRAISING TREK

Six local scouts from the 42nd Glenfield Leicester Scout group are fundraising to pay for a once in a lifetime 12-day trip to Nepal next October.

Whilst each scout must raise £2600, they will also be donating to the charity 'Classrooms in the Clouds' who provide safe educational environments for children of all ages in Nepal. The charity buys school equipment and pays teacher fees.



The Western Park Yard Sale on Park Rise, at the beginning of September, raised £452 to help three local scouts make the trip. The money raised came from the stalls and a donation bucket, one of which is at the nearby Sportsman pub, who are supporting the fundraising.

The scouts will continue their fundraising adventures through the next year, working hard to achieve their targets. Upcoming events include two charity nights at Chef & Spice on 19th September and in Feb/March 2023, a Halloween family party the 29th of October and a Christmas Craft Fayre on 26th November. 

Sept Police Update

Residents in Westcotes have recently reported an increase in drug activity, so in August we targeted hotspot locations, with support from Fosse Beat officers, which resulted in two males being arrested for drug supply offences. Both were put into custody and the investigation is continuina.

On the 29th August the Westcotes Team arrested a man for burglary. Shortly after booking him into custody, we then arrested another male for domestic assault while traveling back to the station! Drugs were also seized. The day before, while on foot patrol in the West End, we arrested a male for several offences including burglary. Right place and right time, or wrong place/time for him!

Two men appeared in Magistrates Court on 25th of August charged with assault. Kian Moore, 21, from New Parks and an 18 year old from South Wigston were charged with Section 18 - wounding with intent. Moore has also been charged with possessing a knife blade/sharp pointed article in a public place.

A warrant on the Western Ward, executed on 24th of August by the beat team and local officers, resulted in the seizure of a quantity of cocaine and cannabis along with weapons which will be destroyed. A positive result with two arrested and court appearance now scheduled.

It was also a busy evening shift on the Fosse as one male was arrested for multiple offences including theft of pedal cycle, going equipped, possession of Class A. Another man was arrested for possession of large amount of Class B drug driving and a car was seized for no license or insurance.

The Fosse Team struck again on August 21st! Two were arrested for immigration offences and a large amount of money has been seized which is believed to have been made as a result of crime. They say it comes in three's: their car was also seized for no insurance and driver for having no license. Investigation is ongoing.

Criminals can't hide forever. Earlier in August, a man was finally arrested by Fosse officers and our Neighbourhood Proactive Team. He was charged with domestic related offences, two commercial burglaries & theft of a motor vehicle.

Once again, we have seen an increase in theft from motor vehicles. Please don't make your vehicle an easy target and remove items from view or out of the vehicle.

Ensure that your vehicle is locked and secure, park under a streetlight or near CCTV or ring doorbell, if possible, and report any suspicious behaviour through 101 or 999 in an emergency, as this may just provide the missing piece of evidence police are looking for.

CAREY'S COMPOST OF CORNER

My tomatoes have been fantastic this year and they're not done yet, so long as I continue to apply a high potash feed and water regularly!

I know that watering was a bit contentious during the recent hot spell, but I use grey water. That's used water from baths and dish washing for instance. So long as it doesn't touch the edible parts of plants or has too harsh chemicals, it's absolutely fine to use in the garden.

It's also not too late to sow some quick growing or hardy/overwintering vegetables. Unfortunately, my beans didn't do as well as the tomatoes this year, so I'm replacing them with some lettuce, radish, winter spinach and carrots. I'll be planting some onion sets alongside the carrots in the hope that it will deter carrot fly as they're not fans of pungent plants.

As ever, I'm continuing to deadhead flowering plants which removes some of the risk of pests and diseases, encourages further flourishes of flowers and makes the garden look tidier and healthier. Whilst doing this, I've also been collecting heads from any flowers that have gone to seed so that I can scatter them into a position that

is preferable for my garden. I've swapped collected seed heads with friends too, such as Knapweed, Cornflowers, Love in a mist, poppies and Honestv.

I've also been pruning back quite a few perennials and shrubs. Wisteria should be pruned back now, unless you have the space to let it ramble, but pruning it now should encourage better flower production next year. This time of year I remove all the whippy green growth to about six leaves, which lets the air circulate, thus preventing disease. This also



promotes flowering bud growth rather than general plant growth. In addition, I've been pruning Weigela, Philadelphus and Deutzia.

As usual, I'm continuing to top up ponds and bird baths as the water can evaporate very quickly during hot spells, as well as putting food out for the hedgehogs. I've also been enjoying the sight of a lot of pipistrelle bat activity during dusk as they swoop across the garden munching their way through all those flying garden pests!
