HANDEL ON LEICESTER

Leicester is justly famous for its variety of festivals, not least its music festivals. Every year the sound of music echoes across city and county from Foxton Locks through to Strawberry Fields, Simon Says and Download, to name just a few. Amongst the least well known events is our Early Music Festival which holds a number of local concerts throughout the year, often featuring music by the world famous George Frederick Handel. Handel was born in the German town of Halle in 1685 and as a young man became attached to the court of Hanover on the huge salary of 1000 Thaler silver coins. (JS Bach only received 150 per year). This was not long before its Elector George came to the throne of England as King George the First. Handel followed him but was not to become a naturalized British citizen until 1727.

Unlike many of his contemporaries, Handel had a gift for making money, marketing and travel. As the favourite composer of his day Handel came to know Leicestershire well, not least through his friendship with Charles Jenner. It was the latter who built the famous Gopsall Hall (since demolished) near Market Bosworth. The Hall was designed by Leicester architect John Westley. The composer stayed at Gopsall many times and the music to one of his most famous pieces "Rejoice

the Lord is King" is actually entitled Gopsal.

Handel's most famous and popular work was undoubtedly The Messiah which may also have been partly written at Gopsall Hall. The first ever performance of The Messiah in a parish church Church Langton in the south of the county. It was at Church Langton, too, that the fabotanist mous and



parson the Reverend William Hanbury planned to build a new Minster and University of Music. He did indeed work out the details of his proposed new buildings but died before they could be put into effect.

At Christmas the Early Music Festival holds a special candlelit Carol Service at St. Mary de Castro Church featuring, naturally, extracts from The Messiah.

Handel died in 1759 possibly following complications from a botched cataract operation the year before.

Eastern Europe is a mysterious place. Not many people from here have been there, but people from there come here. Putting the currently horrendous refugee issue funnelling through parts the old Iron Curtain aside; if you believe some of the newspapers, Eastern Europeans come to get benefits, get a free house and to send money home to their children. My friends from Eastern Europe all have jobs, businesses, families and huge hearts. As a result of this I got invited to visit Hungary in August and it was time for an

adventure. The place we were visiting is Lake Balaton. It's about an hour and a half from Budapest in the middle of the country and it's a very big lake surrounded by hills. There was very little information online about what there is to do there. A bit scary!

I needn't have worried. Hungary is brilliant. What is not to love about a

country that has a national cake competition EVE-

and Mary Berry but when faced with Hungarian cake we are but children dabbling in the flour. Our Eccles cakes, Bakewell tarts and Victoria sponges look like nursery food in comparison to the epic layers of mousse and sponge and caramel you find in Szamos Marcipan. Once a year the bakers of Hungary submit their ideas and a favourite is chose for St Stephen's Day in August, the celebration of the founding of the nation. This year it's a caramel cake with apricot palinka (rocket fuel). Think sponge, caramelised hazelnuts and syrup, apricot mousse, hazelnut chocolate mousse and more... It tastes bloody brilliant and available in most cake shops around the country.

Lake Balaton was vast and an amazing turquoise colour. The water was soft and made your skin feel amazing, the bottom was sandy and it was fun splashing around. There are fantastic churches, beautiful towns, hot springs and spas, special Hungarian fish and chips, adventure parks and more. It seemed like everyone we met was on holiday and in a fabulously good mood. We went to the fireworks on Hungarian National Day and ate Chimney Cake (seriously good and a massive queue to wait for it), ate deep fried potato spirals and I drank palinka. It was a proper adventure with new things to see and try at every turn. I'd go back in a heartbeat. You'll find me in the coffee shop eating cake. Helen Knott

Sir Charles James Napier, the general who commanded the British Army in India, is said

to have sent a telegram to Queen Victoria saying "I have Sindh" when he retook the Sindh province from rebels 1844. He probably needed a pint after all that. Unfortunatelv. he would have to wait for over years for the Sir Charles Napier on Glenfield Road to be built so he could sit



in a Leicester pub with his name on it.

As a local boozer, the Napier has had its ups and downs over the years, but now there's an enthusiastic new landlord manning the pumps.

Leicester lad Allen Roehrig and son Sam took over the Napier at the beginning of August and are busily building the business back up.

Allen's background is sales and marketing in the UK and America but he's no stranger to the licencing trade having successfully run the Abbey pub for two years; and it's this combination of skills he's bringing to the Napier. He said: "It's like having three pubs in one - a bar, snug and a lounge but we're going to keep their unique character and expand the entertainment and food.


for being found on enclosed premises and the third was charged with squatting and remanded to prison as he was also wanted on warrant for assaulting an officer earlier in the year.

CHURCH OF THE MARTYRS AT 125


This year the Church of the Martyrs on Westcotes Drive celebrates its 125th anniversary this year with a special weekend of activities.



Sept Police Update

SHARK WATCH with Sgt. Kev Sharkey August has been a busy month so here are some of the highlights:

Officers have seized 89 motorbikes since February of which 75 were stolen. Please use ground anchors and alarms to stop them being stolen and then ridden around the community especially on the Western Park. Operation Groundhopper continues to tackle this problem.

Extra late night patrols have been conducted to tackle the problem of thefts from motor vehicles and we have seen a drop in reports of this type of crime as a result. Please lock your vehicle when leaving it and do not leave anything on display as we have had cars broken into just to steal sweets and small change. Fitting an alarm is an effective way to reduce your chances of being a victim and will also help to lower your insurance premium.

Since the 15th of August, we have been conducting early morning foot patrols on the Merry Monarch carpark to disrupt persons reported as being anti-social with drinking, noise and public urination. We have seized alcohol, breath tested drivers and taken names and addresses of people involved which have been different on each occasion. Offenders have also been made to clear up cans and bottles left in the area. The ongoing litter problem has been highlighted to our colleagues in the city wardens who are looking to take legal action against the owners of this carpark, which is private land, to ensure it is cleaned up. A multi-agency meeting is scheduled for early September to ensure positive action continues.

We are now also going to join forces with the Westcotes beat team who have a similar issue nearby to try and establish a long term solution to the problem, including the places the alcohol is being bought from in the early morning hours.

On the 11th August on Bonchurch Street there was an incident of disorder where knives, a golf club, hammers and a rifle were seen to be brandished. Armed officers attended and two men were initially detained and arrested on suspicion of threatening behaviour with a firearm and affray. An air rifle and several weapons were found and seized. Another male was later arrested and all are currently on police bail while our enquiries continue. We expect further arrests to follow.

On Narborough road we have been tackling the problem of persistent begging. The law requires us to take an incremental approach of a series of verbal and written warnings and we also offer support to those genuinely in need to try and remove the root causes before prosecuting at Court. We have identified the two main offenders who have refused all offers of support and they are now proceeding along the incremental approach towards appearing at Court.

Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

I recently had a phone call from a friend asking if I liked plums? I've never been a fan of the fruit raw but love them in a pie or jam. My wife though, will happily chomp through a bowlful. My friend implored me to visit her garden and help myself. The crop was so big, she had left notices outside her property inviting passers-by to

pick what they wanted.

Plums are one of nature's most prolific summer bounties. I frequently have to prune trees that have collapsed through sheer weight of fruit. They can also be invasive if not limits suckering. If it wasn't for regular mowing my friend's garden would be an acre sized thicket able to

supply enough fruit for half the county.

One or two plum trees will provide plenty of fruit for the average family. They grow equally well free -standing or as an espalier wired into a fan shape.

Growing against a wall provides extra shelter, giving an earlier crop. And it's not just plums, apples and pears can also thrive. This method also protects the early blossom from damaging heavy frosts. New plum trees are best planted in mid-winter. I've never known anyone to have trouble getting their trees to fruit but, if you



want to be certain, there are many self-fertile cultivars, including the old favourite "Victoria". With the right selection of varieties you can have plums from mid-summer to mid-autumn.

As with all stoned fruit trees, plums should be pruned in the summer, a task that needs completing now! Remove large branches even earlier in the season to allow the wounds to heal. Pruning in winter leaves your tree susceptible to a disease called silver leaf. It's also a good idea to prop up weak limbs and to thin out clusters of fruit so that over-laden branches don't break.

So, in the immortal words of Bob Marley, this weekend I'll be "Jammin".
